Provide a <u>full</u> description of the nature and extent of the proposed development or activity including its potential impacts (eg: changes in land use, envisaged timeframes, provision of additional bulk services, excavations, landscaping, total floor area, height of development, etc. etc.): The proposal is for a mixed use development on the site of the present Quay 7 warehouse on East Pier Road, immediately to the north of the Table Bay Hotel, and an events venue, a waste facility, a heliport and associated parking on the portion of reclaimed land immediately to the east of the breakwater.

The warehouse dates from 1924 and is currently vacant. It was previously occupied by the fishing storage facilities and associated office facilities (Atlantic Fishing Co.). The fishing industry has relocated due to changing fishing patterns and functional requirements. These relate to, inter alia, the need for deeper berths for larger vessels and the need for improved infrastructure.

The building is a double storey, concrete framed structure with plastered brick infill, with a series of gables on the east and west elevations. These gable ends form a distinctive waterfront typology, typical and representative of warehouse activity in the early decades of the twentieth century, They provide a framing element to the Victorian Basin. The exterior steel work is in poor condition with corrosive impacts on the concrete framework. The intention is to dismantle the structure and to insert an approximately six storey building (approx. 10,000m2 bulk) with two floors of underground parking within the existing footprint. The external concrete framework will be re-established in its original location to retain the memory and distinctive form of the original building.

Potential impacts relate to the mass and scale of the new insertion, the extent to which the new

building will impact on the industrial warehouse typology which is a distinctive framing element in the Victoria Basin, the visual impacts of a relatively large structure in a visually strategic location in the Waterfront, the potential impact on the breakwater wall dating from the late nineteenth century, the impact on the working harbour component particularly related to the fishing industry and the loss of physical fabric.

Provide a short history of the site and its environs (Include sources where available): The Victorian Basin component of the V&AW dates from 1895. It functioned as the main harbour for the City of Cape Town prior to the construction of Duncan Dock in the 1950's. From that time the Victoria Basin has been closely associated with the fishing industry which has to an extent been incorporated from the early 1990's. The nature of the fishing industry has changed due to altered technologies and economies and the warehouse building under consideration is no longer used by the industry.

Describe elements in the environs of the site that could be deemed to be heritage resources: The industrial warehouse character, typical of the early 20^{th} century is a distinctive place-making quality of the Victoria Basin. The breakwater wall (c1895).

Description of impacts on heritage resources in the environs of the site: Heritage resources relate largely to the warehouse typology which is representative of early 20th century industrial buildings which frame the Victoria Basin, the working harbour aspect related to the previous fishing industry use of the structure, and associated elements such as the cranes on East Quay, the adjacent Breakwater wall (1895) and the strategic visual location at the point of entry into the Victoria basin from the north.

Impacts relate to the potential loss of the warehouse character, the scale and massing of the new insertion, visual impacts from strategic locations within the broader context and within the Victoria Basin, potential impacts on the adjacent Breakwater wall and the loss of working harbour elements.

Summary of anticipated impacts on heritage resources: The primary potential impacts relate to the scale and massing of the new development on the existing warehouse character, the potential loss of the legibility of the series of gable ends which are a distinctive framing element in the Victoria Basin, and the potential erosion of the working harbour element of the Victoria Basin.
