### **1 OPENING AND WELCOME**

Mr Danie Johnsten opened the meeting and welcomed all landowners of the Mopane / Vera area. He explained that CoAL will still have public meetings but that this meeting is held specifically to understand and address the landowners concerns, where possible.

Mr Danie Johnsten further said he noticed people from the media, and he would like to request that information is not blown-up out of proportion at this stage and result in unnecessary excitement. He further emphasized to CoAL that it is important for people to understand the process.

### 4.1 Who is MbeuYashu



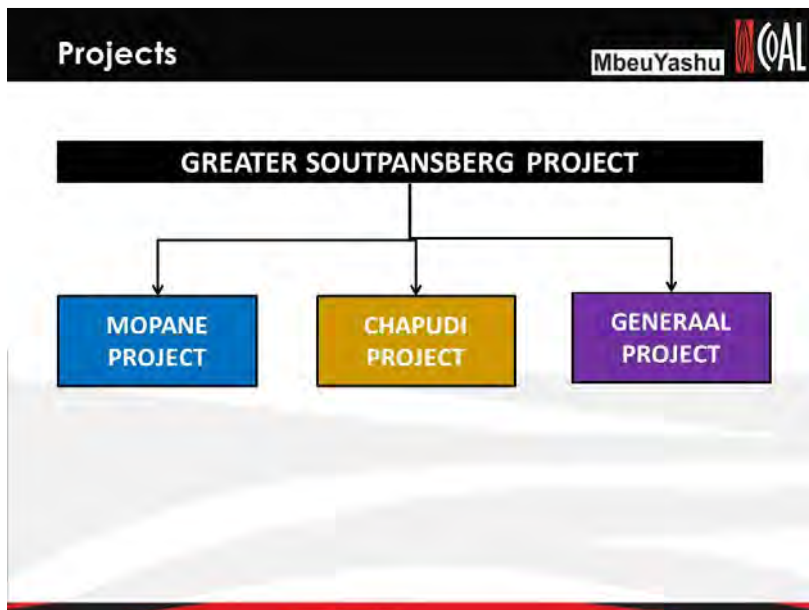

- **HEI (from China) recently acquired 23.60 per cent of the Company's issued share capital**
- **The directors of CoAL is public knowledge and is available on the website**
- **HEI now has the right to appoint director(s) to the board**

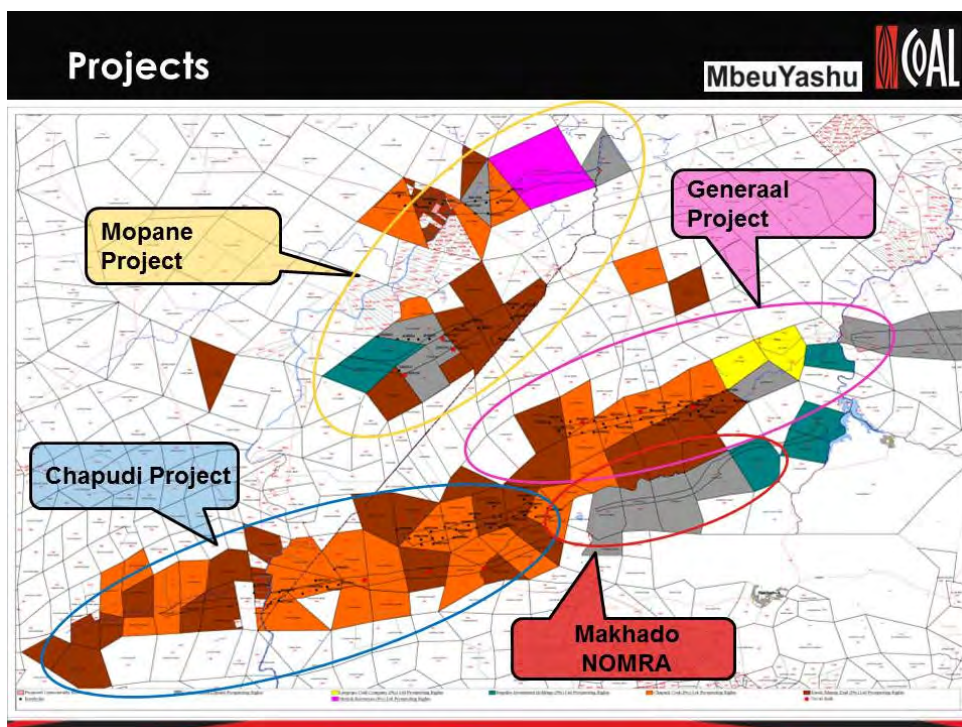
Riaan van der Merwe explained that in April 2012 CoAL completed the acquisition of exploration properties in the Soutpansberg Coalfield from Rio Tinto Minerals Development, as part of the acquisition a broad-based empowerment transaction was concluded with Rothe Investments to acquire a 26% interest in the assets. The combined entity, with CoAL's 74% interest, has been renamed MbeuYashu, which means 'Our Seed'.

Riaan further explained that it has been announced in the media that HEI, from China has purchased 23.6% share in CoAL's issued share capital. This is not a controlling share. HEI is also a listed company in the international coal industry and therefore are interested in the coking coal product for their existing markets. Because they are a listed company, they are also subject to international and public review to ensure their conduct is in line with ethical codes of practice. The Greater Soutpansberg Project and other CoAL projects are located within South Africa and must therefore comply with South African Legislation, which requires local employment, preferential procurement, etc. HEI will appoint a member on the Board, and will provide technical inputs. We have also visited their mines in China and they have a very good safety and environmental standards.

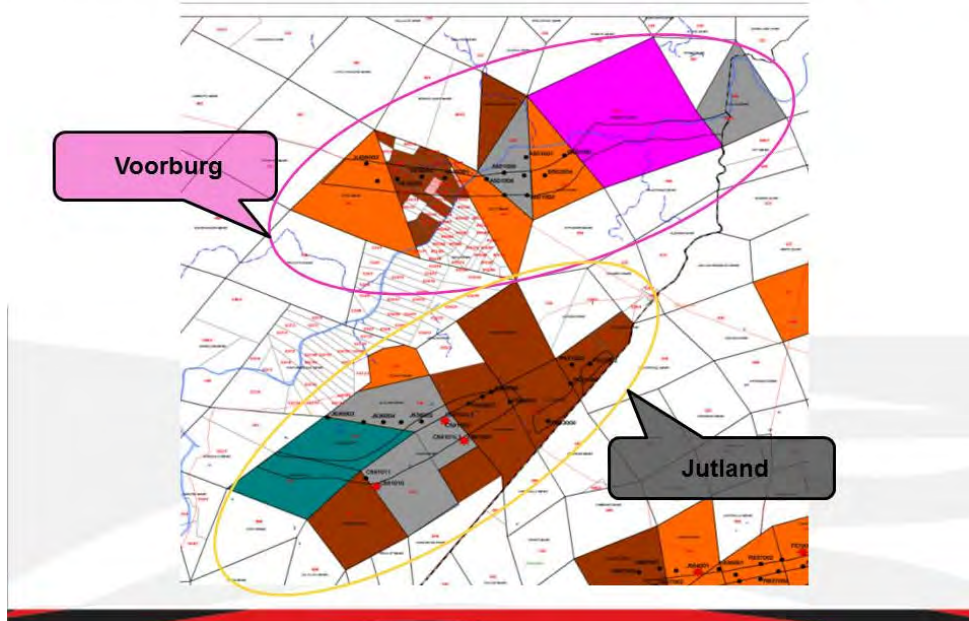

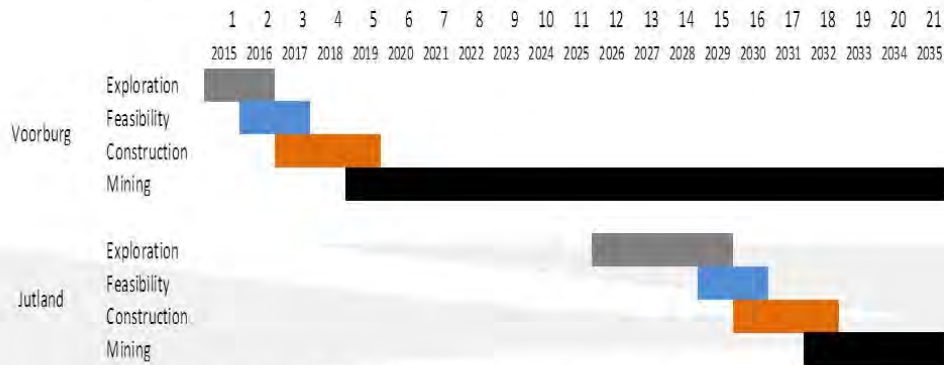

*With the knowledge we have gained through this exploration phase it would seem that our priority mining areas would be as follows:*

