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## 1. INTRODUCTION

The Applicant, Assmang Ltd – Manganese Black Rock Mine Operations, is making an Application for Environmental Authorisation for the construction of Technical Training College, Kuruman in the Northern Cape Province, in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, Act No. 107 of 1998 (as amended) (NEMA) and the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations 2010. This Application for Environmental Authorisation is being made to the Competent Authority (CA), namely, the Northern Cape Province: Department of Environment & Nature Conservation and is required since the proposed development triggers activities which are listed in terms of the NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations 2010.

The Public Participation Process undertaken shall ensure compliance with regard to the requirements in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) [as amended] and the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (2010).

The purpose of this report is to provide the Department with an overview of the Public Participation and consultation undertaken to date for the above-mentioned project. This report includes the following:

- A) Tasks undertaken for the Public Participation Process;
- B) Proof of consultation with stakeholders and Interested and Affected parties; and
- C) Comments and responses.

## 2. REGULATIONS FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

### **Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (2010)**

Guideline 7 on “*Public Participation in the Environmental Impact Assessment Process*” published by the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) in October 2012, states that public participation is one of the most important aspects of the environmental authorisation process. This stems from the requirement that people have a right to be informed about potential decisions that may affect them and that they must be afforded an opportunity to influence those decisions. Effective public participation also facilitates informed decision-making by the Competent Authority and may result in better decisions as the views of all parties are considered.

The benefits of public participation include the following:

- *Provides an opportunity for Interested and Affected parties (I&APs), Environmental Assessment Practitioners (EAPs) and the Competent Authority (CA) to obtain clear, accurate and understandable information about the environmental impacts of the proposed activity or implications of a decision;*
- *Provides I&APs with an opportunity to voice their support, concerns and questions regarding the project, application or decision;*
- *Provides I&APs with the opportunity of suggesting ways of reducing or mitigating negative impacts of an activity and for enhancing positive impacts;*
- *Enables the applicant to incorporate the needs, preferences and values of affected parties into the application;*
- *Provides opportunities for clearing up misunderstandings about technical issues, resolving disputes and reconciling conflicting interests;*
- *It is an important aspect of securing transparency and accountability in decision-making; and*

- *Contributes toward maintaining a healthy, vibrant democracy.*

*A Public Participation Process (PPP) is a requirement in terms of Regulations 54 – 57 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (2010) of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) and it forms an integral part of any EIA process.*

54. (1) *This regulation only applies in instances where adherence to the provisions of this regulation is specifically required.*
- (2) *The person conducting a public participation process must take into account any guidelines applicable to public participation as contemplated in section 24J of the Act and must give notice to all potential interested and affected parties of the application which is subjected to public participation by-*
- (a) *fixing a notice board at a place conspicuous to the public at the boundary or on the fence of:*  
*(i) the site where the activity to which the application relates is or is to be undertaken; and*  
*(ii) any alternative site mentioned in the application;*
- (b) *giving written notice to -*  
*(i) the owner or person in control of that land if the applicant is not the owner or person in control of the land;*  
*(ii) the occupiers of the site where the activity is or is to be undertaken or to any alternative site where the activity is to be undertaken;*  
*(iii) owners and occupiers of land adjacent to the site where the activity is or is to be undertaken or to any alternative site where the activity is to be undertaken;*  
*(iv) the municipal councillor of the ward in which the site or alternative site is situated and any organisation of ratepayers that represent the community in the area;*  
*(v) the municipality which has jurisdiction in the area;*  
*(vi) any organ of state having jurisdiction in respect of any aspect of the activity; and*  
*(vii) any other party as required by the competent authority;*
- (c) *placing an advertisement in –*  
*(i) one local newspaper; or*  
*(ii) any official Gazette that is published specifically for the purpose of providing public notice of applications or other submissions made in terms of these Regulations;*
- (d) *placing an advertisement in at least one provincial newspaper or national newspaper, if the activity has or may have an impact that extends beyond the boundaries of the metropolitan or local municipality in which it is or will be undertaken: Provided that this paragraph need not be complied with if an advertisement has been placed in an official Gazette referred to in sub regulation (c)(ii); and*
- (e) *using reasonable alternative methods, as agreed to by the competent authority, in those instances where a person is desiring to but unable to participate in the process due to*  
*(i) illiteracy;*

