1. Background to the Project

Sekoko Coal (Pty) Ltd obtained a Mining Right and Environmental Authorisation for the Sekoko Waterberg Colliery in August 2011 and March 2012 respectively (Mining Right Ref No: LP30/5/1/2/2/184 MR; Authorisation reference: 12/1/9-7/2-W11). In terms of these authorisations, the mining area comprises the following properties: Minnasvlakte 258 LQ, Smitspan 306 LQ, Massenberg 305 LQ and Remainder of Hooikraal 315 LQ. In terms of this Mining Right, the mine would produce up to 5 Million tons per annum (Mtpa) of coal. In addition to this, Sekoko Coal received authorisation for the construction of a railway siding and link to transport the coal from the mine to the target market (LDEDET reference number 12/1/9/2-W5; DEA Reference 12/9/11/L497/5)

Following discussions with Eskom regarding requirements for coal supply to various power stations, it has been determined that the annual output of coal from the mine can be increased from 5 Mtpa to 10Mtpa. A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The entire project will entail the following (full detail of the project can also be appended):

Sekoko Coal (Pty) Ltd has received a Mining Right (registration number 2004/010887/07) and NEMA Environmental Authorisation (Ref number: 12/1/9-7/2-W111) for the Waterberg Coal Mine near Lephalale in the Limpopo Province to be located on farm 306 (Smitpan), farm 258 (Minnansvlakte), farm 305 (Massenberg) and farm 315 (Hooikraal). However, Eskom has indicated the need for additional coal supply from this mine, and there is therefore a need to expand the mine from 5Mtpa to 10Mtpa. This expansion would require associated expansion of land for coal-mining (to include farm 220 (Olieboomsfontein), farm 263 (Duikerfontein); farm 262 (Swanepoelpan) and farm 304LQ (Vetleegte)). At this stage, the main infrastructure relevant to this application is the development of a spoil stockpile, development of a water supply pipeline, development of a railway line and access roads. This spoil stockpile is proposed to cover an extent of approximately 220ha and is proposed on the farm Swanepoelpan RE/262:-

- Approval from the DMR for an amendment to the existing EMPr, which will be supported by the EIA; and
- A water use licence for the water uses associated with the proposed mining activities on the project site/s not already authorised in terms of the existing permits.

The Sekoko Waterberg Colliery is located within the Lephalale Local Municipality, which forms part of the Waterberg District Municipality of the Limpopo Province. The purpose of the Waterberg Colliery will be to mine coal for both the local power stations within the Waterberg area as well as for the export markets. A processing plant and various mine related infrastructure will be erected within an appropriate location within the mining area, depending on the final mining plan. Opencast mining will initiate on the farm Smitspan for the first 5 years at which



stage only a 1-stage wash plant for coal processing will be required. From year 4 to 20 opencast mining will be accompanied by underground mining, at which point a 2-stage plant will be required. During this period it is highly likely that opencast and possibly underground mining will commence on other areas within the mining right boundary. The total life of mine is expected to be beyond 60 years. The proposed mining area will involve opencast and underground coal mining on the following farm portions:

- 1. Minnasvlakte 258 LQ
- 2. Smitspan 306 LQ
- 3. Massenberg 305 LQ
- 4. Remainder of Hooikraal 315 LQ
- 5. Swanepoel Pan 262 LQ
- 6. Olieboomsfontein 220 LQ
- 7. Duikerfontein 263 LQ
- Vetleegte 304 LQ

Note that the farms listed from point 1 - - 5 have been authorised by the DMR and LDEDET. The scope of this EMPr amendment and EIA process will include all 8 farm portions listed above due to the required increase in output of coal that is planned to be mined as well as the amendment to the approved Mine Work Programme and infrastructure layout. Originally, the main coal mine processing plant was proposed and authorised by LDEDET and the DMR on Farm Smitspan 306 LQ. This has been amended and the main coal mine processing plant is now proposed on Farm Minnasvlakte 258 LQ or Remainder of Hooikraal 315 LQ. The scope of this EIA and EMPr application will apply to the new location of the coal mine processing plant on Farm Minnasvlakte 258 LQ or Remainder of Hooikraal 315 LQ, as well as the inclusion of four additional farm portions (Swanepoel Pan 262 LQ, Olieboomsfontein 220 LQ, Duikerfontein 263 LQ and Vetleegte 304 LQ).

- » Topsoil and spoil stockpiles.






