Archive Import History: Besides St. John's Church there is a second church with important historical associations in Bathurst. This one, too, has strong links with the history of the 1820 Settlers. This church was built in 1832 by Settlers who belonged to the Methodist Church, and was inaugurated by the Rev. J. W. Shrewsbury. The roof was originally thatched, but this has been replaced and in the course of time other improvements were carried out. Like St. John's Church, it also was converted into a fort during the War of the Axe in 1846 and provided a safe refuge for many of the inhabitants of the district, including the Rev.
