Hammarsdale**

Exhumation of the grave of Eric Gardiner

Please note that the 30 day public response period as per the advertisements run in the Natal Mercury and the Highway Mail has been complied with. Copies of the advertisements have been loaded to the case file and ran respectively from 08 and 13 November 2013 for four consecutive weeks.

No response was received from the public notices.

A testimony from the previous farm owners with regard to the grave has been loaded to the case file.

On behalf of the developers, Keystone Park c.c. we consequently request Amafa's authorisation to facilitate the requested exhumation with due regard to the requirements and stipulations of the Cemeteries and crematoria Act No.12 of 1996 (via COGTA and Durban Metro) and the Regulations (R.363) of May 2013 of the National Health Act No.61 of 2003.

Archaeological sites

As per the HIA report of the Farm Bartlett undertaken by eThembeni in 2007 two indeterminate Late Iron Age / Historical sites were reported. Due to the paucity of visible material, and that the locations of the material remains had been subject to decades of severe environmental disturbance, including ploughing, road and power line servitudes and sand winning operations, eThembeni ascribed a low significance rating to the remains.

Keystone Park c.c. have applied for destruction permits for these sites as required in terms of the Regulations of the KwaZulu-Natal Heritage Act No.4 of 2008. These permit applications are loaded to the case file.

Please could Amafa provide a response to the client with regard to the Phase 1 HIA report for the proposed Keystone Park Light Industrial, Warehousing and Logistics Precinct, Hammarsdale, submitted via SAHRIS on 13 November 2013.
