To whom it may concern,

My name is Dr. Dylan McGarry, a senior researcher at the Environmental Learning Research Centre (ELRC) at Rhodes university. I am an educational sociologist, with a speciality in supporting knowledge holders in translation protocols and instruments for expressing their Ocean Intangible Heritage.

I am writing to be included in future correspondence regarding the Teepsa ESIA and to raise my concerns.

I specifically would like further information on how cultural heritage of coastal communities along the coast would experience impacts through the exploration activities planned for Block 11b/12b. Many communities have articulated and clearly laid out the ways in which oil and gas exploration will impact them in the previous court cases against Shell in 2022, and through other outputs. We also created a [summary short film](#) and [radio play](#) which articulates these concerns, with a [summary short film](#) which articulates these concerns and questions. So far from what I see in the documents shared, these concerns are not included.

Also I would like to see the list of participants that will be consulted as cultural knowledge holders. I managed to see the Cultural Impact Assessment for the other TEESPA 5/6/7 of Cape Point, and it only covers some concerns of Khoisan communities, but does not expand on the potential impact on other cultural groups, especially small scale and artisanal fishers, who over the past four years of collaborative research with customary rights holders and other knowledge holders have expressed clear concerns, will these small scale fisher communities and other coastal users be consulted and included in this assessment, these activities and livelihood strategies are not just economic practices but deeply connected to cultural heritage.

Please can you explain how these communities are going to be included in this Block 11/12b assessment?

In your public presentations it was discussed that you would consider the socio-economic impacts of these activities in relation to fisheries, especially to loss of fishing grounds. Colleagues of ours in Ghana have published and shown the many ways in which artisanal and small-scale fishers have lost fishing grounds and areas due to Oil and Gas activities, and how will this proposed oil and gas exploration affect directly with their fishing activities.

Public comment on draft scoping report for Block 11B/12B by Total Energies EP SA: ref 12/4/013

Climate change is fast approaching a point where large tracts of the planet will be uninhabitable by humans. We are living through a “great extinction”, this one of our own making. It has been caused in major part by the extraction and burning of fossil fuels such as oil and gas.

If there is any hope of mitigating the damage we have caused through our actions, it must be predicated on a halt to these practices – at the very least, a halt to the search for new sources of oil and gas. To consider exploring for such new sources is a cynical flogging of a very nearly dead horse in the service of human greed.

Antonio Guterres, the Secretary General of the United Nations, describes proposals such this one succinctly when he says **“investing in new fossil fuel infrastructure is moral and economic madness”**.

It is disingenuous at best to describe the proposal as mere exploration, which will not necessarily lead to extraction but will provide a picture of what reserves of oil and gas exist. No corporation or conglomerate will undertake exploration unless they are reasonably certain that their investment will bear fruit at some time.

This certainty is afforded by the political decision-making landscape of energy supply in South Africa. The authoritative minister is an unabashed fossil fuel supporter. This is in large part due to support given to the ruling party by the fossil fuel industry; he is an influential senior member of that party.

“Spin” around the continued use of fossil fuels, such as being an essential part of the “just transition” to cleaner energy sources, does not stand up to the lightest of scrutiny.

South Africa's energy situation at the time of writing staggers from bad to worse with dire consequences for the economy. The country is almost wholly dependent on coal and incapable of operating its fleet of power stations at anything approaching acceptable levels of efficiency. The sector is beset with countless entrenched problems, ranging from corruption to skills shortages and an anachronistic approach to implementing new technologies, and is on the verge of total collapse.

The country is in urgent need of an immediate boost to provision coupled with an expansion of the transmission network. No amount of spin can alter the fact the most effective way to accomplish this will be through solar, wind and other green and sustainable technologies. Progress in renewables has been fast and continues apace, with associated cost reductions. Events are sure to overtake this proposal.

However, the bureaucratic processes under which the proposal is housed means that approval of the ESIA will in all likelihood be given. If so, it will certainly be appealed and is highly likely to end up in court. Commenting in detail on the legislated aspects of the Scoping Report is akin to assessing the rearrangement of the deckchairs on the Titanic.

Suffice it to say that if it does go ahead it will cause massive disruption to an extremely sensitive marine environment. This marine environment is one on which a large community of subsistence fishers depend.