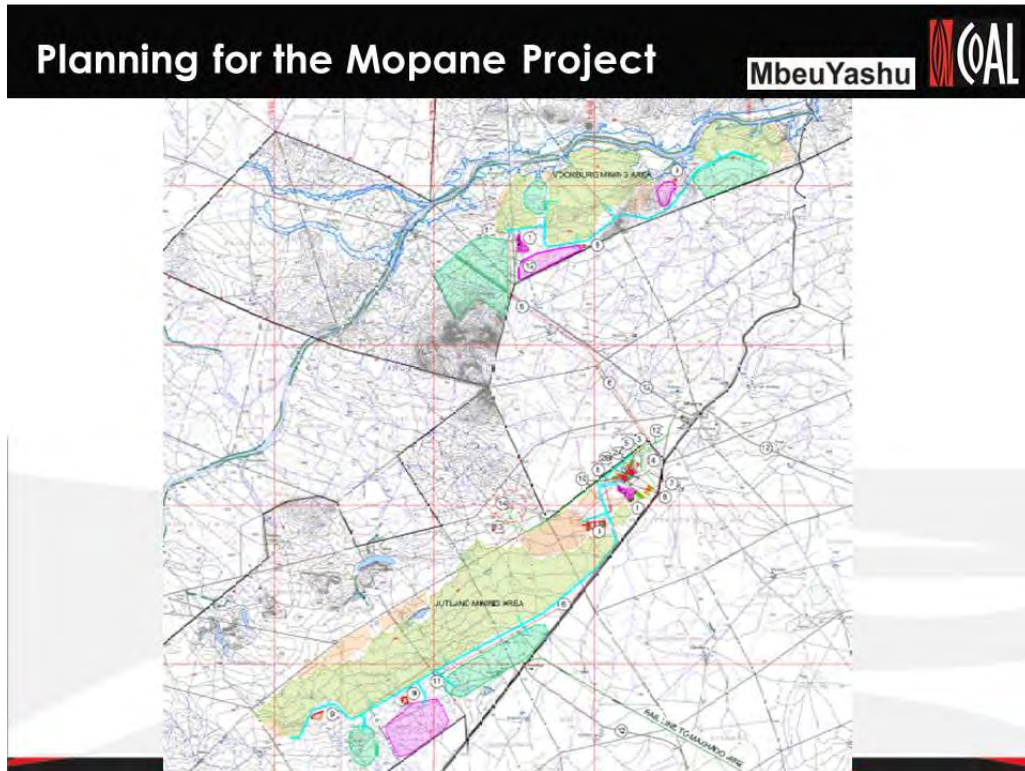


*It is possible that further exploration as well as feasibility studies could bring about a change to this.*

Information currently available to us, indicate the above estimated schedule. However as more information becomes available this schedule may change.

The schedule indicates that after we have completed the MPRDA Mining Right process, we will embark onto an Exploration phase, thereafter the information gathered will be used to conduct a feasibility study, and then

only will construction and mining commence. Therefore the earliest mining will start is 2019. During this period consideration will be given to further technical information, environmental and social impacts of the planned activities.

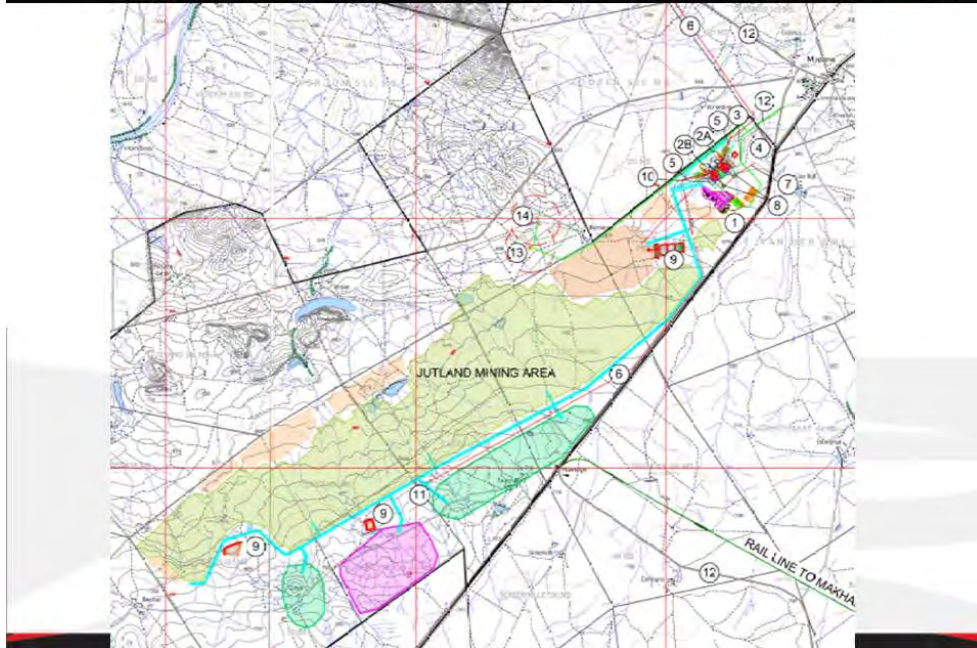


The Voorburg Section's coal quality is better and will be prioritized.

Further consideration must also be given to the placement of infrastructure so that it is suitable from a mine design point of view but also take the environmental and social sensitivities into consideration.

