1 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Block tries to wriggle free

The Democratic Alliance (DA) notes that fraudster John Block was granted leave to appeal his conviction in the Trifecta-case at the Supreme Court of Appeal.

While the DA respects his right to lodge an appeal, they view this as a desperate attempt to avoid that prison cell waiting for him.

According to Andrew Louw MPL and DA Provincial Leader in the Northern Cape, the DA believes that John Block was found guilty on very serious charges.

He did not accidentally benefit from government deals, but deliberately used his influence and power to score himself some kickbacks. This happened at the cost of service delivery to the poorest of the poor.

"The fact that he is trying to wriggle free from the long arm of the law shows that he is not willing to accept responsibility for his criminal wrongdoing," concluded Mr Louw.

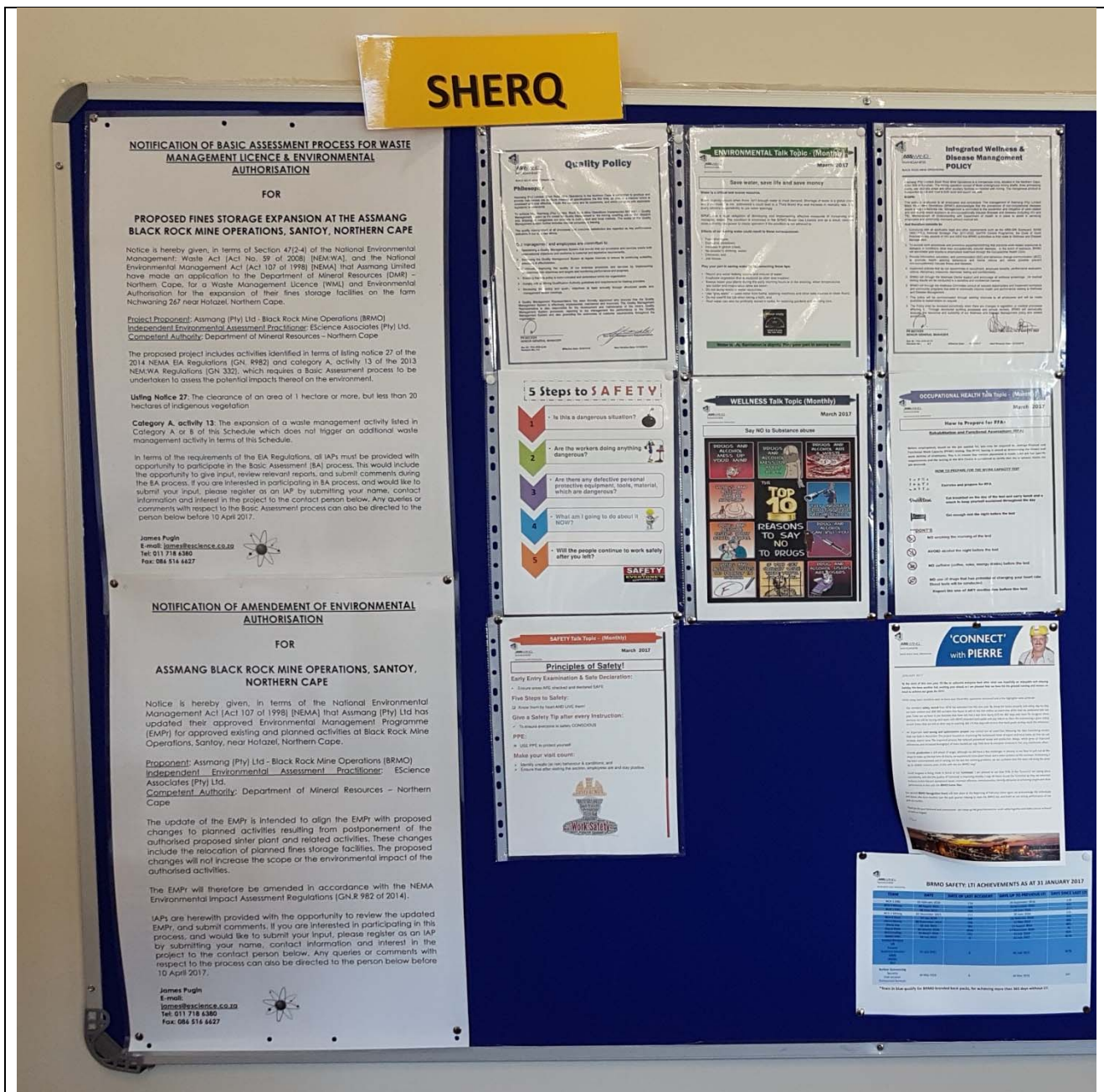


Figure 4: Evidence of Site Notice - BRMO Main Entrance Notice Board

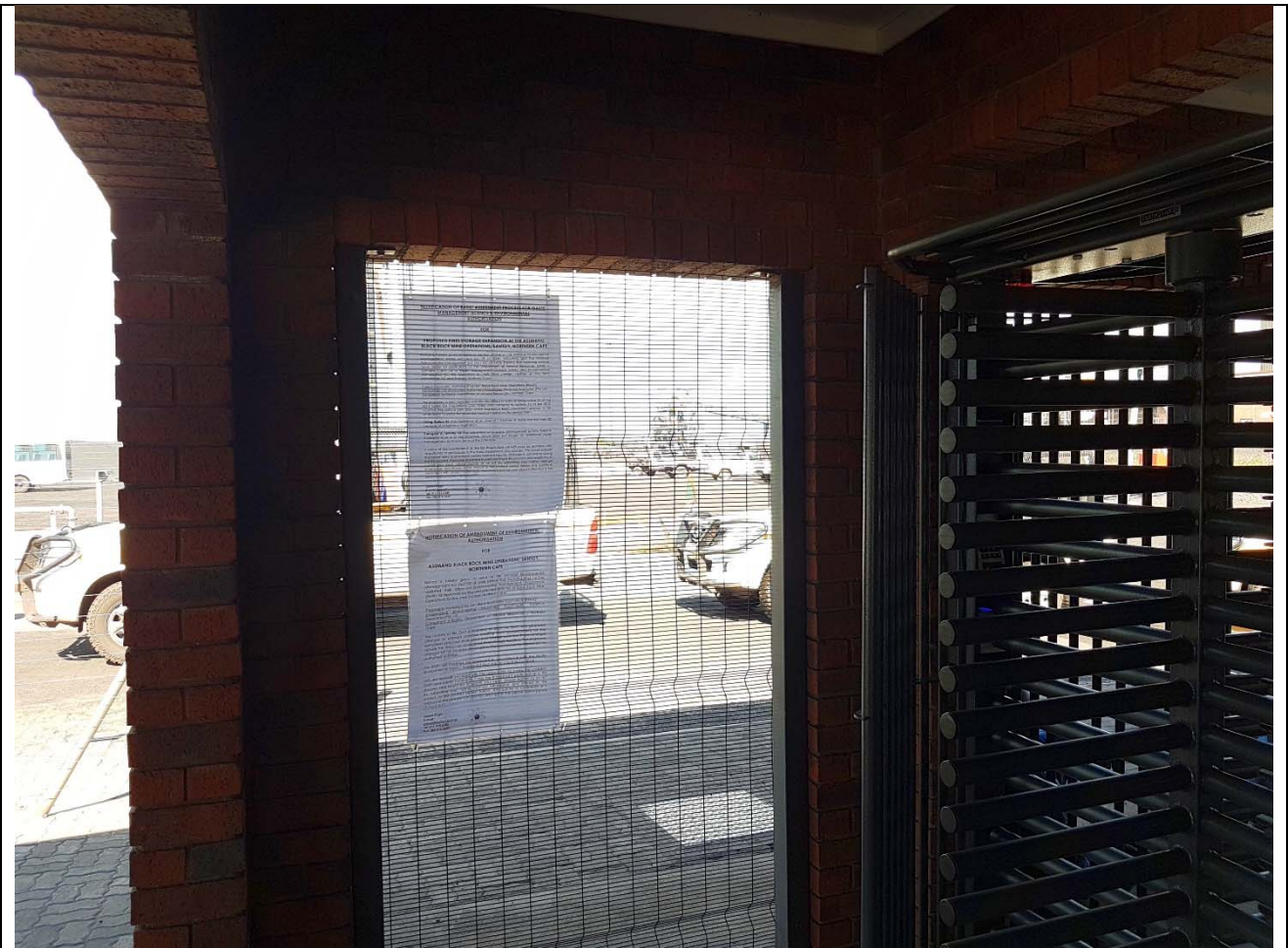


Figure 6: Evidence of Site Notice - Nchawning 2 Main Entrance

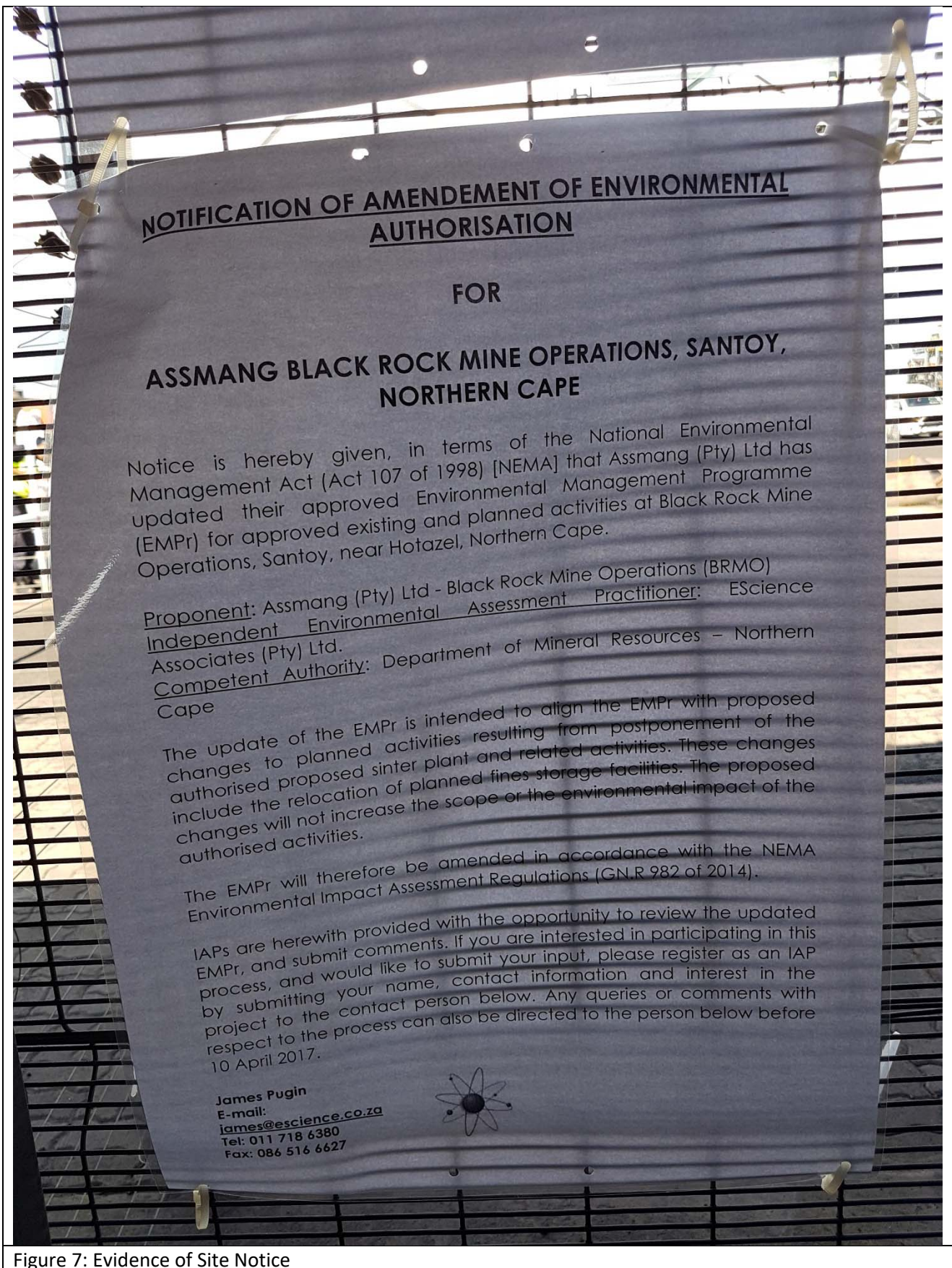


Figure 7: Evidence of Site Notice