The proposed project is neither needed nor desirable. It should be shelved until such time as a proper investigation into the ability of renewable technologies to supply South Africa's energy needs is undertaken – and then sent to the glue factory along with the dead horse.

COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT SCOPING REPORT

Environmental authorisation for TotalEnergies EP South Africa (TEEPSA)'s proposed offshore Block 11B/12B production should be refused because it will seriously harm the environment and communities.

The Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) for the proposed project is deeply flawed because it does not take into account its full climate change impacts, or its harmful effects on marine life and ecosystems, as well as its social costs and external liabilities.

Oil and gas exploitation

Oil and gas usage from TEEPSA's proposed production operations will result in significant greenhouse gases (GHG) emissions, which will adversely affect human health and well-being as well as the environment.

It is likely to adversely affect food availability and affordability and result in loss of property due to sea-level rise, along with the direct impacts of catastrophic weather events and the associated deterioration in physical and mental health and well-being.

Environmental impacts are likely to include increased temperatures, worsening and prolonged droughts, longer and more intense heatwaves, increases in extreme weather events, increased ocean acidity, decline in ecosystems and habitat, and increased rates of species extinction.

Given all this, the exploitation of oil and gas resources, and specifically as proposed in this application, is not needed or desirable.

Globally, the proven reserves of oil and gas far exceed what can be used without causing catastrophic climate change. There is already sufficient proven oil to supply over double the GHG emissions consistent with 1.5°C, whilst already proven gas resources are nearly three times more than the 1.5°C budget.

As a party to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Paris Agreement, South Africa has committed to limiting the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2°C and to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C. South Africa is not, however, on track to meet these commitments.

According to the Climate Action Tracker, "South Africa's climate policies and commitments need substantial improvements to be consistent with the Paris Agreement's 1.5°C temperature limit." If all countries followed South Africa's "insufficient" approach to climate mitigation, "warming would reach over 2°C and up to 3°C." Approving more oil and gas projects, including offshore exploration and production, would push South Africa further away from achieving its international climate commitments.

The phase-out of oil and gas is urgently needed to avert the climate crisis, to protect and promote the state's obligations to provide basic necessities such as water, food and shelter. Given this, the exploitation of oil and gas is not needed, is undesirable, is locally and globally irresponsible, is contrary to South Africa's international climate change and biodiversity commitments, and contravenes the state's obligations under section 24 of the Constitution, which states: "Everyone has the right to: an environment which is not harmful to their health or well-being."

Marine impacts

The ESIA must use appropriate methods for modelling the impacts of a well blowout and other operational and unexpected spills or leaks of methane and gas condensate into the environment.

As it stands, its modelling of the consequences of a blowout is inadequate, especially as scientific studies show that methane leakage poses the threat of serious or irreversible harm to individual species and marine ecosystems. Methane also causes depletions in oxygen levels and acidification when dissolved in the marine environment. The ESIA does not yet detail how impacts during Humpback whale and Southern Right Whale migration periods will be mitigated, nor does it detail how operational spills and leaks will be mitigated during spawning periods. These are critical for a full assessment.

While current data is available on species distribution and abundance of cetaceans in Block 11B/12B for two baleen whale species, the humpback whale *Megaptera novaeangliae* and southern right whale *Eubalaena australis*, almost all data is limited to the nearshore continental shelf. Indeed, the majority of information available on the seasonality and distribution of large whales is based on commercial whaling data from the 1960s.

Given this lack of baseline information, a precautionary approach should be taken, such that where the impacts of production cannot be accurately predicted, the activity should not be authorised.

In the Draft Scoping Report, the IUCN status and endemism of the African Penguin is downplayed. The ESIA should include an in depth review of this population given the dramatic decline over the last two decades.

Renewable energy alternatives

The draft scoping report justifies the need for natural gas production "as one element in the mix of technologies that will secure energy generation capacity going forward" - "a bridge on the path from reliance on fossil fuel to carbon-neutrality" and complementary to renewable energy sources.

The report also touts the project's socio-economic benefits in the form of jobs related to operating the FA Platform and associated infrastructure and the PetroSA GTL refinery, which would use the gas and condensates from the project.

