SECTION B: DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED ACTIVITY

The Gustav Klingbiel Nature Reserve, Lydenburg, comprises an area of ±2200 hectares, located to the east of and adjoining the eastern boundary of The Heads development, with the R37 forming the southern boundary, Lydenburg. The application site for assessment purposes, consists of an area of approximately 25 hectares in extent and comprises of a small area of the Nature Reserve, located immediately to the east of adjoining the eastern boundary of The Heads development, with the R37 forming the southern boundary, Lydenburg. The area for development purposes comprises an area of 7.4 ha Refer Appendix B: Locality Plan. The site includes the Lydenburg Museum, which is located in the south eastern corner of the site, adjoining the R37 route.

In a joint agreement with the Thaba Chweu Council, (which is the owner of the land) the applicant intends to develop a small part of the application site for the purposes of tourism related facilities, which will include the (upgraded and rehabilitated) museum and related facilities, hotel including spa, conference facilities, bar, restaurants, sports and recreation facilities, tourism related accommodation (self catering lodges), caravan park and related facilities and picnic areas. Development of these facilities will be limited primarily to the area around the existing museum and adjoining the R37 road. Access to the site will be via the existing entrance to the Lydenburg Museum.