*(ii) disability;*  
*(iii) or any other disadvantage.*

- (3) A notice, notice board or advertisement referred to in sub regulation (2) must*
- (a) give details of the application which is subjected to public participation; and*
- (b) state-*
- (i) that the application has been submitted to the competent authority in terms of these Regulations, as the case may be;*
  - (ii) whether basic assessment or scoping procedures are being applied to the application, in the case of an application for environmental authorisation;*
  - (iii) the nature and location of the activity to which the application relates;*
  - (iv) where further information on the application or activity can be obtained; and*
  - (vi) the manner in which and the person to whom representations in respect of the application may be made.*
- (4) A notice board referred to in sub regulation (2) must-*
- (a) be of a size at least 60cm by 42cm; and*
- (b) display the required information in lettering and in a format as may be determined by the competent authority.*
- (5) Where deviation from sub regulation (2) may be appropriate, the person conducting the public participation process may deviate from the requirements of that sub regulation to the extent and in the manner as may be agreed to by the competent authority.*
- (6) Where a basic assessment report, scoping report or environmental impact assessment report as contemplated in regulations 22, 28 and 31 respectively is amended because it has been rejected or because of a request for additional information by the competent authority, and such amended report contains new information, the amended basic assessment report, scoping report or environmental impact assessment report must be subjected to the processes contemplated in regulations 21, 27 and 31, as the case may be, on the understanding that the application form need not be resubmitted.*
- (7) When complying with this regulation, the person conducting, the public participation process must ensure that-*
- (a) information containing all relevant facts in respect of the application is made available to potential interested and affected parties; and*
- (b) participation by potential interested and affected parties is facilitated in such a manner that all potential interested and affected parties are provided with a reasonable opportunity to comment on the application.*

- (8) *Unless justified by exceptional circumstances, as agreed to by the competent authority, the applicant and EAP managing the environmental assessment process must refrain from conducting any public participation process during the period of 15 December to 2 January.*

*Register of interested and affected parties*

55. (1) *An EAP managing an application must open and maintain a register which contains the names, contact details and addresses of –*
- (a) *all persons who, as a consequence of the public participation process conducted in respect of that application in terms of regulation 54, have submitted written comments or attended meetings with the applicant or EAP;*
- (b) *all persons who, after completion of the public participation process referred to in paragraph (a), have requested the applicant or the EAP managing the application, in writing, for their names to be placed on the register; and*
- (c) *all organs of state which have jurisdiction in respect of the activity to which the application relates.*
- (2) *An EAP managing an application must give access to the register to any person who submits a request for access to the register in writing.*

*Registered interested and affected parties entitled to comment on submissions*

56. (1) *A registered interested and affected party is entitled to comment, in writing, on all written submissions, including draft reports made to the competent authority by the applicant or the EAP managing an application, and to bring to the attention of the competent authority any issues which that party believes may be of significance to the consideration of the application, provided that-*
- (a) *comments are submitted within-*
- (i) *the timeframes that have been approved or set by the competent authority; or*
- (ii) *any extension of a timeframe agreed to by the applicant or EAP;*
- (b) *a copy of comments submitted directly to the competent authority is served on the EAP; and*
- (c) *the interested and affected party discloses any direct business, financial, personal or other interest which that party may have in the approval or refusal of the application.*
- (2) *Before the EAP managing an application for environmental authorisation submits a final report compiled in terms of these Regulations to the competent authority, the EAP must give registered interested and affected parties access to, and an opportunity to comment on the report in writing.*
- (3) *The report referred to in sub regulation (2) include-*
- (a) *basic assessment reports;*
- (b) *basic assessment reports amended and resubmitted in terms of regulation 24 (4);*
- (c) *scoping reports;*

