<p>We note from the BID that you intend following a staggered approval process in relation to at least the ancillary activities which would require environmental authorisation under the NEMA EIA regulations and an integrated water use license under the National Water Act, No. 36 of 1.998. As you are aware, in the event that the mining rights which form the subject matter of the abovementioned applications (and others referred to) should be granted, mining operations ought to commence within 12 (twelve) months after the date of grant. At this early stage we warn you that your proposed process is unacceptable in view of the objections and opposition which will follow not only the abovementioned applications, but also the ancillary applications aforementioned. Under the circumstances, it is highly unlikely that the ancillary processes will have been completed and approved before your clients will become obliged to commence mining operations. Infrastructure

The placement of stockpiles is indicated on Figure 8 in the Scoping Report. Internal haul roads will be utilised to transport the overburden material to the stockpiles. Coal will be transported via conveyor and rail.

ROM coal and discard will be transported by truck on internal roads only. Between the Voorburg and Jutland Sections, ROM coal will be transported via conveyor. The final product will be transported via rail to its destination. Thus, the increase in traffic will be limited to the construction phase (deliveries) and an increase in light duty vehicles / buses for employee transport. Refer to Section 4.6 of the Scoping Report that deals with the logistics.

CoAL does not support the establishment of new mining towns, the company will look at existing towns and the sourcing of local labour. For example at Vele the contractors that operate the mine have strict requirements that they employ local people. In the beginning of a mine you need people with skills while training people. At Vele, 82% of the labourers are local. There is a Bus service that runs from Musina every day.





We were seriously misled by your notification of the Mopane Project that we received on 25 April 2013. On your map you stated that Maseri Pan is the triangular farm to the upper west of your map. In the latest map it is called Krige which is exactly adjacent to Mafojani Lodge. It will be a tourism and ecological disaster to allow mining activity in this area as I have stated previously in my letter dated 26/04/2013. We herewith vigorously oppose this development in the light of the potential threat against the conservation area that Mafojani forms part of. It will leave the whole area virtually worthless.

4. How many hectares would the 2 mining pits consist of, after the 28 years of mining has expired?
5. How high would the mine heap be and also its size in hectares at its peak?
6. What roads would be utilized to transport the coal?
7. Ursha Minor is equally strange – please give details.

I would like you to confirm in writing how and when do you require our input.

As stated in my letter of 26/04/2013, one of the main features of Mafojani is based on the pristine view of the area that is effected, unspoilt noise levels, clean air etc.

WRITTEN COMMENTS RECEIVED ON THE SUBMISSION OF MINING RIGHT APPLICATIONS FOR THE MOPANE PROJECT

Coal of Africa Limited ("CoAL") and Rothe Investments (Pty) Ltd ("Rothe") who jointly own 100% of MbeuYashu would like to thank you for your participation and comments provided to date in the Mopane Mining Right Applications process.

Your comments have been received and have been taken into consideration. In short please find a response to your contribution below:

1. *Why have the names changed from your original notification to the latest one?*

This is an error on our side. The original plan labelled this specific farm as Maserie Pan, while in fact it is the farm Krige. This was rectified in the Background Information Document (BID). We apologise for this.

2. *Why is the farm Krige included since it only forms a fragmented piece joint by small plots? These plots are also a patchwork with some plots excluded? What is the current legal status of Krige and who is the current owner?*

The current mining plan does not include any mining or infrastructure development on the farm Krige. There is however a possibility of an economic resource through the Vera farms onto Krige, and to confirm mineral resource MbeuYashu plans to do further exploration drilling on this farm, thus the inclusion of this farm in the mining right application (MRA).

In terms of the landownership of the farm Krige, please refer to the Scoping Report (once available) for this information.

3. *Why would some large area be demarcated for mining if the intention is only to mine the Voorburg and Jutland mining pits?*

As stated above, further exploration is planned in the greater Mopane Project area to determine the mineral resource and finalise the viability of further mining. This will be undertaken as part of the Feasibility Phase for the Mopane Project once the mining licence is granted. Prospecting and mining rights are issued on farm boundaries, not on the footprint of a mineable resource.

4. *How many hectares would the 2 mining pits consist of, after the 28 years of mining has expired?*

It is expected that no more than 300 ha will be open at any one time as we do concurrent backfilling and rehabilitation. At the end of the life of mine the final pit void will be filled and rehabilitated. Based on the current mining and infrastructure footprint as submitted with the MRA, the Mopane Project footprint covers an area of 1 572 ha for mining and a further 1 964 ha for infrastructure development. The Voorburg mining pits cover approximately 905 ha and the Jutland mining pits a further 667 ha.