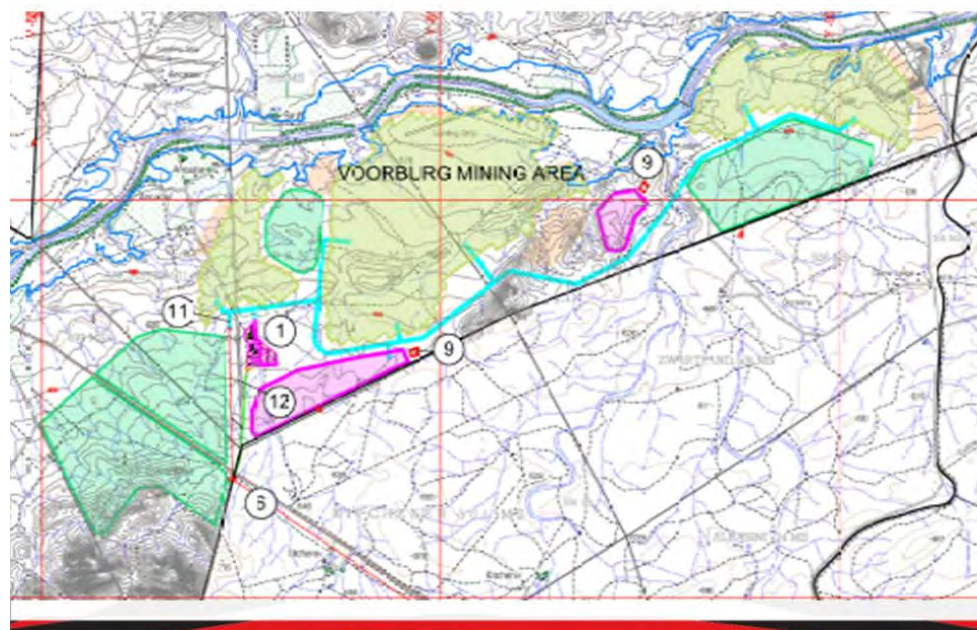

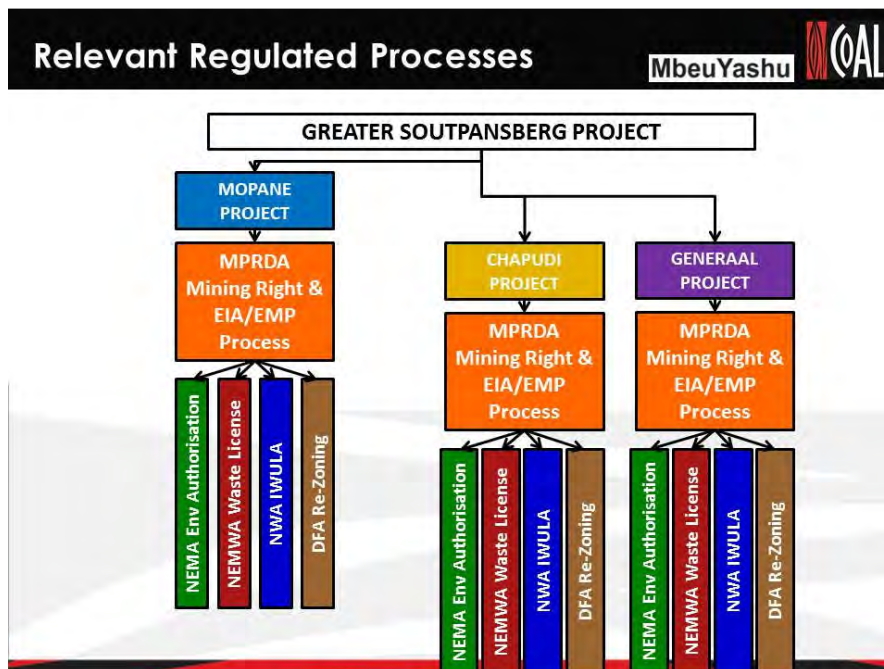

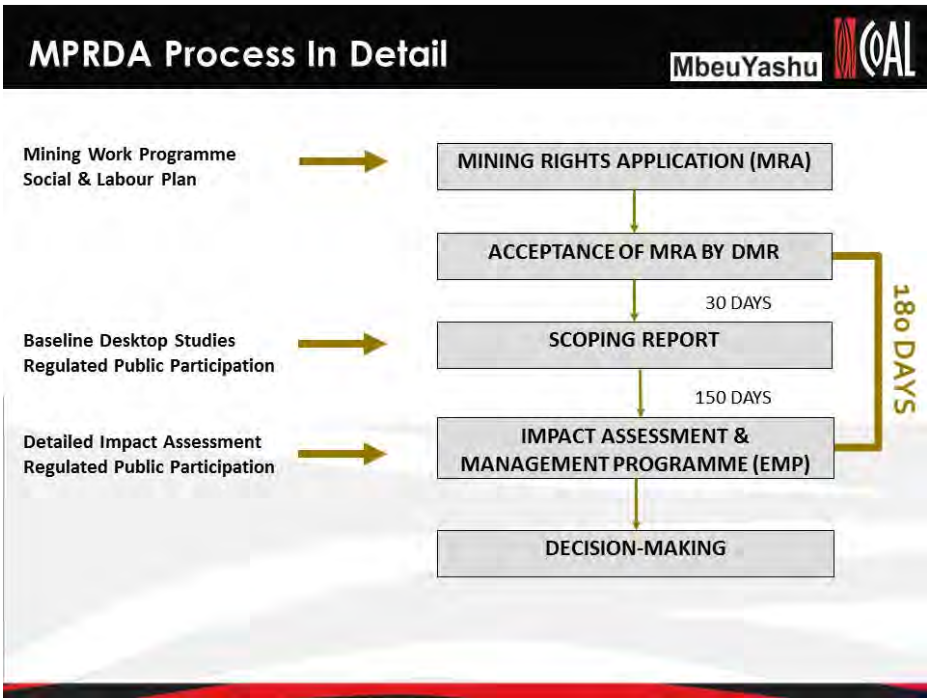
## 5 RELEVANT REGULATED PROCESSES



The Mine Right Applications are submitted firstly to provide CoAL with security of tenure while complying with the various other legislative measures, doing further exploration work and conducting the feasibility study.

People believe that once the Mining Right has been submitted you can start to mine, which is not true. It is a complicated process where application must also be made for a number of other licenses such as the water use license. We also need to compile the feasibility study which is used to raise funds for the construction of the project.

There is a whole list of legislation that MbeuYashu must comply with, the main piece of legislation in the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act.



The MPRDA Process is illustrated in the figure above. The process is triggered with the DMR's Acceptance of the Mining Right Applications, which means that administratively spoken the DMR is satisfied that the application contains the required documentation. From DMR's acceptance and Environmental Impact Assessment must be conducted and a report submitted within 180 days to DMR.

DMR may after the 180 days request the applicant to conduct further work to enable them to make an informed decision.

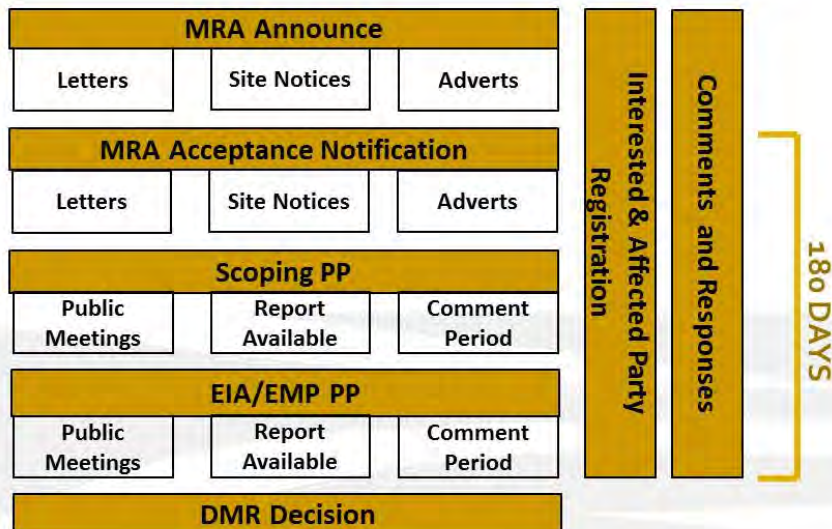

### 3 DOEL VAN DIE VERGADERING

'n Brief is ingedien aan CoAL en 'n antwoord ontvang, die doel van die vergadering is om die punte in die brief verder te bespreek asook enige ander aspekte wat die grondeienaars bekommer.

### 4 BESPREKING

#### 4.1 Nuwe Topbestuur van Coal of Africa Limited

Riaan van der Merwe het vir die Vereniging 'n oorsig van die nuwe Topbestuur gegee:

- David Brown – Raad Voorsitter en tans ook die waarnemende Uitvoerende hoof
- Cobus Bronn – Bedryfshoof. Cobus was ook by ons vorige vergadering, waar ek hom aan u voorgestel het.
- Riaan van der Merwe het as gevolg van familie verantwoordelikhede CoAL gevra om slegs deelyds (3 dae per week) betrokke te wees en is nou aangestel as die Minerale Hulpbronne bestuurder. Hy gaan dus steeds betrokke wees by die projek, en sal so ver moontlik konsultasie sessies sal bywoon.
- Peter Marx is steeds die Projekbestuurder vir die Groter Soutpansberg Projek.

Riaan het verder agtergrond gegee oor CoAL se herstrukturering om finansiële uitleg in te kort. Die ekonomie van kommoditeite is huidiglik onder druk, daar is 'n internasionale oorvloed van steenkool wat 'n impak het op vraag en aanbod. Die steenkool bedryf is siklies en die maatskappy verwag dat daar weer 'n ophelling sal plaas vind. Die huidige situasie het egter geen impak op verpligtinge wat deur die maatskappy gemaak is op byvoorbeeld Vele, Makhado and GSP, CoAL sal steeds hierdie verpligtinge eer.

In terme van CoAL se mynbedrywighede beplan die maatskappy om die Mpumalanga myne te sluit en op sorg en onderhoud te plaas, by die Vele myn gaan die aanleg verander word om ander produkte te kan hanteer, en die Makhado myn is in die finale goedkeuring stadium waarna befondsing verkry moet word gevolg deur konstruksie tans beplan vir mid 2014.

CoAL verstaan die Groter Soutpansberg Projek uit die oofpunt van 'n streeksontwikkelings plan. Die Mynreg aansoeke is geloots om CoAL se minerale regte te beskerm en om dan in parallel hiermee, verdere werk te doen op streeks kwellings soos water, die Vhembe Biosfeer, infrastruktuur, ens. As CoAL nie die Mynregte ingedien het nie, was die areas oop vir enigiemand om aansoeke te loots, en hierdie maatskappy mag dalk nie dieselfde ondervinding en oogpunt op die streeksontwikkeling het as wat CoAL het nie.

#### Vrae en Antwoorde

- Willem Opperman: Is dit moontlik dat CoAL 'n organigram van die topbestuur aan die vereniging kan voorsien?
  - Riaan: Die organigram word in die volgende paar weke gefinaliseer, en ek sal dan in 'n posisie wees om dit te stuur.

- Arno Jacobs: Het die persone wat vergaderings bywoon die magte / mandate om besluite names CoAL te neem? Om mense gerus te stel, moet ondernemings/verpligtinge die bestuursvlak se gesag dra. Ons beseft dat CoAL moet nou deur die konsultasie proses gaan, maar daar moet 'n tyd kom waar ooreenkomste bereik word.
  - Riaan: Ons het sekere mandate, as ons dit oorskry sal ons dit terugneem na CoAL bestuur, maar die maatskappy het 'n redelike plat struktuur wat die omdraai tyd vinniger maak. As daar wel ooreenkomste gesluit word doen ons dit op 'n basis van detail konsultasie, Memorandum van Verstandhouding wat partye teken.
  
- Arno Jacobs: Wat is die kanale van kommunikasie?
  - Riaan: Ons verkies dat buite vergaderings aspekte op skrif deur Lizinda Dickson gerig moet word. Ek het egter nie 'n probleem om 'n telefoniese gesprek te voer as daar 'n behoefte daarvoor is nie.
  
- Danie Johnsen: Wat is die status van Carien Joubert se beskikbaarheid op die projek en in die area. Ons het in die verlede gereeld met haar kom kommunikeer om inligting te verkry en opgedateer te word oor die prosesse.
  - Riaan: Carien is steeds betrokke by die projek, maar ons moes ongelukkig in die proses haar tyd in die area afskaal. Sy is egter nog beskikbaar om meet e kommunikeer, maar sal minder besoeke kan aflewer.
  