- (d) *scoping reports amended and resubmitted in terms of regulation 30(3);*
  - (e) *specialist reports and reports on specialised processes compiled in terms of regulation 32;*
  - (f) *environmental impact assessment reports submitted in terms of regulation 31;*
  - (g) *environmental impact assessment reports amended and resubmitted in terms of regulation 34(4); and*
  - (h) *draft environmental management programmes compiled in terms of regulation 33.*
- (4) *The draft versions of reports referred to in sub regulation (3) must be submitted to the competent authority prior to awarding registered interested and affected parties an opportunity to comment.*
  - (5) *Registered interested and affected parties must submit comments on draft reports contemplated in sub regulation (4) to the EAP, who should record it in accordance with regulations 21, 28 or 31.*
  - (6) *Registered interested and affected parties must submit comments on final reports contemplated in sub regulation (3) to the competent authority and provide a copy of such comments to the applicant or EAP.*
  - (7) *The competent authority must, in order to give effect to section 240 of the Act, on receipt of the draft reports contemplated in sub regulation (5), request any State department that administers a law relating to a matter affecting the environment to comment within 40 days.*
  - (8) *The timeframe of 40 days as contemplated in sub regulation (7) must be read as 60 days in the case of waste management activities as contemplated in the National Environmental Management: Waste Act, 2008 (Act No. 59 of 2008), on which the Department of Water Affairs must concur and issue a record of decision in terms of section 49(2) of the National Environmental Management: Waste Management Act, 2008 (Act No. 59 of 2008).*
  - (9)(a) *When a State department is requested by the competent authority to comment, such State department must, within 40 days or in the case of Department of Water Affairs, 60 days for waste management activities, of being requested to comment by the competent authority, provide comments to the competent authority.*
  - (b) *If a State department fails to submit comments within 40, or 60 days for waste management activities, from the date on which the Minister, MEC, Minister of Mineral Resources or identified competent authority requests such State department in writing to submit comment, it will be regarded that there are no comments.*

*Comments of interested and affected parties to be recorded in reports submitted to competent authority*

57. (1) *The EAP managing an application for environmental authorisation must ensure that the comments of interested and affected parties are recorded in reports and that such written comments, including records of meetings, are attached to the report, submitted to the competent authority in terms of these Regulations.*

- (2) *Where a person is desiring but unable to access written comments as contemplated in sub regulation (1) due to-*
- (i) a lack of skills to read or write;*
  - (ii) disability; or*
  - (iii) any other disadvantage,*
- reasonable alternative methods of recording comments must be provided for.*

### **3. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS FOLLOWED TO DATE**

This section of the report provides an overview of the tasks undertaken for the PPP to date. All PPP undertaken is in accordance with the requirements of the EIA Regulations (2010). It further provides an outline of the next steps in the PPP and makes recommendations for tasks to be undertaken during the Final Basic Assessment phase of the environmental authorisation process.

The PPP tasks conducted for the proposed new plant development project to date includes:

#### **1. IDENTIFICATION OF KEY INTERESTED AND AFFECTED PARTIES (AFFECTED AND ADJACENT LANDOWNERS) AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS (ORGANS OF STATE AND OTHER PARTIES)**

Public Participation is the involvement of all parties who are either potentially interested and or affected by the proposed development. The principle objective of public participation is to inform and enrich decision-making. This is also its key role in this Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process.

Interested and Affected parties (I&APs) representing the following sectors of society has been identified:

- National, provincial and local government;
- Agriculture, including local landowners (affected and adjacent);
- Community Based Organisations;
- Non-Governmental Organisations;
- Water bodies;
- Tourism;
- Industry and mining;
- Commerce; and
- Other stakeholders.

In addition copies were placed at the following libraries: Kuruman Library, School Street – 053 712 9396; the Oasis Library, Kwartel Street Wrenchville – 053 712 9359. 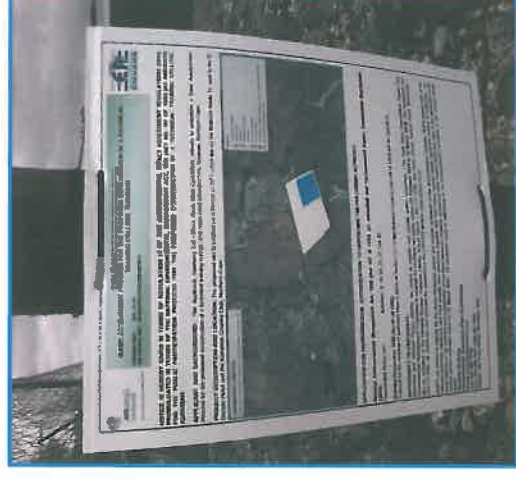

