Project Description and Location

The proposed residential development (study site) is situated in the Gauteng Province of South Africa. The development is proposed to be constructed on portion 42 of the Farm Roodekrans 183 IQ. The study site is situated in close proximity to the M47 Road (Hendrik Potgieter Road. (26°03'47.21"S, 27° 50'53.70"E).

The purpose of the proposed development will be to provide affordable housing.

The proposed residential development will encompass an area of 53 845m² and include 442 units with 306 2 bedroom units of 99.5m² and 146 2 bedroom units of 146m² each. A total of 82 units per hectare will be applicable onsite. All services will be installed onsite and the northwestern corner will be dedicated to greenspace.

Public Participation Process

The key objective of Public Participation is to assist stakeholders to identify issues of concern and suggestions for enhanced benefits, and to comment on the application. The Public Participation Process is an integral part of the process, and continues throughout the process, for this purpose the process is presented in a systematic approach:

- Step 1: Identify I&APs, and notify them of the proposed development, via adverts, notices, BIDs to identify issues and obtain comments.
- Step 2: I&APs are provided with the opportunity to review documents and comments on these (applications, and EMP). I&APs will be provided a 30 days to comment period on the reports.
- Step 3: Notify all registered I&APs of the Environmental Authorisation (granted or denied)
- Step 4: Notify all registered I&APs of the Water Use License Application (granted or denied).

Be an Integral Part of the Environmental Impact Assessment Process

Public involvement is an essential part of the Basic environmental assessment process. All comments will be recorded and presented to the project team and regulatory authorities. You will receive feedback on how your comments have been taken into account and the outcome of the assessment. You will further receive updates on the status of the project.