- Danie Johnsen: Wat is die implementerings plan van die Makhado myn?
  - Riaan: Ons voorsien dat die goedkeurings teen vroeg volgende jaar ontvang sal word van die Regerings departemente, konstruksie sal heel moontlik in mid 2014 begin vir 24 maande en daarna sal ons in produksie gaan.
  
- Willem Opperman: Ons aanvaar al die vorige besluite geneem deur die top bestuur nog van krag is.
  - Riaan: CoAL bly dieselfde maatskappy, die nuwe top bestuur het respek vir die besluite wat reeds geneem is. Ons moet huidiglik net realisties wees oor toekomstige ondernemings se finansiële implikasies

#### **4.2 Aanstelling van 'n Regsadviseur**

Danie Johnsen beklemtoon dat CoAL na die area toe gekom het met julle planne, dit was nie op uitnodiging nie. Ons is bereid om saam te werk, maar CoAL moet beseft dat ons nie finansiële voorsiening gemaak het vir die aktiewe deelname in julle prosesse nie. Ons is ook deur 'n droogte en hael en ons reserwes is ook redelik uitgeput. Die meerderheid van ons lede kan nie finansiële bydraes lewer nie. Ons wil graag aktief deelneem in die proses en goeie begrip het van die proses, inligting en ons regte. As 'n vereniging het ons geïdentifiseer dat ons nie noodwendig die kennis dra om funksionele insette te kan lewer nie en het daarom 'n regsadviseur

genader om ons te help. Ons het ook met die Waterpoort Myn Komitee saamgewerk om een persoon te kry. Ons versoek dat CoAL help met die finansiële vergoeding van die regsadviseur.

Peter Marx het verduidelik dat die Vereniging moet verstaan dat geen myn maatskappy sal betaal vir 'n prokureur om hulle aansoeke te opeer nie, en dus kon ek slegs toestemming kry om vir 1 dag van julle regsadviseur se kostes te betaal.

Danie Johnsten verduidelik dat die Vereniging van die begin af werk in terme van 'n vertrouens verhouding / situasie. Die doel van die regsadviseur is nie om die aansoeke te opeer nie, of om 'n regsgeeding aan die gang te sit nie. As CoAL slegs bereid is om een dag te betaal is dit vir ons 'n groot bekommernis.

Bertus Otto: Ek vermoed dat CoAL dit nie behoorlik kon oorweeg nie want ons is te wyd met wat ons wil bereik deur die regsadviseur. Kano ns nie vir Arno vra om 'n beskrywing van die omvang van die werk en 'n begroting voor te berei en in te dien by CoAL nie. Ons moet egter 'n beperking daarop sit.

- Arno Jacobs: Ek verstaan CoAL se vrese vir die potensiaal van moontlike litigasie. Die doel is dat as daar onsekerhede is by the Vereniging dan kan ek help om dinge uit te sorteer en die saak te besweer. Ek sal nie kan litigeer want dit sal 'n botsing van belange wees.
  - Riaan: Die Vereniging moet verstaan dat CoAL slegte ondervindinge gehad het met die sort van ding. U het gehoor dat selfs Johan Tempelhof ons gekomplimenteer het op die vlak van konsultasie, want ander maatskappye doen dit nie so nie. Maar ons deursigtigheid en behulpsaamheid kan ook teen ons draai as dit gebruik word om CoAL by te kom. Daars partye daar buite wat nie dieselfde bedoelinge het nie.
- Riaan: As ons duidelikheid kan ontvang, waar die werk afgebaken word met 'n koste beraming, dan kan ek dit met Cobus Bronn bespreek
- Danie Johnsen: CoAL moet dit asb oorweeg as 'n ernstige versoek. Dit sal teleurstellend wees as julle in ons integriteit twyfel. Ons probeer die saak kalm hanteer en nie soos sekere radikale persone nie. Ons mag dalk in die toekoms verskil maar geen huwelik is volmaak nie.
- Willem Opperman: Kan daar nie 'n Samewerkingsooreenkoms opgetrek word tussen CoAL, die Mopane-Sandrivier Grondeienaars Vereniging en die Waterpoort Myn Komitee nie.
- Bertus Otto: Ons het wewillendheid van ons lede binne sekere billike voorwaardes, as ons drasties afwyk gaan ons moeilikheid kry.
- Arno Jacobs: Die omvang van die werk en koste beraming sal binne 1 week aan Riaan gestuur word

#### **4.3 Waardasies**

Peter Marx rapporteer da tons kwotasies gekry het by twee waardeerders, een wat die Vereniging gekies het en een wat CoAL van te vore gebruik het. Beide kwotasies is redelik hoog, veral as 'n mens na al die plase in die myn reg aansoek kyk, sowel as 'n 5km radius. Ons wil voorstel da tons na alternatiewe opsies kyk. Opsies

soos om in detail na sekere plase te kyk wat deur die Voorburg seksie geaffekteer te kyk en dan na die ander plase oorhoofs binne sekere waardasie beginsels.

- Danie Johnson: Ons verkies die waardeerder in Polokwane?
  - Peter Marx: Kom ons besluit eers presies wat gedoen gaan word voor ons 'n waardeerder kies
- Rudolf: Die volgende aspekte moet na gekyk word voor 'n waardasie om grond te koop gefinaliseer kan word:
  - Markwaarde in terme van spesifieke bedrywe
  - Kapitaalwinst belasting as grond gekoop word
  - Hervestigings Koste
  - Produksie / Besigheids waarde
  - Vaste verbeterings
  - Potensiaal van die grond
  - Neem in ag voedsel sekerheid en die feit dat dit 'n winterproduksie zone is
- Willem Opperman: Het CoAL 'n beleid met die uitkoop van gronde, wat as die persoon reeds afgetree is. Miskien as ons so 'n beleid kan kry sal dit mense rustiger maak.
- Bertus Otto: Sienende dat julle nie seker is wat gaan gebeur nie, miskien moet die waardeerder net na "hotspots" kyk, want grondwaardes verander, op wildsplase kan dit tot met 10% per jaar groei. Daar kan hoewel nie net na markwaarde gekyk word nie, dis belangrik om na besigheids waarde te kyk.
- Arno Jacobs: Het CoAL so 'n beleid? Indien wel kan u dit aan die Vereniging beskikbaar stel
  - Riaan: CoAL het ondervindinge van vorige onderhandelings en kooptransaksies, maar nie 'n formele beleid nie. Die beleid is gebaseer op die maatskappy se geskiedenis en sal formeel opgeskryf moet word. Sal probeer om iets bymekaar te he in so 2 – 3 weke
- Riaan: Ons wil voorstel dat ons die waardasie vlak van detail inskerp soos die projek beplanning vorder, en die meer detail werk nader aan die tyd van implementering van die moontlike myne doen.
- Danie Johnson: Gee vir ons 'n mandaat om met die waardeerders te praat en met voorstelle terug te kom wat verskillende opsies oorweeg.
- Willem Opperman: Een opsie is om slegs riglyne van waardasie te kry en dat elke grondeienaar sy eie somme doen, of alternatiewelik die wat deur die Voorburg infrastruktuur en myn gebied geraak word waardeer vir markwaarde en verbeterings.
- Arno Jacobs:
- Peter Marx: Gee mandaat aan die Vereniging om same sprekinge met die waardeerders te hou en met 'n voorstel terug te kom na CoAL.

#### 4.4 Spesialis Studies

Marietjie Eksteen rapporteer dat behalwe vir die studies op Voorburg, is al die areas wat hulle wou besoek in Mopane besoek.

Die spesialiste sal nou met hul impak modelering begin.

Lizinda Dickson verduidelik dat wanneer die spesialis studies se resultate beskikbaar is, sal CoAL 'n werkwinkel met die Vereniging hou om die inligting met hulle te deel voor die Ope dag vir die weier publiek gehou word.

Die werkwinkel is geskeduleer vir 10 Oktober 2013 en die Ope Dag vir 19 Oktober 2013. Die vergaderplek sal nog bepaal word. Voorstelle van die Vereniging is of die Mopane Boeresaal of die Mopane Skool se saal.

