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1 Introduction

1.1 Background

Samancor Chrome Ltd's core business is the mining and smelting of chrome ore. With an annual production capacity of 2.4 million tons of ferrochrome, Samancor Chrome is one of the largest integrated ferrochrome producers in the world. The ferrochrome produced is used in areas of the stainless-steel smelting process. Samancor Chrome has been, and continues to be, a major player in ferrochromium production. The company's total chromite resources exceed 900 million tons and are expected to support current mining activity for well over 100 years at the current rate of extraction. Some ores and concentrates are exported, but main allotments are destined for conversion into ferrochrome at the alloy plants.

The Tubatse Ferrochrome (TFC) Smelter was initially built as a three-furnace operation in 1975 as a joint venture between Gencor Ltd and Union Carbide Inc. (USA). In the same year, the Union Carbide Inc. shareholding was taken over by Samancor Chrome, and in 1989, Samancor Chrome acquired the Gencor Ltd shareholding. During the years 1989 – 1990, the plant was expanded to five furnaces with the sixth furnace being built in 1996. The plant is situated in Steelpoort, Limpopo Province and is in close proximity to the Eastern Chrome Mines. The core business of the operation is the production of charge chrome using six Submerged-Arc Furnaces, one metal recovery plant, and a Pellet and Sintering Plant.

1.2 Public Participation Process

Public Participation (PP) is a process that is designed to enable all interested and affected parties (I&APs) to voice their opinion and/or concerns which enables the practitioner to evaluate all aspects of the proposed development, with the objective of improving the project by maximising its benefits while minimising its adverse effects.

The PP Process must adhere to the requirements of Regulations 39 - 42 (GNR 982) as amended. Further, a PP guideline in terms of NEMA was issued by the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment in 2017, of which provisions will also be implemented. A PP Plan was submitted and subsequently accepted by the Department on 18 June 2021 (**Appendix A**).

The PP Process for proposed project will be undertaken according to the stages outlined below as well as the requirements for the stakeholders.

1.3 Purpose of the Report

The key purpose of this PP Summary Report is to:

- Summarise the PP Process undertaken for the Environmental Scoping Report (ESR) and Environmental Impact Report (EIR);
- Highlight what has been done to date;
- Synthesise the issues and concerns identified by I&APs and various stakeholders during the PP Process; and
- Synthesise comments on the proposed development.

1.4 Terms of Reference for Public Participation

The terms of reference for the implementation of a successful and robust PP Process, are as follows:

- Identification of I&APs in the vicinity of the study area;
- Provision to all I&APs of an opportunity to comment or raise concerns regarding the project;
- Maintenance of procedures for communication with I&APs and receiving, documenting and responding to relevant communication from I&APs;
- Identification and elimination of any sources of misunderstandings between the Applicant, EAP and the I&APs;
- Always aim to improve the communication between the Applicant, EAP and I&APs;
- Present the project in an objective way by supplying all appropriate, relevant and accurate information and facts in an unbiased manner to ensure a better understanding of the proposed project; and
- Ensure that the PP Process is an independent and transparent process.

1.5 Public Participation Summary

The PP Process commenced in May 2021 where site notices were erected at strategic locations around the study area, on 05 May 2021. A Background Information Document (BID) was distributed to the I&APs as well as commenting authorities. I&APs were introduced to the project and encouraged to register on the database.

An advertisement was placed in the Steelburger Newspaper on 24 June 2021 followed by a commenting period which provided an opportunity for the I&APs to raise their issues and concerns regarding the proposed project.

The draft Consultation ESR was made available for authority and public review for a 30-day period from 25 June – 26 July 2021.

An advertisement will be placed in the Steelburger on the 4th November 2021 indicating the commenting period for the EIR and for I&APs to raise any issues and concerns regarding the proposed project. The EIR will be made available for comment from 5 November 2021 - 6 December 2021.

A Comments and Response record (Table 1) has been compiled during the Scoping phase, the comments raised during the EIA phase will also be included in this table.

2 Identification of I&APs

The first step in the PP Process entailed the identification of key I&APs and Stakeholders, including:

- Local and provincial government;
- Affected and neighbouring landowners; and



General I&APs.

An I&AP database (**Appendix B**) and Proof of notification (**Appendix C**) has been compiled which will be maintained and updated throughout the duration of the Scoping and EIA study.

3 Site Notices

The NEMA EIA Regulations 2014 (as amended) require that a site notice be fixed at a place conspicuous to the public at the boundary or on the fence of the site where the activity to which the application relates is to be undertaken and on any alternative sites. The purpose of this is to notify the public of the project and to invite the public to register as stakeholders and inform them of the PP Process. Royal HaskoningDHV erected site notices at various noticeable locations around the perimeter of the site and at strategic locations on or near the site (Tubatse Chrome Golf Club, Steelpoort Primary School, Post Office; and proposed Site 3).