Yet, the "general purpose" of the activity can be achieved through renewable energy, such as offshore wind. Investing in a renewable energy project like an offshore wind farm would yield socio-economic benefits without posing the threat of harmful oil spills that are expensive to clean up. Total currently has 10 projects in its offshore wind portfolio. Unlike oil and gas production, which is limited by the location of existing reserves, wind turbines may be able to occupy a greater percentage of Block 11B/12B.

Offshore wind projects also create jobs spanning several occupations and roles, with a concentration in the manufacturing and supply chain. Alternatively, Total could explore opportunities to invest in renewable projects on land. Given the potential of renewable energy to meet the purposes of oil and gas exploration, the ESIA should consider renewable energy projects as alternatives.

The report focuses heavily on detailing the economic and social benefits that South Africa would forego should the project not proceed, without an accounting of the environmental, climate, and social harms that would be avoided. Instead, the ESIA should fairly represent the costs and benefits of choosing not to proceed with the project.

It would be prudent for the ESIA to report on history of the compliance, incidents, spills and failures and any other environmental harm that have occurred across the globe, associated with operations by TOTAL E & P South Africa B.V., Qatar Petroleum International Upstream LLC, CNR International (South Africa) and Main Street 1549 (Pty) Ltd

Negative socio-economic impacts

The ESIA should clearly identify and map out fishing grounds used by small-scale or artisanal fishers to ensure that project activities will not interfere with them and thus the fishers' livelihoods. Some of the impacts which should be specifically examined include those from spills or changes to the behaviour of resident marine species due to project activities, which may reduce accessibility to or abundance of target species.

Food security and food sovereignty

The ESIA fails to consider impacts on food security and food sovereignty, especially in relation to livelihoods that may be impacted by the proposed production and related activities. A right to food perspective is critical in this assessment.

Block 11B/12B is just one of countless hydrocarbon exploration and extraction applications offshore South Africa that will have hugely detrimental implications for people's constitutional rights – their livelihoods, heritage and health rights – but also for marine life and ecosystem.

If all the pros and cons in terms of the impact to the people, the environment and on climate change are properly considered, the inevitable conclusion is that oil and gas resources must stay in the ground.

- 1) **The public participation period:** commencing the public participation period on the 01 December 2022, given the annual holiday season in December, and closing of schools and businesses, is highly suspect. Why did WSP not wait until the start of the year (e.g.16 January) in 2023 before commencing the 30-day comment period?
- 2) As mentioned by several attendees, **notice of the meeting** was not received until yesterday when posted by the Mayor on social media.

The SA Constitution Bill of Rights

Environment

24. Everyone has the right—

- (a) to an environment that is not harmful to their health or wellbeing; and
- (b) to have the environment protected, for the benefit of present and future generations, through reasonable legislative and other measures that—
 - (i) prevent pollution and ecological degradation;
 - (ii) promote conservation; and
 - (iii) secure ecologically sustainable development and use of natural resources while promoting justifiable economic and social development.

In keeping with the Constitution and Bill of Rights Sections 17(1)(c) and 75(1)(b) of the MPRDA state that the national Minister of Mineral Resources and Energy (national Minister) **can issue a prospecting right/reconnaissance permit if the prospecting/reconnaissance will not result in unacceptable pollution, ecological degradation, or damage to the environment.**

Current widespread scientific opinion regarding the actual impact of seismic surveying on the marine environment indicates that the effects on marine ecosystems, living creatures and entire biomes of these activities is significant and irreversible and that alternative methods of reconnaissance survey are more appropriate in the context. Without such assessment and evaluation of alternatives within an environmental assessment process, any decision-making process does not uphold basic principles of just administrative action. Commercial interests and cost cannot be the only or main drivers of decisions. NEMA Section 2 applies in terms of the "precautionary principle". South Africa's policy and legal framework requires conclusive evidence to support an activity with a potential significant impact over a large area. Furthermore, combined and cumulative impacts of reconnaissance, exploration, mining and drilling activities have not been assessed and evaluated in the context of impacts on other marine and coastal based economic activities.

The substantive aspects of widespread and established scientific opinion relating to the impact of seismic surveying on marine life raise a justifiable apprehension of the certainty of irreversible, irreparable and imminent harm should this activity be allowed, as was considered in the judgement handed down by the Eastern Cape High Court in *Sustaining the Wild Coast NPC & 6 others v Minister of Mineral Resources and Energy & 4 others* (Case no. 349112021) ("Shell case") where the precautionary principle was considered justified given the ever increasing body of more recently dated scientific evidence showing the negative and lasting impacts of seismic surveys.