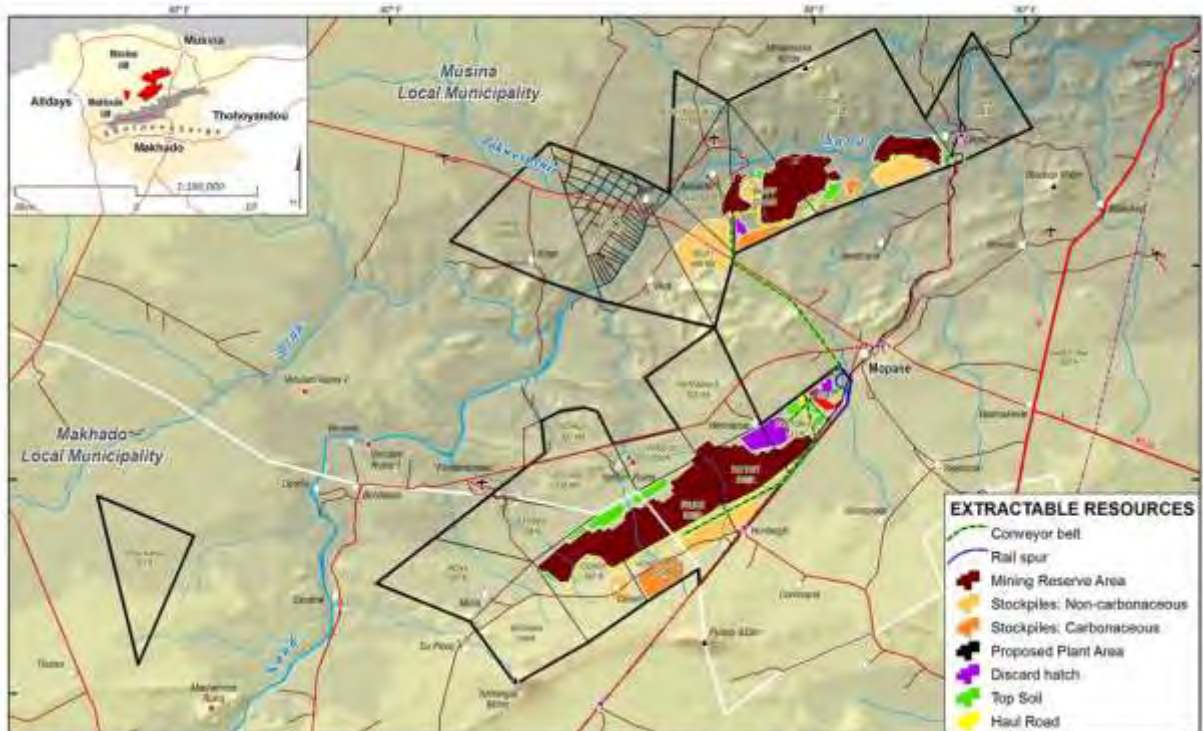
### **2 PURPOSE OF THE MEETING**

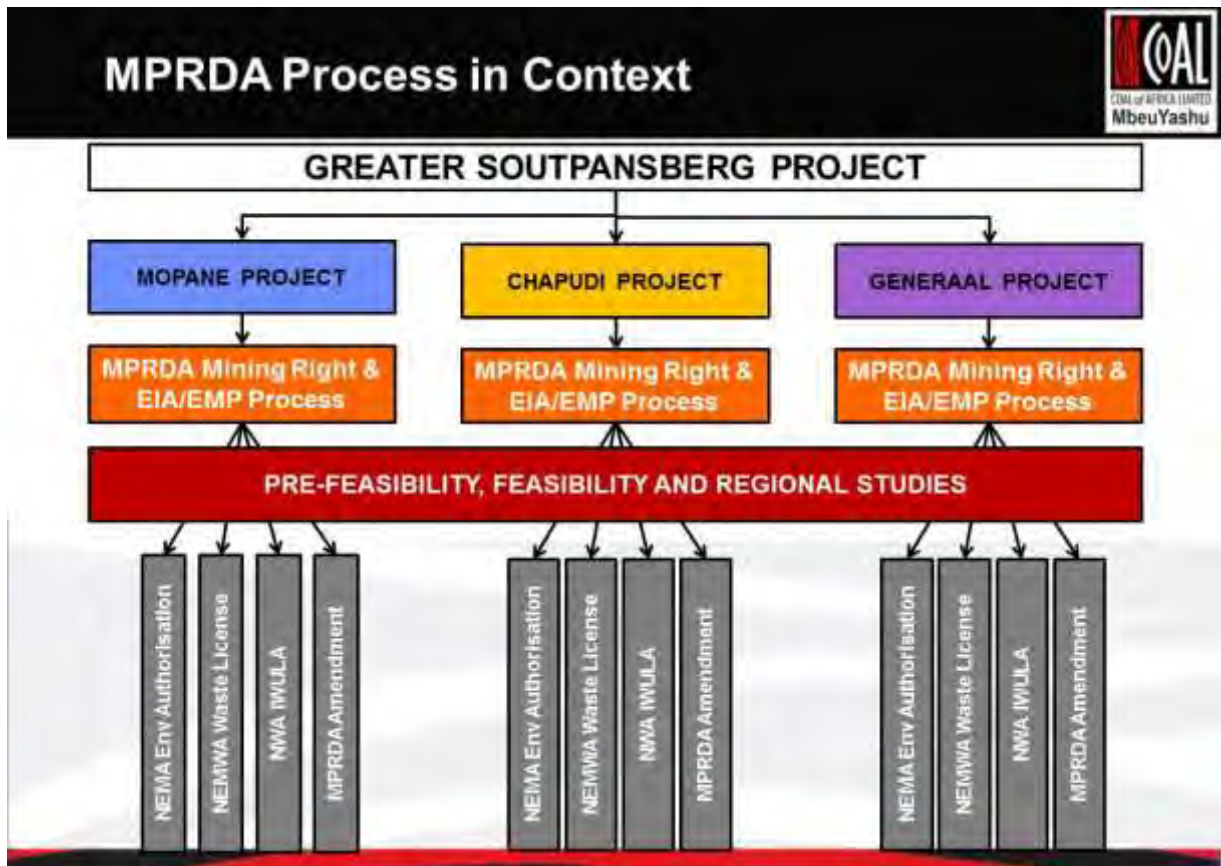

- Re-alignment of the RoM conveyor from the Voorburg Section to the Infrastructure Hub, aligning it along the main Vera access road and then along the Musina-Makhado railway line, rather than cutting through undisturbed areas on the farm Goosen 580 MS.
- These options will be evaluated during the Pre-Feasibility studies

