

To be included in the Environmental Management Plan once the Basic Assessment Report has been completed:

No-go Areas

Objectives: To minimize any potential impacts to sensitive areas from general construction activities.

Targets: To establish adequate demarcation to protect sensitive aspects like the Kramat on and around the site.

Measures:

- Sensitive areas must be demarcated in conjunction with the ECO prior to any work starting on site.
- In this case the sensitive areas will include the Kramat which is extremely sensitive in terms of heritage aspects.
- The Kramat needs to be temporarily fenced off with a minimum of 5m clearance from the Kramat to all sides of the fence. A gate should be included in the fence that visitors to the Kramat can use.
- The Kramat is regarded as a sacred space and should be respected as such by construction crew. No access to the Kramat area is permissible by construction crew.
- Method statements should be submitted and approved where risks to the “No-Go “ areas may occur
- Authorisation from the Principal Agent must only be given once the potential impacts have been assessed by the ECO.
- Any construction activities taking place prior to the above will constitute a serious violation of this EMPr and are liable to a fine as detailed within this EMPr.
- The EMPr must incorporate inter alia specifications to address the above issues, as well as make recommendations about site office, worker, stockpile, refueling and other aspects - none of these may be located where they might result in damage to the Kramat or any other heritage sensitive areas.

Other measures included in the EMPr would include:

- Ensure that the necessary permits regarding any activities related to construction activities are in place prior to construction starting.
- Ensure that site boundaries are agreed to by the ECO, Principal Agent and Contractor prior to the start of the site operations.
- Ensure that all staff working on site are adequately trained on the requirements of this EMPr and are legally compliant with relevant legislation.
- To designate areas on site for various types of construction related activities.
- To designate working hours for construction related activities.
- To comply with the recommendations of the heritage specialist.
- To prevent or minimise any negative visual impacts on the site and surrounding area due to construction works.
