Situated on a tributary of the kwaManzamyama River, close to Spioenkop near Nottingham Road. 20 metres of surrounding land, situated on the Remainder of the farm FP.37 No.7649 in the District of Mpendle, Province of Natal.

Archive Import: Collingham Shelter's deep and well preserved deposit has afforded archaeologists a very rare opportunity to study an exceptionally detailed and representative depiction of life on the Natal protea savanna over a short period during the income History: Contains an approx 50cm deep deposit, 80-90% of which accumulated in a 150 year period around 1800 years ago. Subsequent occupations resulted in thin deposits dating to around 100 and 700 years before present. The final occupation may have income. Visual Description: North-facing. In the Clarens Formation at an altitude of 1800m. The ceiling has collapsed, was removed to allow access to the deposit. Pieces of painted rock occurred in the deposit. The excavator identified 19 difference stratigraphic units.
