1 Introduction

Copper Sunset Sand (Pty) Ltd (Copper Sunset) intends to apply for a Mining Permit in terms of the Minerals and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (Act No. 28 of 2002) (MPRDA). The proposed 5 hectares (ha) area for the mining of sand exists within the existing New Vaal Colliery mining area (New Vaal Life Extension Project). The Project is located in the northern part of the Free State Province, approximately 2.8 km south of the town Vereeniging. The project area falls under the Metsimahalo Local Municipality (MLM).

2 Environmental Authorisation Process

Copper Sunset appointed Digby Wells Environmental (Digby Wells) to independently facilitate the environmental applications relevant to the proposed Project. Copper Sunset intends to apply for a Mining Permit through completing a Mining Permit Application in terms of Section 27 of the MPRDA. The proposed project triggers Listed Activities of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2014 (GN R 982 of 4 December 2014 as amended by GN R 326 of 7 April 2017) promulgated under the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA). The project triggers Activity 21 of Listing Notice 1, and therefore requires a Basic Assessment (BA) process to be undertaken and approval received prior to the commencement of mining activities. This process requires a comprehensive public consultation process.

3 Background Information

The proposed project falls within an existing MRA of the New Vaal Colliery, which is owned by Seriti Resources. It is proposed that Copper Sunset will mine the 5 ha of sand through a Mining Permit. If still feasible thereafter, Copper Sunset proposes to apply for a Mining Right to mine an additional 9.2 ha to extract the remaining sand. This however will form part of a separate Environmental Authorisation process to be conducted should the Mining Permit be approved.

4 Public Participation Process

The national South African Regulatory Framework requires a Public Participation Process (PPP) to be undertaken as part of an Environmental Authorisation application. A PPP involves notifying stakeholders of the proposed Project and providing Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) with enough information to enable effective engagement.



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To satisfy the requirements of Regulations 40 through 44 of the NEMA EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended), this notification letter serves to inform you as a potential I&AP of the proposed Project, the associated Environmental Authorisation process and the availability of the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR) for public review.

The draft Basic Assessment will be available for public comment for 30 days on the Digby Wells website from the **08 July 2020 to 08 August 2020**.