Continued exploration for hydrocarbons does not accord with SA's undertaking at COP27 to reduce dependency on, and use of, carbon emitting fuels. SA's potential in terms of both job creation and energy security is better pursued by directing investment into renewable energy projects and the wider renewable energy training rather than in fossil fuel exploration and development.

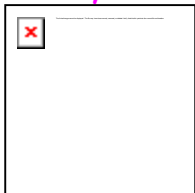

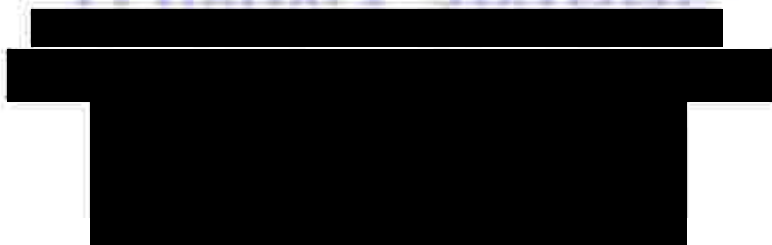



I hereby submit comments on the above-mentioned application for a Production Right TEEPSA 11B/12B.

1. Lack of compliance with the Marine Spatial Planning Act 16 of 2018

The Marine Spatial Planning Act 16 of 2018 (“the MSPA”) was enacted in 2019 and came into effect in May 2021, nearly two years ago. Section 2 of the Act sets out its objectives, while Section 5 of the Act (Annexure 1), sets out the principles that must underpin any development of activities in the ocean.

The Objectives state that implementation of this Act is necessary to “promote sustainable economic opportunities through coordinated and integrated planning” (Section 2 b) and “conserve the ocean for this and future generations” Section 2, c). Section 5.1 (k) states that ‘coherent and holistic planning and management’ is required. Section 5.2 states that where there is conflict between existing uses, developing uses or activities...the principles in sub section 1 must apply (my emphasis). These principles include amongst several, ‘the advancement of an ecosystem and earth system approach’ (section 5.1 (d) and reliance on best available scientific information (h).

In section 3, the Act provides that:

3. Application of Act.—(1) This Act applies to marine spatial planning on or in South African waters and binds all organs of state.

(2) Any right, permit, permission, licence or any other authorisation issued in terms of any other law must be consistent with the approved marine area plans.

As far as i have been able to establish, four years after the passing of the MSPA, no marine spatial plan exists yet for the area relevant to this application. Given the objectives and principles set out by both the MSPA and NEMA, it was the clear intention of the legislature not to proceed with large-scale development of the ocean without clear, coherent and integrated planning based on sufficient evidence is conducted. In the circumstances, it is submitted that it is incumbent upon the Minister to use her powers in terms of s24 (2A) of NEMA, to prohibit the granting of an environmental authorisation by the competent authority for high-impact ocean activities pending the finalisation and adoption of Marine Spatial Plans.

This draft Scoping Report fails to take into account the principles in the MSPA, in particular the need for holistic planning and management and the reliance on the best available information. Such information simply does not exist as the state has not conducted a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) for this section of the coastline.

I submit that no environmental authorisations should be granted for further production rights until such time as 'coordinated and integrated planning' and 'holistic planning' has been done on the coast, including an MSP and a SEA that can consider all the various activities and uses present or proposed for this region. Only then can the decision-maker make an informed decision and balance the various competing interests in order to realise the objectives of the Right to Environment (Section 24) in the Constitution of South Africa. For this reason I submit that the draft Scoping Report fails to adequately place this necessary information pertaining to the requirements of the MSP Act on the table for the decision-maker to consider.