It is important to note that after the mining right has been granted there will be further exploration work and feasibility studies, which could potentially alter the footprints as currently indicated.

5. *How high would the mine heap be and also its size in hectares at its peak?*

The discards stockpile at the Jutland Infrastructure Hub (plant) will be in the order of 35 m high, with a total footprint of approximately 185 hectares. This final layout and footprint of the overburden stockpiles at the mining pits will only be determined after completion of the Feasibility Phase referred to in point 3 above.

6. *What roads would be utilized to transport the coal?*

No hauling will take place along existing farm roads or regional / national roads.

It is planned that the run-of-mine (ROM) coal will be transported for short distances by truck, on the in-pit haul roads to the crushing and screening facilities. The crushed and screened ROM product will be transported to the coal beneficiation plant at the Infrastructure Hub via conveyor.

It is further planned that the product will be loaded directly onto trains at the Rail Load-out Terminal situated at the Infrastructure Hub which links up with the existing Musina-Makhado railway line.

7. *Ursha Minor is equally strange –please give details.*

MbeuYashu has acquired significant rights in the Soutpansberg Valley and is in the process of consolidation of these rights. Ursha Minor has neighbouring rights owned by others and MbeuYashu is in negotiations with them regarding potential consolidation of these as well.

WARNING: The Mopane Project will be an exceptionally destructive project that will threaten the livelihood of thousands of people, destroy jobs and even threaten our neighbouring Mozambique. It is situated right at the convergence of the Sand and Brak River systems, which supports agriculture and many communities by way of groundwater, both up- and downstream. If the project uses 7,600 m³ of water per day, then by assumptions in your own report, it will utilize the water of 7,600 farms. The Brak and Sand River catchment area is much larger than other rivers in the area and one of the only systems that cuts through the Soutpansberg.

In simpler terms, look at the map of the catchment area in your report and imagine it being a chicken, the Mopane Project is right at its neck. You will choke the chicken and leave yourselves open to claims from thousands of those who will be left destitute. There are other coal deposits where you can pluck the feathers without killing the chicken.

I note a few other aspects concerning your report and herewith notify that this is an official complaint which is not limited to this document or the issues mentioned therein.



1. On page 145 you clearly state that you will utilize "seepage" into the mining pits. How can you guarantee that the water table will stay intact?
2. In figure 51 you describe the photograph as "typical vegetation". Do you agree that the photograph that I will attach is also "typical" and that it would be malicious to omit details regarding the pristine Sand Riverbed?
3. In your definition of noise, you do not include the value that unspoilt natural sounds have for eco-tourism. Do you agree that the noise of mining will be heard for at least a 30 km-radius thus affecting many more farms than what you anticipate?
4. You list a threat of emissions as being veld fires and methane excreted by animals. Do you agree that you should rather list the potential dust as being hazardous? (Emission figures are not available according to your report)

5. Although you admit that your borehole survey has yet to be completed, your analysis will only provide a comparison in hindsight after the boreholes have been contaminated. Can you guarantee that the boreholes will not in fact be contaminated?
6. You describe the Sand River as not being suitable for dams. Do you agree that this river system supports many smaller dams that, in essence, has more value than one large dam for the affected communities?
7. Do you agree that the downstream effect, including Musina, Pafuri and Mozambique, will be negatively impacted on all fronts bearing similarities with the Witbank-area?
8. There are mistakes in your report, just like the previous one I pointed out where you got the names of the respective farms wrong, but this time referring to the hectares of suitable soils that do not correspond with the colours on the map.

Dear Ms. Dickson/Directors of Coal of Africa

MOPANE MINING PROJECT

1. Our letters of 26 April 2013 and 28 May 2013 and your reply dated 12 June 2013 have reference and should be read as if incorporated herein.
2. Take notice that any mining activity in the proposed mining area will be vehemently opposed.
3. Further to our initial objections, which stand recorded, we wish to point out that your mining right application and intentions to mine the entire area are premature, since one can hardly apply for a mining right on property where one has no idea what the nature and extent (including economic viability) of the resource, presumably to be mined, is. In your letter of 12 June 2013 you state that *“As stated above, further exploration is planned in the greater Mopane Project area to determine the mineral resource and finalise the viability of further mining.”* Surely, this means that you are applying for a mining right over property of which you have absolutely no idea whether it should or could be mined, by any stretch of the imagination. Your application over at least these portions should for this reason alone be refused.
4. In addition, it is noted that your application also precedes a feasibility study which again and in turn means that you are still not sure whether the resource on the entire property can or

should be mined, or on what economic basis. Your entire application must for this reason be refused.

