I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed offshore oil drilling and building of new gas pipelines in Mossel Bay, in the Outeniqua Basin. The location of this project raises several environmental concerns that cannot be ignored.

First, the area lies in the middle of the Agulhus Current, which is a major highway for whale and sardine migration. Drilling and pipeline construction in this area will disrupt the migration patterns of these marine species and potentially cause harm to their populations.

Second, the proposed location borders on a Marine Protected Area, which is established to conserve the area's unique marine biodiversity and ecological processes. The introduction of oil drilling and pipelines will not only destroy the protected ecosystem, but also harm the livelihoods of local communities who depend on the area's resources.

Furthermore, the risks associated with offshore oil drilling are well-documented and undeniable. Gas and oil extraction is a high risk to the environment, tourism, and other economic endeavors along the coastline. The speed of ocean currents and thermal layers in the area make it extremely difficult to control any spills, as oil from the depths will be distributed across multiple depth zones and a very large area. The International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) calls for a moratorium on oil and gas exploration.

Finally, the extraction of oil and gas contributes to greenhouse gases and the release of carbon stores of seabed sediment. This will only exacerbate the effects of climate change, which is already having devastating impacts on our planet and its inhabitants.

In light of these serious concerns, I strongly urge you to reconsider the proposed offshore oil drilling and pipeline construction in Mossel Bay. I believe that we must prioritize the protection of our environment and the well-being of future generations over short-term financial gains.

I object to the building and mining of a gas piplipeline in the Outeniqua Basin, Block 11B/12B by TotalEnergies on these grounds:

I have the following comments to make regarding this proposed project and/or the public participation process:

Our South African Ocean Biodiversity is slowly or perhaps not so slowly depleting.

The Abyssal Plains are the deepest ecosystem type in South Africa's oceans. South Africa's EEZ does not have deep water trenches, such as the famous Mariana trench that reaches a maximum depth of 13 000 m! Our abyssal ecosystems, spanning a depth range of 3500 to 6000 m, are largely unexplored. In the 1980's, one of South Africa's geologists, Professor John Roger, took the first photographs of abyssal and seamount ecosystems using a camera in a special underwater housing.

Abyssal ecosystems in South Africa are currently under limited pressure but this Total/Engen initiative to explore these areas for oil and gas resources and deep sea minerals such as manganese. Should such minerals be found in sufficient quantities, pressure on these ecosystems will increase substantially.

Proposed MPAs that represent abyssal ecosystems include Southeast Atlantic Seamounts MPA (Cape Basin Abyss) and Agulhas Front MPA (Agulhas Basin Abyss). Southwest Indian Ocean abyssal ecosystems (Natal Basin) will be considered in future protected area planning.

The loss of any species affects the Ecosystems and their services. It is apparent that the increasing red tide is due to species loss. The barren rocks and reefs, the lesser fish species is not only due to overfishing, it is due to the contaminants in the sea. These have and are continuing to occur through mining, pollution, chemical spills, and physical destruction of sea beds through exploration in search of minerals. This extensive initiative involves many levels of activity that will not be restored. The scientific proof is there, it is evident to all. The proof is there but our South African waters need to be analysed and present situations monitored and evaluated through regular and comprehensive research. This is not occurring.

It is our duty and our responsibility as human beings to protect our natural environment for the survival of the planet and humanity now and for generations to come.

Simplifying our lifestyles to lower our consumption and production is a Sustainable alternative to the use of Oil and Gas for energy.



Regarding the application by TotalEnergies EP SA and partners for production rights for Block 11B/12B (as outlined in your draft Environmental and Social Impact Assessment ref no 12/4/13 PR PUBLIC WSP Project No.: 41105306):

I wish to register as an interested or affected party.

I am a South African citizen and I am filing this objection in my personal capacity.

I strongly object to the application to convert the exploration rights into production rights.