2. Social and Economic Impact assessment

The Draft Scoping report outlines the scope of the social -impact assessment in very broad, brush strokes, suggesting that it will rely heavily on existing demographic and socio-economic information for Mossell Bay, and to a lesser extent St Francis Bay. This is not at all adequate. The receiving environment must be adequately described. Specifically, the Draft Scoping Report fails to indicate how it will gather information about the socio-economic profile of the small-scale fisheries cooperatives all along the area of the coast that will be impacted by the project. Detailed socio-economic information must be provided for these groups that are rights holders in this region, not just stakeholders. Together with subsistence fishers, they are the most marginalised groups of resource users along this coast. The profile should consider the fisheries of each of these cooperatives which differ from coop to cooperative. A detailed assessment of the vulnerability of each cooperative to impacts depending on the species that they utilise and depend on for their livelihoods must be included. For example, squid and certain line fish species. This should include the small-scale fishers who are awaiting the formation of the a cooperative in Still Bay as they may be impacted by this project.

3. Cultural Heritage Assessment (CHA)

The short section on the Cultural Heritage Assessment that will be included fails to indicate how it will address the issue of the fisher community cultural heritage along this coastline. There are numerous traditional, small-scale fisher communities that have a long cultural history and relationship with the ocean, resulting in both tangible and intangible culture. Whilst some of these fishers identify as indigenous fishers of Khoisan heritage, a focus on Khoisan coastal dwellers' relationship with the ocean will not capture all of the fisheries specific heritage. This heritage is also at risk. The Draft Scoping Report does not list which communities' cultural heritage will be assessed? It does not provide the public with an opportunity to assess if there are gaps in this list or if the methodology to describe, assess and rate the impact of the proposed project on the cultural heritage of these diverse groups will be appropriate and adequate. Please elaborate on these issues and how each of the SSF cooperatives will be covered in this regard as well as the many groups of subsistence fishers who are active in the Knysna and Gqeberha area but are not on the cooperative list. Will field work be conducted with each of them? If so, what methods will be used?

Dear WSP

I am a registered I&AP for this project. Please place on record my objections to the licensing of the mining of oil in the area between Cape St Francis and Mossel Bay and the drilling of 10 deep sea wells in the Mossel Bay area.

I am an aquatic ecologist with 25 years experience in the field. It is unthinkable that in an age in which responsible management of the planet requires urgent collective action against the use of non-renewable fossil fuels (inter alia), that this form of resource exploitation should even be a consideration. Drilling for and pumping of gas and associated condensates is archaic in the extreme, in terms of the alternatives we should be funding, developing and further exploring. As signatories to the Paris Agreement South Africa has committed to set the goal to reach zero net emissions by 2050 in its Low Emission Development Strategy. It is hard to imagine how this development could contribute to that goal.

Furthermore the laying of a 109km pipeline from the Site to PetroSA is fraught with challenges and potential impacts. It also appears that the application to convert the Exploration Right to a Production right also does not preclude TEEPSA from planning further exploration.

Table 10.2 of your S&EIA report provides sufficient indication, from environmental practitioners, of what the extensive impacts of the production activities could potentially be. This Table, peppered with potential impacts, tells a story in itself. On behalf of myself and my colleagues I would like to object both to the application to convert the exploration right to a production right, in light of South Africa's current climate crisis agreements, to object to further proposed exploration as documented in the S&EIA report, and to strongly recommend that the alternatives sought by specialists are in the fields of renewable energies.

Comments on the TEEPSA Block 11B/12B ESIA proposal.

The proposal intends French firm Total to drill six (+4) wells so as to establish future viability in gas condensate (oil?) extraction.

I have three major issues.

Motivation/Rationale.

The rationale and motivation for this continued use of fossil fuels is made largely on economic grounds. I seriously question this position. Recent activities in SA indicate that green energy may be delivered at a higher pace than originally forecast.

Moreover, by pursuing this proposal, the pressure to transform to a carbon-free economy is likely to lose impetus.

It is thus necessary to read reports of a plethora of current and recent similar oil and gas initiatives.

It is now **most important to provide an overview of the existing exploration and extraction rights in the southern African region.** In particular, the activities in Namibia need to be assessed in the light of the Fisheries Protocol that we have between our countries.

Communities.

The proposed community/municipal interaction is weak and incomplete. Total SA does not have a great image when it comes to local communities. I find the public participation exercise weak. The focus on public in the coastal towns is misleading. Most of the major development and policy decisions are made in Gauteng and Pretoria. Community involvement needs to be more adequately accommodated.

More details on the role of partners such as Qatar should be provided.

