### **1 INTRODUCTION AND PROJECT LOCALITY**




Figure 2: PV Power Project in relation to the approved Redstone CSP Project

The Applicant, ACWA Power SolarReserve Redstone Solar Thermal Power Plant RF (Pty) Ltd, proposes the development, construction and operation of the ACWA Power SolarReserve Redstone Solar Photovoltaic Power Plant ("**PV Power Project**") on the Remaining Extent of Farm No. 469, Hay Registration Division, Northern Cape Province ("**Project Site**"). The planned PV Power Project will be situated approximately 30 km east of Postmasburg in the Northern Cape Province, adjacent to the approved ACWA Power SolarReserve Redstone Solar Thermal Power Plant ("Redstone CSP Project"). The Project Site falls within the jurisdiction of the Tsantsabane Local Municipality and the ZF Mgcawu District Municipality. **Figure 1** indicates the Project Site within its regional setting whereas **Figure 2** indicates the PV Power Project locality in relation to the Redstone CSP Project.

The Applicant has received an Environmental Authorisation, with DEA reference number 12/12/20/2316, to construct and operate the Redstone CSP Project on the Project Site. The Redstone PV Power Project is designed to allow the Redstone CSP Power Project to generate renewable green energy for self-consumption in order to operate and run the auxiliary load requirements of the Redstone CSP Power Project.

The PV Power Project will have a generation capacity of up to 19.5 MW Peak (DC) which is a design capacity of ~15 MWAC, with up to 30 MW hours of battery storage. The proposed PV Power Plant utilises proven technology which produces energy by directly converting solar irradiation into electricity. Power is generated by the solar cells as long as they are exposed to sunlight. PV cell technology has been in continuous operation on earth as well as in space (satellites) for over 30 years. The technology is commercially proven and large multi-megawatt generation plants have been operating since the 1990s.

The development of the PV Power Project requires Environmental Authorisation (EA) by means of a Basic Assessment (BA) Process and triggers the following Listed Activities:

- Listing Notice 1 (GN No. 983 of 4 Dec '14 as amended by GN No. 327 of 7 Apr '17):
  - Activity 1: Construction of a PV Plant to generate up to 19.5 MW of power to supply the auxiliary load requirements for the Redstone CSP Project to avoid the usage of an external power source;
  - Activity 27: The clearing of more than 1 ha but less than 20 ha of indigenous vegetation;
  - Activity 30: There are potentially protected species and ecologically sensitive areas located on site which are considered important in terms of NEMBA;
- Listing Notice 3: (GN No. 985 of 4 Dec '14 as amended by GN No. 324 of 7 Apr '17):
  - $_{\odot}$  Activity 12: The clearing of more than 300  $m^2$  of indigenous vegetation.

# **2 OBJECTIVES OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

The purpose of this Public Participation Process is:

- To provide Background Information to the proposed activity;
- To provide a locality map indicating the locality of the proposed activity;
- To notify potential Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) of the Environmental Process to be followed in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA), 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998), as amended;
- To obtain issues and concerns from potential I&APs regarding the Environmental Process to be followed and the proposed activity; and
- To address issues and concerns as part of the Public Participation Process (PPP).

Public Participation is important for the following reasons:

- It provides an opportunity for I&APs, Environmental Assessment Practitioners (EAPs) and the Competent Authority (CA) to obtain clear, accurate and understandable information about the environmental impacts of the proposed activity or implications of a decision;
- It provides I&APs with an opportunity to voice their support, concerns and questions regarding the project application or decision;
- It provides I&APs with the opportunity of suggesting ways for reducing or mitigating any negative impacts of the project and for enhancing its positive impacts;
- It enables an applicant to incorporate the needs, preferences and values of affected parties into its application;
- It provides opportunities for clearing up misunderstandings about technical issues, resolving disputes and reconciling conflicting interests;
- It is an important aspect of securing transparency and accountability in decision-making; and
- It contributes toward maintaining a healthy, vibrant democracy.