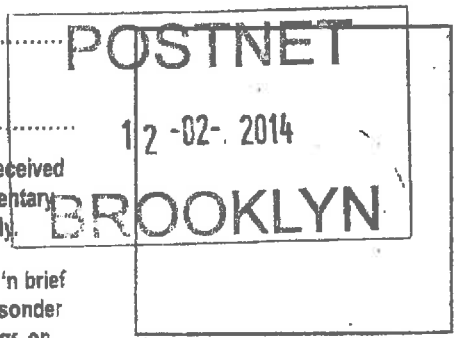

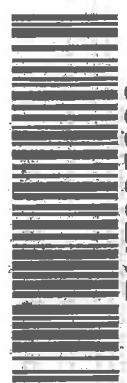

## 1. DEPARTMENTAL MANDATE

- 1.1 The Directorate: Forestry Management (Other Regions) in the Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF) is mainly concerned about the potential impact on protected tree species. See the National Forests Act, Act 84 of 1998 (NFA) as amended, section 12(1)(d) read with s15(1) and s62(2)(c). The list of protected tree species was published in GN 877 of 22 November 2013. **No protected tree may be cut, removed, damaged, disturbed or destroyed without a valid Forest Act License, irrespective of authorizations and approvals in terms of other applicable legislation. Environmental approvals in terms of other legislation do not exempt the developer from complying with the NFA. Non-compliance is a criminal offence and may result in a fine or imprisonment or both.**
- 1.2 The DAFF is also responsible for the administration of the National Veld and Forest Fires Act, Act 101 of 1998 (NVFFA) as amended. Please take note of roles and responsibilities in terms of the NVFFA.

## 2. COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT BASIC ASSESSMENT REPORT (DBAR)

- 2.1 The Executive summary confirmed the presence of NFA protected tree species on site, but no indication was given of the quantities involved. Kindly note that all possible efforts should be made to design infrastructure around trees and to incorporate existing protected trees present on site into the design.

- 2.2 The Executive summary stated that a permit for removal or destruction of protected trees will be applied for with the Department of Water Affairs and Forestry (DWAF). Kindly note it should read: Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF) as rightly indicated on page 8 of the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR).
- 2.3 Page 14 of the DBAR refers to dominant plant species encountered on site. Kindly note the correct spelling of scientific names of plants: *Acacia hearnoxylon* should read *Acacia haematoxylon*; *Acacia karoo* should read *Acacia karroo*; *Searsia lancea* should read *Searsia lancea*, to name but a few of the spelling errors made on this page as well as in the Ecological Assessment.

### 3. COMMENTS ON ECOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT (ANNEXURE D)

- 3.1 Page 34 onwards listed plant species likely to occur in the grid and their conservation status. Some of the species listed are protected in terms of the Northern Cape Nature Conservation Act, Act 9 of 2009 (NCNCA), but its protected status was not indicated. For example, *Nerine laticoma* is listed as 'protected', yet its status on page 61 is listed as 'least concern' to name but one example.
- 3.2 Page 79 refers to the consumptive economic value of *Acacia erioloba* and stated that at present harvesting of wood for fuel is illegal in South Africa. This statement is not 100% correct, as the DAFF issue licenses for commercial harvesting of firewood but regulate quantities.
- 3.3 Table 6 on page 84 list the possible impacts and stated next to the construction phase the following impact: "Total removal of vegetation and elimination of species which falls within the proposed site." The DAFF cannot agree with this and would like to suggest that it be amended to read as follows: "...removal of vegetation and ... which falls within the development footprint." The reason being that the site assessed is said to be 15 ha of which the footprint is only about 3 ha. In addition, it might even be possible to retain trees in the development footprint by careful design. Trees can easily be incorporated in the parking areas and between buildings.

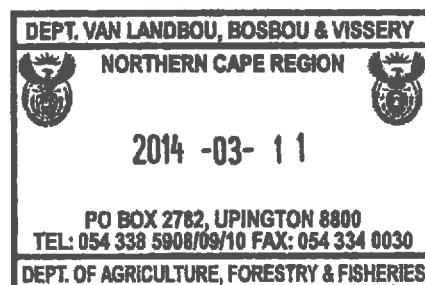
### 4. COMMENTS ON APPENDIX F: ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

## **SECTION 2:** Comments on the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR)

**2.1** The Executive summary confirms the presence of NFA protected tree species on site, but no indication was given of the quantities involved. Kindly note that all possible efforts should be made to design infrastructure around trees and to incorporate existing protected trees present on site into the design.

**Response:** A total of **29** protected tree species were counted at the proposed site compromise of 17 (seventeen) *Acacia erioloba* (Camel thorn tree) and 12 (twelve) *Acacia haematoxylon* (Grey Camel thorn tree). It is further acknowledge that the tree coordinates were sent to Architecture group responsible for construction and are in discussion on how to design the infrastructure buildings to accommodate the protected trees found in site (i.e. create a landscape where possible).

**2.2.** The Executive summary stated that the permit for removal or destruction of protected trees will be applied for with the Department of Water Affairs and Forestry (DWAF). Kindly note it should read: Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF) as rightly indicated on page 8 of the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR).