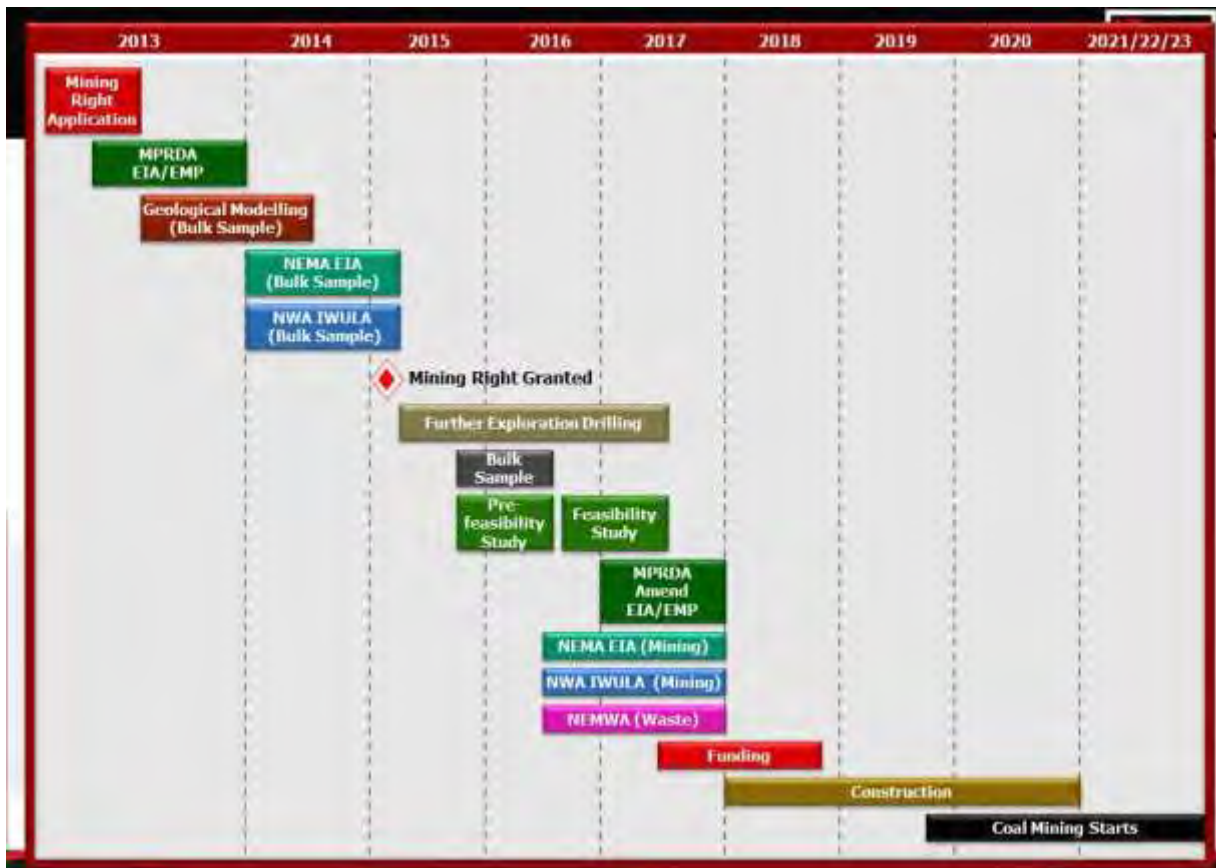

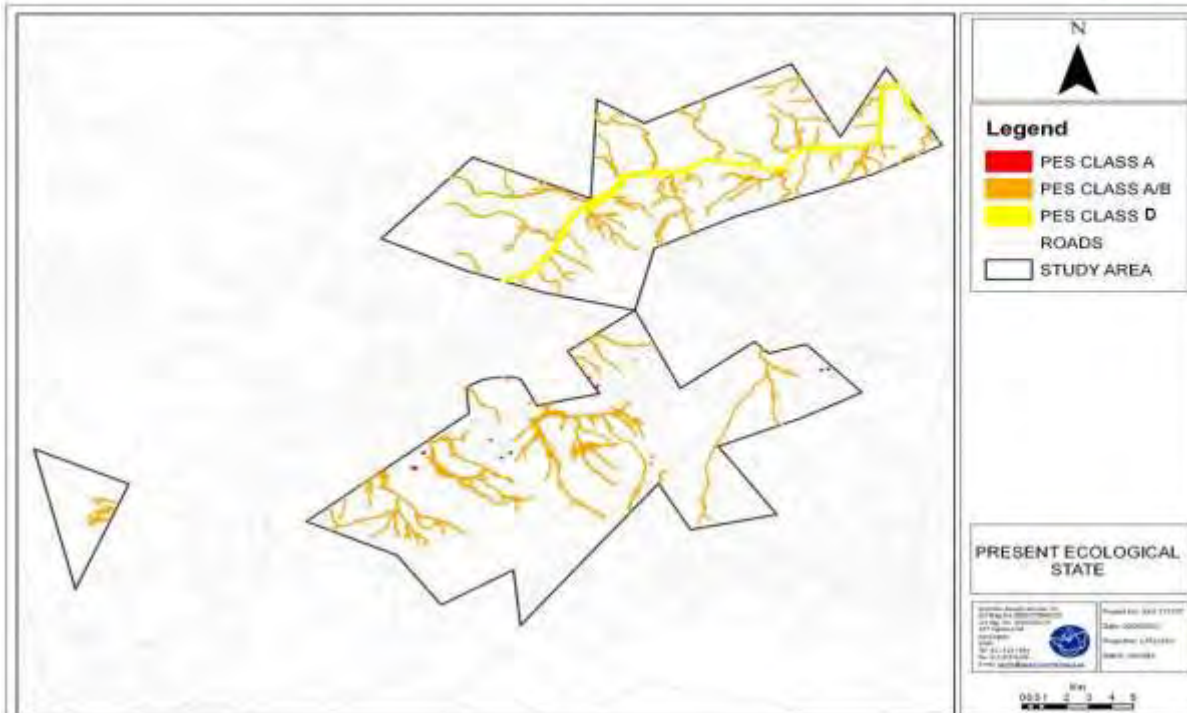
# Surface Water Catchment



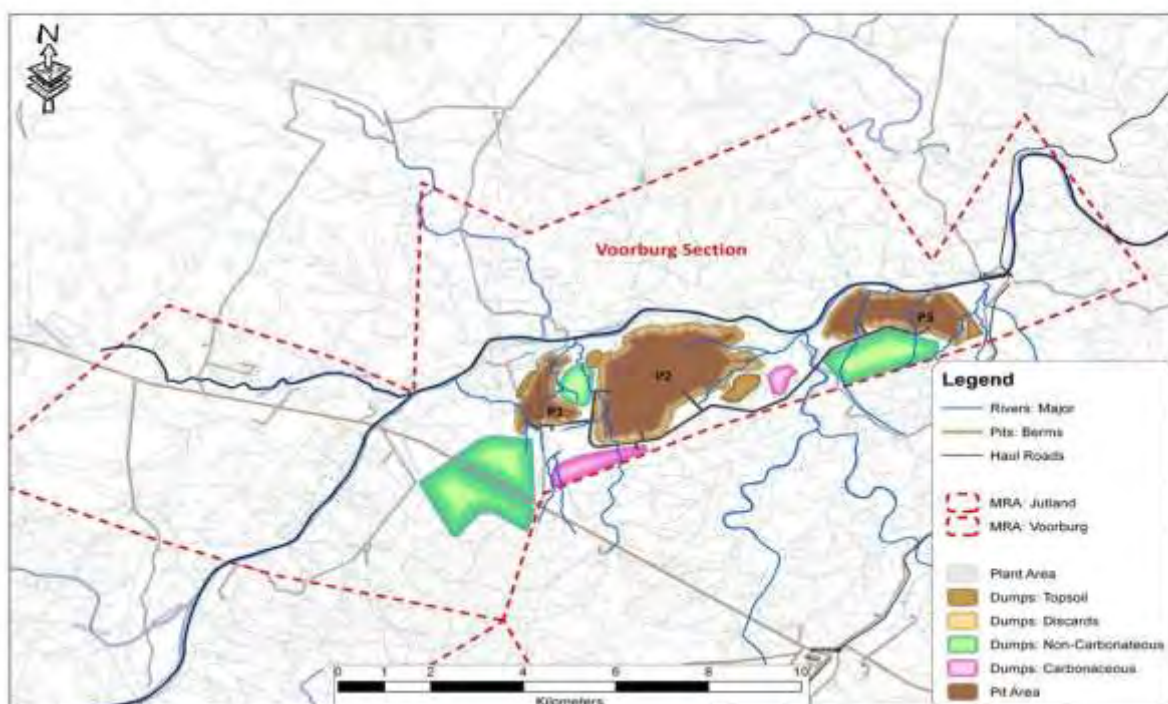

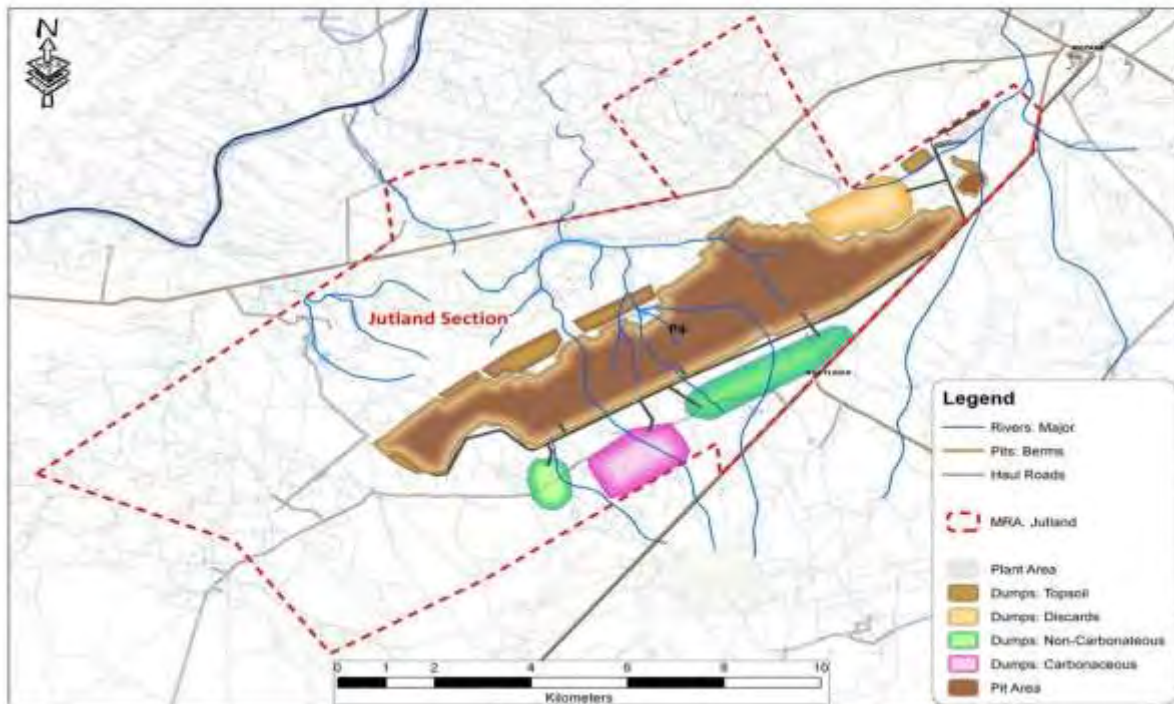

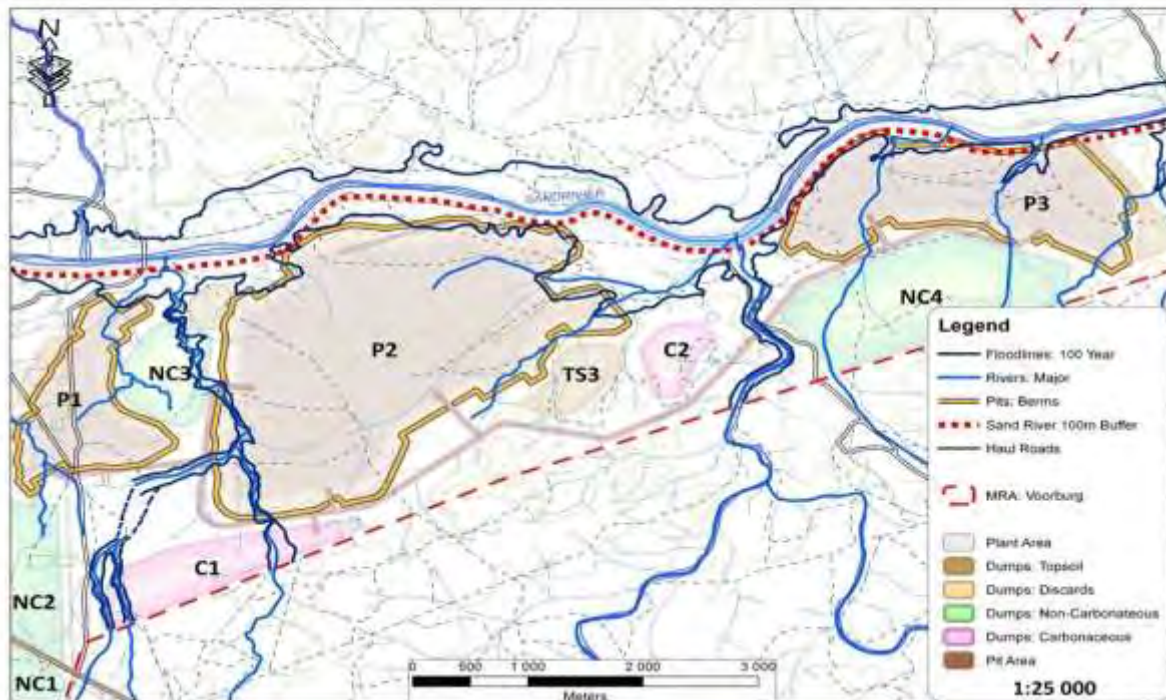

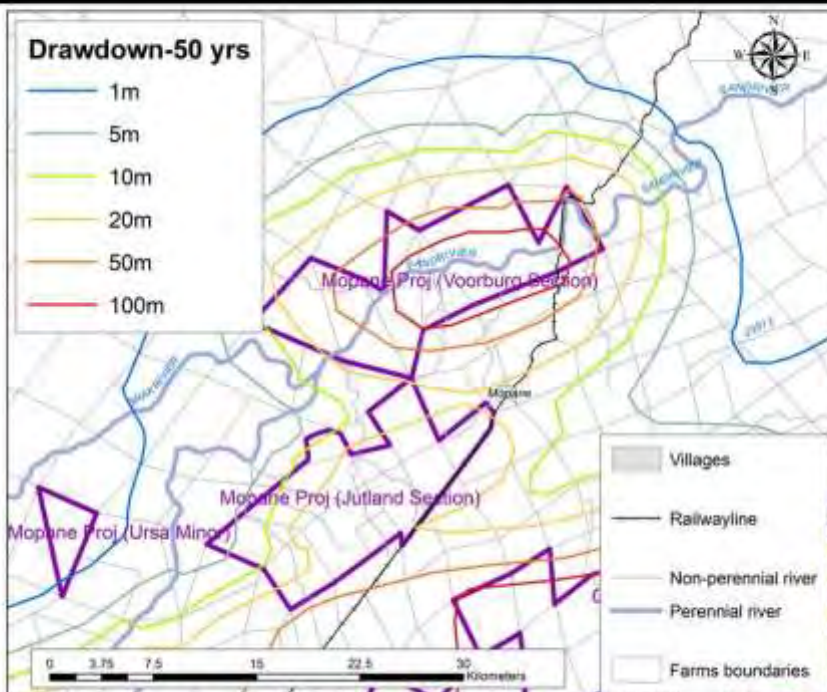




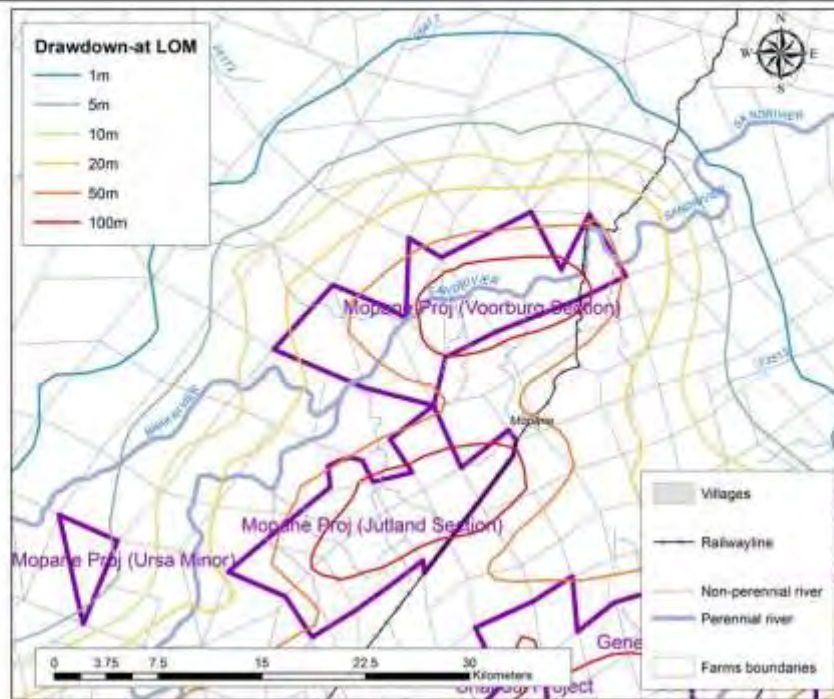
# Potential Impact on Groundwater – 20 years

Ms. Duval introduced CoAL as a proudly South African company, with the entire staff complement South African. CoAL is listed on 3 exchanges, JSE, AIM, and ASX. The company has repositioned itself as a project development company. The financial situation of CoAL was explained, which resulted in a S 189 process, impacting 30% of head office staff who were retrenched. The company is doing things different, and processes are being driven by CoAL.