Figure 3-1: Tubatse Chrome Golf Club





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


Figure 3-2: Steelpoort Laerskool

4 Background Notification Document

A BID that contained the project brief (**Appendix D**) for the project was compiled in English. The aim of this document was to provide a brief outline of the application and the nature of the development. It is also aimed at providing preliminary details regarding the Scoping and EIA study and explains how I&APs could become involved in the project. The document was distributed to all identified I&APs and stakeholders, together with details of the Public Participation Consultant.

5 Advertisement

In compliance with the EIA Regulations 2014 (as amended):

- Notification of the commencement of the review period for the draft consultation ESR for the project was advertised in one local newspaper, the Steelburger Newspaper on 24 June 2021 in English.
- Notification of the commencement of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) public review period for the project will be advertised in one local newspaper, the Steelburger Newspaper on 4 November 2021 in English.

Proof of these adverts are provided in Appendix E.

I&APs were requested to register their interest in the project and become involved in the study. The primary aim of advertisements is to ensure that the widest group of I&APs possible are informed and invited to



provide input and questions and comments on the project. I&APs were also be notified of the availability of the draft EIR for review and comment.

Dear Sirs/Mams

The rising electricity tariffs in South Africa, combined with the load shedding patterns experienced across the country, has a negative impact on the production and revenue of the Samancor business. This has motivated Samancor to consider renewable energy generation at their smelter plants. Implementing solar PV generation will result in improved availability of supply and reduced utility bills, especially since a major portion of the Samancor product is being exported. A PV plant converts the solar radiation into electric energy by using photovoltaic solar arrays. The name plate rating of the plant will be a minimum of 60 MWp, which will be spread over several sites surrounding the Tubatse Ferrochrome mining operations.

Each of the PV plants will consist of the following infrastructure:

- Solar PV panels that will be able to deliver up to 60MWp to the Samancor grid;
- Inverters that convert direct current (DC) generated by the PV modules into alternating current (AC) to be exported to the electrical grid;
- Transformer /s that raises the system AC low voltage to medium voltage. The transformer converts
 the voltage of the electricity generated by the PV panels to the correct voltage for delivery to Eskom;
- Transformer substation; and
- Instrumentation and Control consisting of hardware and software for remote plant monitoring and operation of the facility.

Associated infrastructure includes:

- Mounting structures for the solar panels in a fixed tilt of rotating tracking configuration;
- Cabling between the structures, to be lain underground where practical;





- New 33kV overhead powerlines between the various sites and the Tubatse East and -West substation buildings;
- Local substation and transformer yard at each PV site;
- Containerized switchgear substation at Tubatse East and -West MV substations for connecting to the Tubatse substation busbars;
- Water provision infrastructure (i.e. pipeline/ s, storage tank/ s, etc.) for PV panel cleaning;
- Battery Energy Storage System (BESS); and
- Internal access roads (4 6m wide roads will be constructed, but existing roads will be used as far as possible), fencing (approximately 3m in height), gates and access control.

As per Government Gazette 43412 GN R. 650 Disaster Management Act (57/2002): Directions Regarding Measures to Address, Prevent and Combat the Spread of COVID-19 Relating to National Environmental Management Permits and Licences: Annexure 2 and 3 published on 5 June 2020, the DFFE requires a Public Participation (PP) Plan to be approved for an application for Environmental Authorisation that requires public participation.

PP is a process that is designed to enable all Interested and Affected parties (I&APs) to voice their opinion and/or concerns which enables the practitioner to evaluate all aspects of the proposed development, with the objective of improving the project by maximising its benefits while minimising its adverse effects.

I&APs include all interested stakeholders, technical specialists, and the various relevant organs of state who work together to produce better decisions.

The primary aims of the PP process are:

Samancor Chrome Ltd (Samancor) is proposing the development of a 60 Megawatt peak (MWp) Photovoltaic (PV) Plant over 5 potential sites adjacent to the Tubatse Ferrochrome (TFC) Smelter in Steelpoort, Fetakgomo Tubatse Local Municipality.

A PV plant converts the solar radiation into electric energy by using photovoltaic solar arrays. The name plate rating of the plant will be a minimum of 60 MWp, which will be spread over several sites surrounding the Tubatse Ferrochrome mining operations.

The main components of a PV plant include the following:

- Development of a PV plant over the selected potential sites including mounting structures, inverters, on-site transformers and substations, instrumentation and control;
- New 33kV overhead powerlines (within 50m assessment corridor) between the various sites linking up to either the Tubatse East and -West substations;
- Battery Energy Storage System either lead-acid or lithium-ion; and





 Ancillary infrastructure such as construction laydown area/ s, water pipelines and storage tanks, internal access roads, fencing, gates and access control.










Figure 1: Locality map




