### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP), Green Door Environmental, is required to:

- Act on behalf of the Applicant (not for);
- Be independent with no vested interest in the project (financial or other);
- Have the necessary qualifications, experience, expertise and knowledge of relevant legislation;
- Undertake the public participation process;
- Identify, assess and mitigate all impacts (positive & negative) the project may have had on the environment (social, ecological and economic); and
- Produce all information, plans and reports to the relevant authorities timeously.

### ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES CONT.

# The Applicant, is required to:

- Appoint an Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP);
- Be responsible for all costs;
- Ensure that the EAP is independent, i.e. has no vested interest in the outcome of the project;
- Ensure suitability of the EAP; and
- Ensure that the EAP provides adequate information to the Competent Authority.



# ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES CONT.

Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs), which include authorities, interest groups, neighbouring landowners, general public, are required to:

- Provide inputs and comments on supplied documentation within the given timeframes;
- State their interest in the project (business, financial, personal or other); and
- Contribute and participate openly, effectively and honestly.



# **BACKGROUND TO THE PROJECT**

The Applicant, **Beaumont Eston Farmers Association** (**BEFA**) wishes to **obtain Environmental Authorisation** and a **Mining Permit** to mine Bulli soil on their property.

- Location: Portion 25 of Langeopdravende No. 1111, Eston.
- Property extent: 60 hectares
- Site extent: 4.1 hectares
- The site is located on a field on the BEFA property.
- Municipality Mkhambathini Local Municipality and uMgungundlovu District Municipality.
- BEFA sell the Bulli soil, which is predominantly used on cricket pitches.

# **BACKGROUND TO THE PROJECT**

- The Applicant does not mine the Bulli themselves, but employs a company to mine the soil on their behalf.
- The mining process involves a TLB and tip truck.
- The Bulli mining process involves the stockpiling of the vegetation and topsoil. A depth of approximately 30cm of the subsoil is mined.
- The topsoil and vegetation are replaced and the site is allowed to rehabilitate, which occurs naturally.
- Approximately 150m³ of Bulli soil is mined per year and 10 – 30m³ is mined at a time.
- The mining of the Bulli is not a constant process and may occur only once every two months, over a period of 1 – 3 days.


# **BACKGROUND TO THE PROJECT**

- BEFA currently holds a mining permit which has since expired. This Mining Permit was issued in 2008 and was for the mining of Bulli on two sites located on the property.
- Both of the original mining sites were closed and rehabilitated six years ago.
- The Mining Closure Application Process is being conducted concurrently with the Basic Assessment Process and has already been submitted to the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE).

#### **BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT**

- The development and activities trigger:
   Listed NEMA EIA activities.
- The applicability of identified activities will be confirmed during the process.
- EIA Activities and Mining Permit will be applied for through the Basic Assessment Process.
- Competent Authority KwaZulu-Natal Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE).

#### SPECIALIST STUDIES

# In terms of **specialist input**:

- The mining footprint does **not** intersect any wetlands from the National Freshwater Ecosystem Priority Area (NFEPA) database or South African Inventory of Inland Aquatic Ecosystems (SAIIAE) database.
- The proposed site does not intersect any Critical **Biodiversity Areas (CBA).**
- The site is not within 5km or 10km of any Protected Areas.
- The site does not intersect any Irreplaceable Critical Biodiversity Areas and has little ecological value.
- The proposed mining activities will have little to minimal impact on the environment. 15

#### PROGRESS TO DATE

To date the following activities have been completed for the **Basic Assessment Process**:

- Newspaper Adverts were placed in the Witness (English) and in the Echo (Zulu) on 11 August 2022.
- Site posters were placed on site on the 10 August 2022.
- Written notification in the form of a Background Information Document (BID) was circulated to all I&APs from 11 August 2022.

# **COMMENTS ON BID TO DATE**

Any impact on the drainage line and wetland, and cumulative impacts downstream are to be assessed.	Noted. This will be addressed in the Basic Assessment Report.
Duration of the mining activities must be specified and details on the depth of removal and extent.	Approximately 150m³ of Bulli is mined per year and 10 – 30 m³ is mined at a time. The mining of the Bulli is not a constant process and may only occur once every two months, over a period of 1 – 3 days. The topsoil and vegetation are replaced, and the site is allowed to rehabilitate, which occurs naturally.
Location of the Eskom power lines in relation to the proposed mining activity.	Noted. The proposed mining site is not in close proximity to any Eskom Powerlines.

# **COMMENTS ON BID TO DATE**

COMMENT / CONCERN	RESPONSE
The need of a soil survey to show the extent of the Bulli soil within the entire property, which will indicate its quantity on site.	Noted. This will be addressed in the Basic Assessment Report.
The measures put in place to ensure soil is not exposed to erosion and alien vegetation.	Noted. This will be addressed in the Basic Assessment Report.

- Following this, the **Draft Basic Assessment Report** will be **made available for comment** to all registered

- All comments received on the draft report will be addressed and included in the final version of the Basic Assessment Report, which will then be submitted to the DMRE.
- Once the DMRE has reached a decision, all I&APs will be notified and informed of that decision.