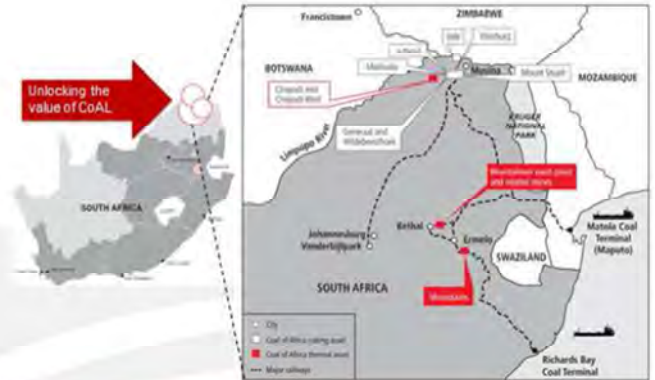

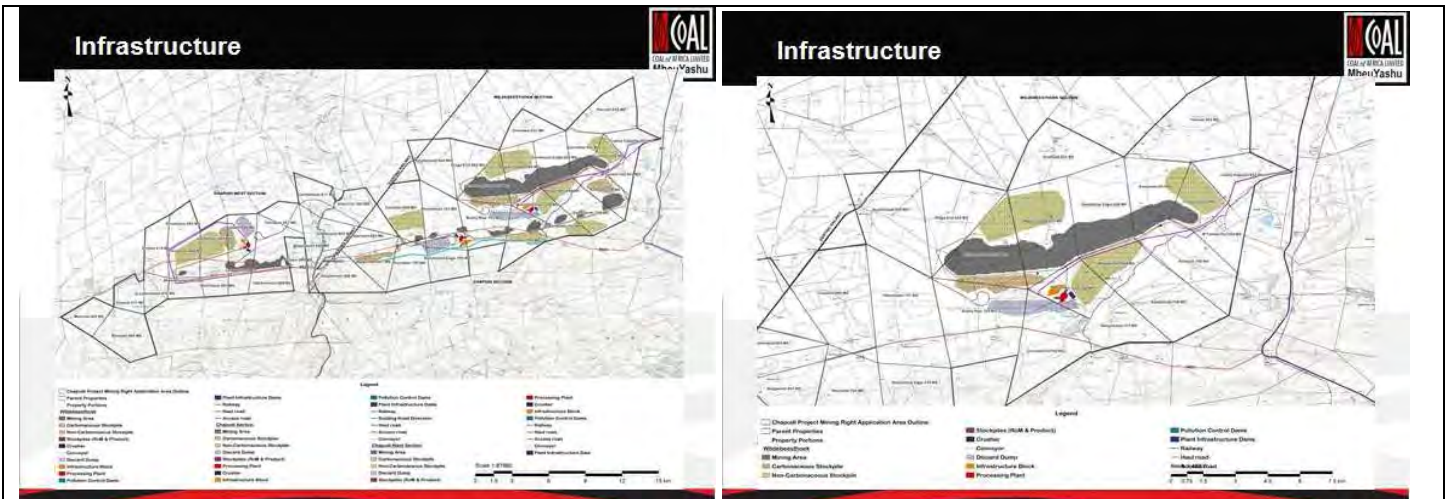
## 2.4 MbeuYashu Project

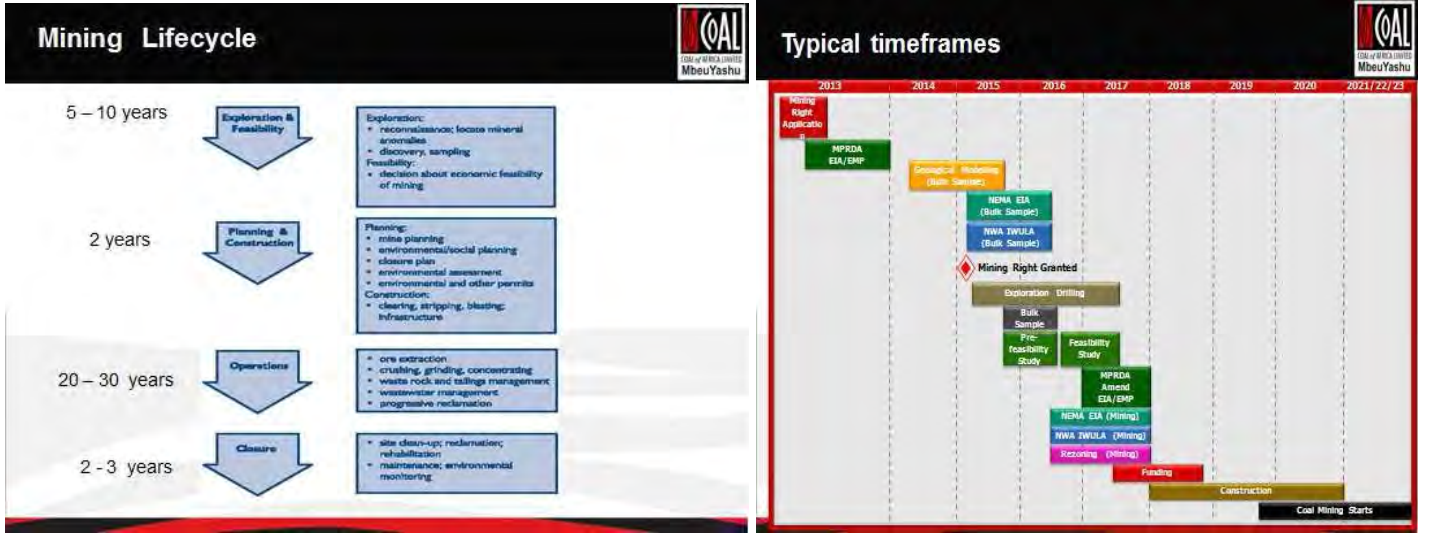


Sustainable Value Model

Mr Khosa explained that mining was a very long process, which includes legal and regulatory activities. The custodian of mineral rights is the State, he said. The company was currently doing impact assessments.

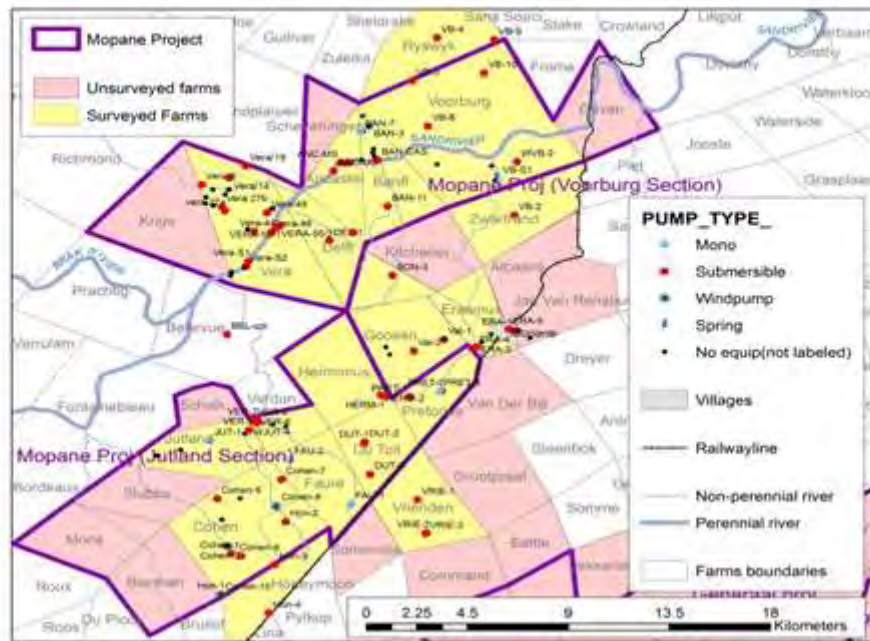

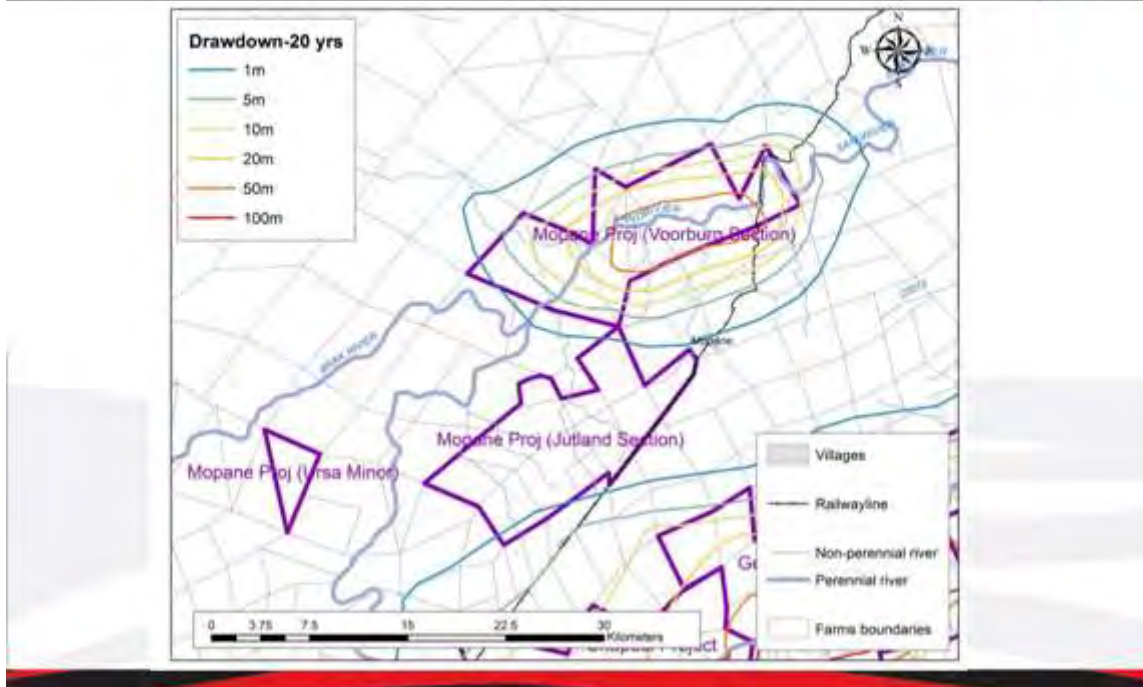
# Potential Impact on Flood-lines

He thanked people for attending the meeting, and for giving up their Friday evenings, and for being willing to even stay until very late. It was a sign of commitment from the communities for the project, and their desire to see development in their area, and for their children. MbeuYashu's vision is to create sustainable value for all stakeholders, and for communities in particular, and the company wants to maximize the benefits which can be derived from mining for communities. He told the meeting of the time when he was CEO of Trade and Investment Limpopo (TIL), and Mr Ramano was the Chairman. Together, they travelled all over the world to persuade investors to invest in Limpopo.

For development to take place, co-operation and commitment was required from all stakeholders. A transport policy would be developed to address the travelling needs of stakeholders.

The greatest challenge to the project was that there were people who did not want any mining at all in the Soutpansberg Area. He encouraged people to see the vision of what these projects could achieve, and to see the projects through to the end. He concurred with Mr Ramano that it was the responsibility of government to process the land claims issues, and not that of MbeuYashu.

***“Tshe was dya iwe tshilavhi, na murundo wa phofu u do vhuya wa nwa”***, he remarked as he encouraged people to stay true to the vision.

### MR MASHUDU RAMANO

Mr Ramano thanked all the people for coming, and confirmed that transport allowances would be given. He reminded the attendees that mineral rights belong to the state, and the state would grant custodianship to those who were eligible.

He ended off with the Chinese proverb, “A journey of a thousand miles begins with one step”. We have begun the journey, he encouraged the people, and it needed to be completed.


