Archive Import History: The building was erected by the builders Kelly and Anderson of Johannesburg. The cornerstone was laid on 2 August 1907 by Sir Hamilton Goold-Adams, Lieutenant-Governor of the Orange River Colony. The building was officially inaugurated on 7 September 1908. Visual Description: Double storey red brick building with centrally placed tower and decorative sandstone detail, including sandstone portico on front facade. Timber doors and windows. Market hall at rear of building with corrugated iron roof and verandah.
