BASIC ASSESSMENT PROCESS FOR THE SEWERAGE CONNECTION AND STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE FOR THE WEST END OFFICE PARK IN CENTURION, GAUTENG

Abland (Pty) Ltd as the project proponent has appointed Strategic Environmental Focus (Pty) Ltd to facilitate the Basic Assessment (BA) process to obtain an environmental authorisation for the proposed sewerage connection pipeline and stormwater infrastructure for the West End office park. The sewerage pipeline will service the West End office park that is currently under construction. The connection will be made to the existing municipal sewerage pipeline to join the municipal sewer stream. The stormwater infrastructure to be installed includes the stormwater pipeline and outlet structures which will be constructed perpendicular to the Hennops River. Subsequent to the construction and installation of the proposed infrastructure, rehabilitation of the affected Hennops River banks will be undertaken. The proposed project is located on Holdings 231 and 232, Lyttelton Agricultural Holdings, Extension 1 in Centurion, City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality, Gauteng Province

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In terms of Government Notice No. 544 (Listing Notice No. 1) and Government Notice No. 546 (Listing Notice No. 2) of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) [NEMA] the following listed activities are triggered and therefore require an Environmental Authorisation from the Gauteng Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (GDARD) for the proposed project by way of a BA process:

In terms of Section 21 (c) and (i) of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act No. 36 of 1998) the proposed services and subsequent rehabilitation of the river banks at the West End office Park requires the application of the Water Use License (WUL) which will be administered by the Department of Water Affairs (DWA).

A BA is being conducted to ensure that the environmental impacts that may be associated with the proposed project are taken into consideration. Interested and affected parties (I&APs) have an opportunity to comment on the Draft Basic Assessment Report (BAR) by providing issues of concern and/or suggestions for enhanced benefits and/or alternatives and to ensure that the GDARD has sufficient information to make a decision
