PROJECT TITLE

Proposed Incinerator Replacement, Queenstown, Eastern Cape.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The existing incinerator is used for incinerating waste at the Queenstown Veterinary Laboratory but it is more than 30 years old and as a result has become unserviceable. The main core of the existing incinerator is melting away and needs to be replaced. Some of the main objectives of the proposed incinerator upgrade are to ensure that the facility complies with the relevant air quality standards.

The Queenstown Veterinary Laboratory generates organic waste, general office waste, e.g. paper, glass and medicines during the conduct of diagnostic and analytical testing of specimen of animal origin. Waste which includes animal carcasses and tissue samples are disposed of through incineration. Animal carcasses from private veterinary practices are also brought for incineration. The incineration process is carried out by placing the material in the incinerator, adding diesel and igniting the diesel using an electrical burner. There are two 2,000 liter diesel tanks with low bund walls adjacent to the incinerator. Incineration is usually conducted once or more times a week depending on the accumulated volume of material for disposal. The resulting ash is placed in containers and will be collected and disposed of via a contractor (e.g. Compass Medical Waste Services) or taken to a suitable waste landfill facility. All other medical wastes, such as petri dishes and sharps, are also collected and disposed of by an approved service provider.
