PP is an important aspect in the BA process as it gives RI&APs a platform to be informed about potential EA that may have an effect on them and to be afforded an opportunity to engage and provide input on matters that they interested in or affected by.

Effective PP also facilitates informed decision-making by the CA and may result in better decisions as the views of all parties are considered.
