| | BR explained the purpose of meeting which was to introduce the appointed Consultant to the Municipalities and explain the process that led to their appointment which would provide each municipality background and allow them to report back to their various councils. The Licensing of Municipal Landfills was started in 2007 when the government realized that numerous Municipal Landfills across the country were unlicensed. A consultant was appointed to identify illegal dumpsites across the country and gaps were noted when the actual work started some years later as some sites were not identified or incorrectly classified. In total 348 unlicensed landfills were identified which were then licensed in batches Fifty six (56) sites were licensed in 2011-2012 and fifteen (15) were planned for 2013, this number was regarded as too low and thus resulted in a big rollout in 2013-2015.COGTA became involved in | BR Info. | |





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| | the project and DEA assisted with the licensing of 112 landfills and another agency assisted with 80. BR indicated that one of the the shortcomings of this current project is that there will be no funding for infrastructure to develop the landfills. A Department EPIP has been setup to assist in funding of licensed landfills which have had challenges. Only 12 landfills remain unlicensed in the country excluding two sites in North West where challenges were encountered due to a lack of cooperation from landowners. The two (2) sites could not be finalized and these sites have been handed over to the MEC to resolve. Other challenges encountered was that some Municipalities were not interested in the licensing of their landfills in fear of having to comply with the conditions. They then advised that the Municipal Manager refuses to sign application forms. This then resulted and this resulted in project delays. Despite the above, the Licensing projects continued to make progress and continues to | | |

The processes vary with the closure process which is a relatively shorter process than the process required for sites that will be licensed for operation. | | NN welcomed all and requested each stakeholder to introduce themselves for the benefit of everyone present. Apology from the Municipal Manager, Ward Councillor and Mayor communicated by KD. | | |
| 2. | Purpose and Scope of meeting required requirements | | |
| | NN stated that the purpose of the meeting was to introduce the project team and obtain background information on the uMzimkhulu Landfill site. NK provided an overview of DEA's initiative to license landfills across the country. She stated that numerous landfills are unlicensed and that adjacent landowners, specifically farmers, have complained about the state of the landfills. She added that municipalities were initially issued with directives but these did not assist with improving the state of the landfill. For this reason, the Minister of Environmental Affairs decided to take the initiative to assist with the licencing of a large number of landfills in South Africa with the aim that the Licenses would then allow for sourcing of funding for construction, monitoring and other tasks associated with the landfill. NK highlighted the need for Municipalities to understand the principles of recycling and reuse of waste in order to reduce disposal to landfills and provide an indication of the amount of waste produced within their jurisdiction. NK reminded attendees that GA Environment have been directly appointed by the Department of Environmental Affairs and will carry the costs | NN & NK Info. | |

| 3. | - NM mentioned that the uMzimkhulu landfill is unlicensed and only general waste and garden refuse is disposed at the existing landfill. She added that the landfill had been operating for about 10-15 years and that in 2014, the Municipality wanted to close the landfill but there was no budget for this. Between 2010 and 2012, a resolution was taken that the Harry Gwala District Municipality will not have a regional landfill and it is for this reason that the uMzimkhulu Local Municipality decided to obtain a site for a new landfill for which a Waste Management Licence has been granted. NM stated that the uMzimkhulu Local Municipality is sharing the existing landfill with the uBuhlebezwe Local Municipality. - NM added that assessment studies were undertaken in 2016 and the airspace of the landfill was a concern to the municipality. Furthermore, the Municipality has been granted with a Compliance Notice based on the poor operation of the landfill. - KD also mentioned that the Licence for the new landfill proposed for uMzimkhulu has already been issued to the Municipality. The uMzimkhulu Local Municipality had then taken the initiative to address the issues of uncontrolled dumping taking place at the existing landfill while planning for a new landfill which will soon be operational as a Contractor | | |

| | NN and NK outlined GA Environment's scope of work as follows: GA Environment will undertake a Basic Assessment which is a legislated process that will take between 8-12 months to complete. The process will involve the assessment of the site conditions against the proposed activities. GA Environment requires consent and permission to work in the area from the Municipality and local stakeholders. Key Stakeholders who must be involved in the process are the Department of Environmental Affairs, Department of Water and Sanitation, the Local Municipality and the District Municipality. The District Municipality as per the Waste Act, are responsible for the majority of documentation that must govern waste management such as the Integrated Waste Management Plan. This is to avoid the mushrooming of many landfills and encourage recycling and reuse of waste and only the disposal of waste that cannot be reused. GA Environment must consider all options brought forward by the uMzimkhulu municipality in the Waste Management License process in order to provide the Authorities with adequate information to make an informed decision. Good day Mr Ndlovu

I have been struggling to reach you telephonically to inform you of the proposed **Decommissioning of the uMzimkhulu Landfill**. According to the uMzimkhulu Local Municipality, the uBuhlebezwe Local Municipality disposes of their waste at the uMzimkhulu Landfill. It is for this reason that GA Environment is formally notifying you of the proposed project.

I wish to formally introduce myself as Ntsebo Mkhize, an Environmental Assessment Practitioner from GA **Environment.** We have been appointed by the Department of Environmental Affairs to manage the Basic Assessment process for the proposed decommissioning of the uMzimkhulu Landfill. As part of the process and based on Regulation 41 of the National Environmental Management Act 2014 Regulations, as amended, it is a legislative requirement that you are formally informed of the project as an Interested and Affected pary who collects recyclables from the landfill.

The uMzimkhulu landfill occupies an area of approximately 43 000m² (±4 Ha) and is located on Erf 152 uMzimkhulu within the uMzimkhulu Local Municipality located which is part of the Harry Gwala District Municipality. The landfill is approximately 5km west of the uMzimkhulu CBD and direct access to the site can be gained from the surfaced P601 Road to Franklin. The site is located about 500m south of a tributary of the Mvubukazi River and approximately 300m west of Mankofu village. The site centre co-ordinates are 30°15'44.90"S; 29° 54' 17.00"E.

As the uMzimkhulu landfill has been operating without a licence and the uMzimkhulu Local Municipality intends to formally decommission the facility, a Basic Assessment process must be undertaken. The objective of the Basic Assessment processes is to obtain a Waste Management Licence from the Competent Authority, the KwaZulu Natal Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (EDTEA). The process aims to identify and assess potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed licensing of the landfill, as well as identifying any alternatives to the development/activity and to compile appropriate mitigation measures. Please find attached a Notification Letter providing you with additional information on the project.

The telephonic discussion we had last week regarding the closure of the uMzimkhulu Landfill refers. I wish to formally introduce myself as Ntsebo Mkhize, an Environmental Assessment Practitioner from GA **Environment.** We have been appointed by the Department of Environmental Affairs to manage the Basic Assessment process for the proposed **Decommissioning of the uMzimkhulu Landfill.** As part of the process and based on Regulation 41 of the National Environmental Management Act 2014 Regulations, as amended, it is a legislative requirement that you are formally informed of the project as an Interested and Affected pary who collects recyclables from the landfill.
