#### APPLICATION FOR PERMIT: BURIAL GROUNDS AND GRAVES

Please note: Permit Applications expire one year after the date of receipt.

In terms of Section 36 (3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999) no person may, without a permit issued by the relevant heritage resources authority:

(a) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb the grave of a victim of conflict, or any burial ground or part thereof which contains such graves;

(b) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb any grave or burial ground older than 60 years which is situated outside a formal cemetery administered by a local authority; or

(c) bring onto or use at a burial ground or grave referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) any excavation equipment, or any equipment which assists in the detection or recovery of metals.

Other application forms are available for archaeological and palaeontological material and sites (302), for shipwrecks (303), for the export or sale of heritage objects including archaeological and palaeontological material, material from shipwrecks and meteorites (304), for the built environment and landscape (307) or the registration of private collections (402).

The burial site is located at GaMushung Village near Bopedi Complex in Fetakgomo Local Municipality, Limpopo Province. The remains were stabilized in situ while arrangements for rescue are underway (See letter from police).

One Burial site was accidentally disturbed by Apel Nkaona Mashung Electrification powerline construction work at GaMashung Village. Work was suspended at the affected site and the site was barricaded in accordance with the relevant heritage legislation and Management plan for the powerline development.

### 10. Brief description:

Figure 1 and 2.View of the affected powerline pole position and burial site that was accidental discovered.

Figure 1, 2 and 3-View of exposed remains along powerline servitude and construction workers showing the position of the affected grave.











Remains of a solitary human burial site were accidentally exposed during excavation for powerline pole installation for Apel, Nkaona and Mashung electrification project in Fetakgomo Local Municipality in Limpopo. Construction work was suspended following the discovery and the gravesite was condoned off. Eskom management commissioned Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions (Heritage specialists) to verify the accidental discovery and to proceed to apply for reburial permits in order to relocate the grave from the direct path of current construction work to a safer place. This accidental discovery of human burial prompted the necessity of applying section 36(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act 25 of 1999.

The accidental discovery was reported to Apel SAPS and the police attended the scene. Public consultations were initiated in an attempt to identify the possible custodians of the affected grave. The Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions team and Apel SAPS consulted the local Councillor Mabuta Mpelasenta (0828202102) and Captain Selala (0824142474) of SAPS Apel who worked in the area for more than a decade. The two acknowledged that the local Traditional leadership is entangled in a leadership wrangle. As such none of the disputing functions has the authority to preside over traditional matters. The local councillor resolved to take the matter up with Fetakgomo Local Municipality to authorise the reburial in the absence of an active Traditional Authority. The councillor agreed to have the remains relocated to the local cemetery at GaNkuona.

SAPS Apel announced the discovery to the community but no claims were made. The Local community through the CLO and councillor declared that the remains were unknown. They belong to archaeological era beyond their memory. Apel SAPS cleared the site of any crime in their records and they recommended that the remains be reburied as matter of urgency to avoid further disturbance of remains. The local councillor suggested that the remains be relocated far from the newly established residential area. He also said according to Pedi Tradition human remains are not supposed to be exposed and left bare especially during the rain season. He requested the relocation team to speed up the relocation process. The developer resolved that the human burial be rescued and be reburied urgently because it is located far away from households are at risk of being tempered with in the absence of any security measures. The grave is adversely affected by the development by virtue of it being on the direct path of ongoing powerline development and it cannot be left in situ. It is based on that decision that this application is being


submitted to facilitate the rescue and reburial of the affected human burial. The remains will be re-interred immediately upon receiving the rescue permit from SAHRA.

The costs of this exercise are included in the professional services being provided by Mafu's Funeral Home and Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions (see attached contract). This includes cost of reburial of final reburial of the human remains. Nzumbululo in collaboration with Mafu's Funeral Home has obtained permission for the remains to be re-interred in the local cemetery at Ga NkuanaVillage. Mafu's Funeral Home is the approved undertaker service provider and will be managed by Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions to conduct the reburial work.

This is an urgent Rescue Permit application given the observation that the burial has already been partially disturbed. It is this partial disturbance that led to the accidentally discovery of the burial within the footprint of powerline development. Site management and construction workers are concerned that the exposed human burials may cause instability at the construction site given the fact that the local community's cultural practices do not allow human burials to be exposed for any long time without urgent reburials. As such the Eskom Distribution Limpopo Management urgently need the burial to be relocated without any further incidents. With the necessary arrangements having been agreed upon with the developer and councillor acting on behalf of the municipality to exhume and relocate the disturbed remains, we request that the SAHRA BG&G Unit process this urgent application to enable the immediate re-interment of the remains. Should there be any other information that the Agency may require in this regard, Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions will be obliged to make the necessary submissions

Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions assisted by Mafu Funerals will conduct the exhumation and reburial. A qualified archaeologist from Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions will manage and supervise the whole exhumation process. He will also undertake and complete the reporting process thereof.

18. Please give details of consultation with communities and individuals who by tradition has an interest in the grave(s), and of the agreement reached with such communities and individuals (as required by Act 36 and the relevant Regulations Chps IX and XI) (provide documentation and details):

Consultations were conducted at GaNkoana, Apel, Mashungu and GaNchabeleng Villages. The consultation conducted by Nzumbululo Heritage Solutions in collaboration with Apel SAPS and the local councilor revealed that the remains in question are unknown. The form of the burial and grave goods such as potsherds scattered around the site in question confirm with archaeological graves. As such the heritage team concluded that the burial is an archaeological grave. The community has no knowledge of the burial and no one claimed the grave. Eskom management was also consulted to grant permission for the relocation

of the exposed burial. The process was deemed sufficient for the urgent relocation and reburial of the eight adversely affected graves - a mitigation measure to rescue the grave from further disturbance from current power line developments. (See attached letters)
