



MADODA NDLAKUSE'S PROFILE SUMMARY

Before the world dubbed him as Dopla the storyteller Madoda Ndlakuse is a multi-talented proud father of two daughters. He was born in the notorious dusty streets of Mdantsane in East London, Eastern Cape. Due to circumstances that one will read about in his autobiography should he decide to publish it he lived in different places. 
