My concern is the disruption of the water table, and the agitation of the lime sediment. This has already caused a problem with Ross Mine (Shires Quarry) the sediment has been disturbed. To the extent that the geysers at the house have had to have their elements replaced every 6 weeks. And prior to the mining operation the elements lasted between 4 and 5 years. And I have had to install gas heaters to by pass the problem. At my expense. Even though I made the same observation to the previous environmental study done! I did approach Rosmin but they did not offer to help with the installation of the gas systems. They just stated that they were not experiencing any lime build up on their elements! The only other problem is the dust that comes off the dumps, Mr Stott is paraplegic and is permantly at the house.
