


DECOMMISSIONING AND REHABILITATION



Will *typically* entail the following:

- 1. Shaping and landscaping of the waste body;
- 2. The construction of stormwater and leachate management infrastructure;
- 3. Capping of the waste body in accordance with the DWAF Minimum Requirements

for Waste Disposal by landfill;



- 4. Vegetative cover of the final landform;
- 5. The construction of the required end-use infrastructure; and

END USE FOR THE SHAKAVILLE LANDFILL SITE



- Vision of Municipality is a Stadium (Pre- Application Meeting, 20.09.2017)
- DWAF Minimum Requirements for Waste Disposal by landfill (1998) closure objectives:
 - Site to be **environmentally** and **socially** acceptable as well as suited to end use
- Site Suitability for Stadium?
 - To be determined after the conclusion of the BA & WML Processes
 - Liaison with Authorities is imperative as BA, EIA, etc. could be triggered
