Location of the Project

The proposed 2AFRICA/GERA (East) Cable System will make landfall at the Van Riebeeckstrand Beach near the existing ACE landing point and the cable will terminate at the ACE Cable Landing Station operated by MTN.

In terms of the EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended) the proposed development of the 2AFRICA/GERA (East) Cable System landing at Duynefontein potentially triggers several listed activities and requires environmental authorisation via the undertaking of an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA).