5. We reiterate our objections as to the enormous negative impact which any mining will have on the water supply in the area, the debasement of the ecology, and the impact which your intentions will have on the social economic region as a whole.
6. We further wish to be placed in possession of the content of all of your mining right applications (referenced above), including all plans, the lodged mining work programmes and social and labour plans, with specific reference to the financial provisions and undertakings including proof of financial ability in each case. You will appreciate that we require these so as to properly assess the applications.
7. We also wish to enquire as to the status of your Water Use Licence Application and wish to be placed in possession of such application/s, if any.
8. We conclude that your applications can for many reasons not be compliant with the Minerals and Petroleum Resources Development Act, no 28 of 2002, as amended or with the Regulations promulgated in terms thereof.
9. We look forward to your urgent reply.

Your comments have been received and have been taken into consideration. In short please find a response from MbeuYashu on your contribution below:

MPRDA Process & Mining Right area

We take note of your objection. The Mopane Project has the potential to produce good quality hard coking coal and a domestic thermal coal product. The technical studies of the Mopane Project show that the project has an economically viable return.

It is important to note that the approach for the Mopane Project is to first apply for a NOMR and follow the required Regulations in conducting the EIA and compile an EMP in terms of the MPRDA. Once this process is completed and the applicant has obtained further detail in respect of its planned development, the applications for environmental authorisation in terms of the NEMA and an IWUL in terms of the NWA will be conducted as separate processes.

The exploration drilling planned is to obtain further information to enable the company to do detail planning and design for the project. The feasibility study done will utilise the additional information and project designs to compile the feasibility study which is used for the further applications as mentioned above.

Please note that the Department of Mineral Resources is the regulator and custodian of the legislative framework for the mining industry. The department is responsible to assess the mining right application in terms of viability, as well as the company's financial ability to implement the project. The documents you require are not public documents and cannot therefore be made available as they contain confidential commercial information.

Water and Waste Management

Groundwater:

- Define the aquifer characteristics and develop a conceptual model of the groundwater regime.
- Set up a numerical groundwater model based on the conceptual model developed.
- Model the impact of mining on the groundwater system, determining inflows to the pits and water level variations over the life of mine.
- Determine the groundwater/surface water interaction with specific reference to the Sand River and the interaction with the alluvial aquifer.

Surface water:

- 1:100 flood-lines for all major streams / rivers
- Clean & dirty water separation / storm water management plans
- Impact on water quality & quantity as a result of mining
- Water monitoring programme

Aquatic systems:

- Delineation of rivers and wetlands
- Determination of PES/EIS of wetlands and water courses

Biodiversity:

- Ecosystem services of the Mopane Project area
- Biodiversity proxy (sensitivity) of the Mopane Project area
- Protected / conservation areas

The layout of the proposed mining and infrastructure layout plans will be revisited once the above impact assessments are completed in order to minimise the negative impacts and optimise the positive impacts associated with the project. In general the following principles will apply:

- All mining and infrastructure will be placed outside of the 1:100 year flood line of major streams / rivers
- Due consultation in environmentally sensitive areas

Ecological & Biodiversity Aspects

The Sand River bed forms only a very small portion of the total MRA area and the Mopane veld (photo we included in the report) would therefore be regarded as the more typical representation.

Noise, Visual and Air quality

During the EIA Phase, a noise impact assessment was performed by Gudani Consulting. The purpose of an environmental noise impact assessment is to determine and quantify the acoustical impact on the surrounding environment and identified noise-sensitive developments using a sound propagation model known as the Concave model, as defined in SANS 10357:2004. In addition, the noise emission into the environment due to additional traffic will be calculated using the sound propagation model described in SANS 10210.

The result will be a quantification of projected noise levels considering the likely and projected ambient sound levels. The significance will be determined considering the defined magnitude of the noise level, the extent as well as the duration of the projected noise impact, as well as the probability that this impact may take place.

The total projected cumulative noise level will be compared to the appropriate acceptable rating levels as defined in SANS 10103:2008. Should the significance of the impact be high, recommendations will be made regarding the implementation of reasonable mitigation measures to reduce the impact.

The results will be presented in the EIA/EMP report that will be made available to the IAPs.