### **3 IDENTIFICATION OF I&APs**

The following groups were identified as potential I&APs:

- Relevant Departmental Representatives;
- Relevant Institutional/Organisational Representatives;
- Relevant Municipal Representatives;
- The Ward Councillor; and
- Surrounding Landowners/Occupiers.

It should be noted that, following the project initiation, correspondence was directed to all registered I&APs. Accordingly, to ensure that all potential I&APs were made aware of the project and had the



opportunity to register, the initial notification process was as thorough as possible. For the list of identified I&APs refer to **APPENDIX 1**.

# **4 NOTIFICATION OF I&APs**

#### 4.1 SITE NOTICES

To inform surrounding and immediate communities, landowners and farm workers of the Redstone PV Power Project, six (6) A2 (600 mm x 420 mm) notices were erected at visible and accessible locations throughout the broader study area. Photographic evidence of the site notices erected on 24 April 2018 is attached as **APPENDIX 2**.

#### 4.2 NEWSPAPER ADVERTISEMENTS

To inform a broad base of individuals who might want to register as I&APs, newspaper advertisements were placed in two (2) separate newspapers. For proof of advertisements placed, refer to **APPENDIX 3**. Advertisements were placed in the following newspapers:

### **5 CONSULTATIONS**

#### 5.1 REGULATORY CONSULTATION

A telephonic discussion was held with the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) case officer for the Project on 19 April 2018, to discuss the Redstone PV Power Project and its development alternatives. DEA indicated that a formal pre-application consultation meeting would not be required and provided the Applicant with a list of information required. A summary of the telephone discussion is attached as **APPENDIX 7**.

Copies of the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR) were provided to the Competent and Commenting Authorities indicated in **Table 1** below for their review and to provide them with the opportunity to comment on the draft documents. For proof of the DBAR delivered to the relevant entities refer to **APPENDIX 14**. Follow up telephone discussions were held with the contact person



from each Department as well as follow up emails sent to request comment on the DBAR (refer to **APPENDIX 15**). Support for the Redstone PV Power Project was received from the Tsantsabane Local Municipality, dated 05 June 2018 (refer to **APPENDIX 13**).

### **6 REGISTRATIONS AND COMMENTS RECEIVED**

Identified I&APs were encouraged to submit their Registration and Comment Sheets to Environmental Management Assistance (Pty) Ltd (EMA), the EAP for the Redstone PV Power Project, in order for them to receive further correspondence regarding the proposed Redstone PV Power Project. Over and above the Registration and Comment Sheets, I&AP registrations and comments were also received in the form of emails and text message. ### **7 PROJECT SUPPORT**

A letter of support via text message (SMS) was received from the Secretary for the Groenwater Communal Property Association. The Groenwater CPA, as adjacent landowner and community nearest to the Redstone PV Power Project, pledged their support to the Redstone PV Power Project, and reiterated that the community would like the development to proceed. Letters of support have furthermore been received from the Tsantsabane Local Municipality and from the land owner of the Project Site. These letters of support are provided in **APPENDIX 13**.

It should be noted that no objections to the Redstone PV Power Project has been received from any public entities/persons, including adjacent land owners.

I&APs were informed of the availability of the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR) for Public Comment by means of email and text message (SMS). This was done in order to afford the public as well as I&APs with the opportunity to comment on the DBAR and provide their input, comments or questions in writing to the EAP. # **9 ADDRESSING COMMENTS AND CONCERNS**

A Comments and Response Report (C&RR) have been compiled as part of the PPP for the proposed Redstone PV Power Project. This document records the matters of concern, questions and suggestions contributed by stakeholders during the course of the Environmental Authorisation process in terms of the relevant legislation. The C&RR also captures the responses provided by relevant parties in relation to any matters raised or queries posed. The C&RR is attached as **APPENDIX 12**.

- The C&RR is considered an active and dynamic document, which is updated throughout the PPP as more comments and concerns are raised.
- However, following submission of the final documents to the DEA, all additional comments should be directed directly to the DEA.

Following the verdict by the DEA on whether to grant or reject the application all registered I&APs will be informed of the decision as well as the appeal process and its timeframes for submission.