**Response:** Noted and edited at the manner provided.

**2.3.** Page 14 of the DBAR refers to dominant plant species encountered on site. Kindly note the correct spelling of scientific names of plants: *Acacia heamoxtylon* should read ***Acacia haematoxylon***; *Acacia karoo* should read ***Acacia karroo***; *Searsis lancea* should read ***Searsia lancea***; to name but a few spelling errors made on this page as well as in the Ecological Assessment

**Response:** Noted, the reports would be amended accordingly.

## **SECTION 3.** Comments on Ecological Assessment (Annexure D)

**3.1** Page 34 onwards listed plants species likely to occur in the grid and their conservation status. Some of the plant species listed are protected in terms of the Northern Cape Nature Conservation Act, Act 9 of 2009 (NCNCA), but its protected status was not indicated. For example, *Nerine laticoma* is listed as "protected", yet its status on page 61 is listed as "least concern" to name but one example.

**Response:** Noted. The list of the plant species likely to occur at the surveyed grid would have their status revised using the NCNCA list as previously a Plant of Southern Africa list was used to populate the checklist.

**3.2.** Page 79 refers to consumptive economic value of *Acacia erioloba* and stated that at present harvesting of wood for fuel is illegal in South Africa. This statement is not 100% correct, as the DAFF issue licenses for commercial harvesting of firewood but regulate quantities.

**Response:** Noted. In correct wording, it should have been regulated; the report will be amended accordingly for such mistake. However, it is unlawful to harvest Camel thorn without a permit for commercial use, but does the requirement of the permit extends to the community who probably uses the wood of this plant for their daily livelihood?

**3.3** Table 6 on page 84 list the possible impacts and stated next to the construction phases that the following impact: " Total removal of vegetation and elimination of species which falls within the proposed site." The DAFF cannot agree with this and would like to suggest that it be amended to read as follows: ".....removal of vegetation and....which falls within the development footprint." The reason being that the site assessed is said to be 15ha of which the footprint is only about 3ha. In addition, it might even be possible to retain trees in the development footprint by careful design. Trees can easily be incorporated in the parking areas and between buildings.

**Response:** This is noted and the report will be amended accordingly. I fully agree with you on this regard and the client together with the architects are designing the college infrastructure in a manner that minimum or no destruction will affect the trees.

Thank you for submitting the above report for the proposed development of a technical training college on Erf 1 Kuruman, Northern Cape. In terms of Section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999), any proposed development that requires an application in terms of NEMA or the MPRDA must have an assessment of impacts to heritage resources completed as part of the application process. The relevant heritage authority must determine whether the assessment done in terms of impacts to heritage resources satisfies our requirements and must provide comments or recommendations to the decision-making authority.

It is noted that the first phase of the proposed development will cover 3ha of the 15ha study area. This development will include the construction of single and double story buildings with parking facilities, workshops, recreational areas, administrative areas, a media and computer area, relevant services and infrastructure as well as student accommodation.

It is noted that the area proposed for development is underlain by the Cambell Rand Subgroup, Ghaap Group of the Transvaal Supergroup. This geology is known for its moderate palaeontological significance and therefore more information on the likelihood of this development impacting on palaeontological heritage is required.

The submitted archaeological report did not identify any significant heritage resources that are likely to be impacted by the proposed development. That said, SAHRA has a number of concerns with the submitted report including;

- The limited information provided describing the proposed development
- The lack of site specific or even area specific detail included in the "Archaeological Background" Section
- The incorrect information included in the "Archaeological Background" Section
- Unclear paragraphs in the text and incorrect reference to the National Heritage Resources Act
- Discrepancies between the mapping on SAHRIS, the mapping in the report, the track paths and the area indicated as surveyed in the text
- The lack of explanation for the absence of any stone tool resources at all in an area that is relatively undisturbed near a river in the Northern Cape.

### Interim Comment





SAHRA is unable to provide a Final Comment on this proposed development as insufficient information has been provided to SAHRA. As such, SAHRA requires the following;

- A Desktop Palaeontological Impact Assessment is required to assess the likely impacts of the proposed development on significant palaeontological resources. This report must satisfy SAHRA's minimum requirements for a palaeontological impact assessment and must be submitted to SAHRA for assessment.
- Explanation regarding SAHRA's concerns with the submitted report raised above.

SAHRA will await the submission of the above before commenting further.