The Proposal

I have read the scoping report and generally find it strong and convincing. The fact that the former Mossel Bay facility at PetroSA is to be used is a positive feature. I believe that there is a general low risk posed to marine life, making this proposal acceptable.

The fact that no viable alternatives are proposed weakens the proposal.

There is a need to firm up on certain risk aspects that may compromise the actual operations. For example, the use of OMN Wbd vs NADF toxicity needs elaboration, or if the 109 km undersea pipe cannot follow the former Mossgas infrastructure. So

too does an accidental spill need more discussion and elaboration on remedial opportunities.

Every opportunity should be taken to collect data and to have research expertise as part of the team.

However this should not be seen as a blank cheque and careful management and controls must be in place. Such Conditions must be firm and deviations are not permitted. These conditions should also be in the public domain.

Public Notification of Natural Gas Production off the Southern Cape

In order to decide to install production facilities the area must have been subjected to an oceanic seismic survey some time before, as it takes ages to convert the data received from such a survey into tangible information. How did Total get to undertake the seismic in the first place? Shell Oil, trying to do this further up the coast, was prevented from undertaking similar surveys as it reputedly had all sorts of dreadful consequences, according to the greenies. Did this not apply to the Total survey? Did any of the potential armageddon style consequences from the Shell survey actually happen with the Total survey? Are there still fish in the sea in and around Mossel Bay?

In order to be granted the necessary rights to produce this gas there needs to be public participation, where concerns can be raised and hopefully put to rest. The declared area of production stretches from Mossel Bay to Cape St Francis, a distance of about 280km, and is about 100km from the shore, well outside of the shipping lane. Public meetings are to be held from Mossel Bay to East London, though – a stretch of over 600km. Why involve communities so far removed from the action? Why not then also involve Stilbaai and other communities to the west of Mossel Bay? Is it intended to extend production NE-wards beyond the stated area?

The venues for these meetings are obviously aimed at getting to the bulk of the population, as most of these meetings are to be held in township areas, and some are (thoughtfully) after work hours, although starting times are a bit tight for working people. That is laudable, but, most of those target people have little to no concern for the environment – just check how they dispose of their rubbish. Genuinely concerned people from outside the townships would probably not risk going to those meeting venues. Park your car there (if you can find a spot) and you are asking for trouble as soon as you get out of it (or even before). If not relieved of your cell phone, watch and wallet as you walk to the meeting venue, it will probably happen on the way back, although chances are that by then your car will be vandalised or stolen. I'm being cynical, but, am I completely wrong?

The Jeffreys Bay meeting venue only has 5 parking spaces. Most (all?) will be taken up by the officials' cars. The surrounding streets are very narrow. Where to park? I am thus not willing to accept the risk of going there at 5pm and needing to walk some distance through the township, also leaving the car vulnerable. Some venues have meetings scheduled in the morning – can this not be done in Sea Vista & Pellsrus? Why not drop the Gqeberha, Port Alfred and East London meetings and arrange for extra meetings, in more secure venues, in Plett, St Francis and Jbay? The current schedule smacks of tokenism – being seen to take the necessary legal action but not really wanting it to be meaningful.

I would like this venture to go ahead, though. It will benefit the country's economy with a welcome cash injection and job creation opportunity. If the gas is used locally to generate electricity it will reduce SA's overall carbon footprint, but, that will be at a cost as the alternative market, gas strapped Europe and gas hungry Japan, will be willing to pay high prices for this gas in LNG form. I furthermore foresee major political interference as the corrupt politicians fight each other to have their Swiss bank accounts credited.

Southern Cape Natural Gas

Interesting stuff that most people are totally unaware of. Anyway, how did Total get to undertake the seismic in the first place? Trying to do this further up the coast has all sorts of dreadful consequences, according to concerned environmentally aware persons. Did any of these armageddon style consequences actually happen? Are there still fish in the sea in and around Mossel Bay?

All this aside – it's water under the bridge (or whatever) now – besides supposedly endangering all the fish life that many years ago, Total now wants to cause further potential harm to the environment by producing a fossil fuel, the use of which will increase global warming, with all the resultant mayhem. Never mind all the protocols that have been signed and agreed to internationally to actually reduce the use of FFs globally.

It will be many years before the world can operate without fossil fuel being used somewhere and somehow. FF powers our vehicles, especially those trucks that provide us with food on a daily basis.
