1	Introduction	LM
	Meeting commences by the introduction by LM to Caarl. LM goes on to explain that the meeting was requested by Caarl and it was decided upon that it takes place after community meeting as he has different concerns as a farmowner of one of the farms neighbouring Waterkloof	
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	C voices his concerns with the hydrogeology, he states that the moment water was used by the mines in Postmasburg the water table went down affecting his farm.	C MR
	Answer: MR explains that during the EIA process, studies will be completed in 2019, conclusions drawn from these studies will then be communicated and used to determine the next step.	
	C states that Orange River is approximately 80kms from the farm (Waterkloof), he suggests that should the mine be established to transfer water from there. He adds on that the mines in Postmasburg are affecting the water supply in adjacent farms and is trying to avoid that problem for the farms close to Waterkloof	C MR LM
	MR explains that there are different aquifers in a region and that it might have been that the farms adjacent to Postmasburg have the same aquifer but that might be different for Waterkloof and the surrounding farms. MR continues to say that this can only be confirmed once studies are completed.	
	LM adds that iron ore will be processed in a different place, therefore the mine will not be needing a large amount of water to be operational.	

C states that water is the main use in his farm, also states that dust control used in mines also requires water. MR explains that different chemicals and mitigation methods can be used for dust control.	
C says that there have been people before who came with promises not only to the communities but to the farm owners as well, asks what will be done that is different.	C LM
LM explains that the SLP is legally binding, which makes it a priority for the mines to establish a relationship with the communities.	
C is concerned that he can't do anything on his farm without water.	C LM
LM reminds C of the statement MR made of the possibility of there being different aquifers and can only be confirmed once studies have been completed.	
C adds that as soon as the mine Rooineke, which is adjacent to his farms, was operational, the boreholes on his farm were empty. C continues to say that his main concern is water.	
LM assures C that he understands his concerns and that the next steps will be determined once hydrogeological studies are completed.	
C is satisfied with the answer, and will await communication.