The era of fossil fuel production should be ended and more appropriate energy sources explored instead. The destructive effects of the exploitation and use of fossil fuels are well known. South Africa has made international undertakings to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Developing gas resources will not contribute to this goal.

The risks of extensive, long-term or permanent environmental damage from fossil fuel energy generation are too high. Even limited damage would not be acceptable. Your ESIA draft scoping report acknowledges the challenging conditions: "The strong Agulhas Ocean current, coupled with the high wind and waves, make the harsh metocean conditions a challenge for especially the installation / construction phase of the project... It is considered as the second strongest surface current in the world." Your draft scoping report notes that the proposed pipeline will pass through a critical biodiversity area. These risks to the marine and coastal environment are unacceptable.

The ocean is not your playground, to use to extract resources for your own gain at will. This is a national resource and should be preserved.

The draft scoping report refers to the expected use of the product: "The outcome of the on-going commercial negotiations (including agreements for the sale of the gas) should determine the use of the gas. Some possible use scenarios include Gas to Liquids (GTL) or Gas to Power (GTP)."

I believe that South Africa should not be encouraging the use of gas-to-liquid or gas-to-power. There are strong indications that such huge infrastructure projects are encouraged by certain elements within government because of the potential for corrupt payments and wealth. This is particularly so when government is expected to be a significant customer for the end product or funder of essential infrastructure to enable the project.

The gas-to-liquid aspect of this project appears to be an attempt to provide a use for the financially disastrous state-owned PetroSA, which should be closed down as a waste of money and a drain on the fiscus (the EIA states that the gas and condensates would be sold to PetroSA). The gas-to-power aspect appears to be a blatant attempt to support the Karpowership generation projects, which stink of corruption due to the manipulated bid process, the unjustifiably long proposed 20-year "emergency" contract and the enormous and unaffordable cost.

It is well-known that renewable energy projects are now considerably cheaper than gas.

Put your money, expertise and energies into developing cutting-edge renewal technologies instead. We do not want our oceans put at risk.

Submission in response to the proposed offshore Production Rights and Environmental Authorisation Application for Block 11B/12B by TotalEnergy EP South Africa.

1. Comments

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed offshore Production Rights and Environmental Authorisation Application for Block 11B/12B by TotalEnergy EP South Africa and I would like to use this opportunity to express our concern about the plans to invest further in new gas exploration and production in the time of climate emergency.

I oppose the further development of a gas industry in South Africa for the following reasons:

Climate change is already causing widespread disruption in every region in the world with around 1.1 degrees C of warming. Every tenth of a degree of additional warming will escalate threats to people, species and ecosystems. The latest assessment report by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) clearly states that the limit of 1.5 degrees C is the scientifically confirmed minimum safe limit for our climate and survival, hence, climate action is needed urgently^[1]. In June 2021 the International Energy Agency published a study that clearly stated that the exploitation and development of new oil and gas fields must stop in 2021 if the world is to stay within safe limits of global heating and meet the goal of net zero emissions by 2050^[2].

Gas is NOT a more climate friendly fossil fuel.

Looking at the whole value chain of gas, methane can escape through so called “gas leaks” into the atmosphere at many different points in the supply chain. These emissions have routinely been underestimated by industry and governments. Methane has a far greater global warming potential than carbon dioxide. Over the next 20-year period – which is a crucial time period to respond to the climate emergency - the warming potential is 84–86 times greater.

Gas is NOT needed as a transition fuel.

Combinations of renewable energies and energy storage are either already cheaper or are expected to be cheaper within a few years. Developing a local gas industry will take time, so by the time the infrastructure is in place, renewables and storage will have become the most cost-effective option, and the gas infrastructure will be a stranded asset.^[3]

Gas will NOT solve the energy crisis.

Multiple experts agree that *“Energy modelling shows that renewables are the quickest and cheapest way to get much-needed capacity onto the grid.”^[4] South Africa should act according to science-based evidence and invest in renewable energy sources as fast as possible.*

Biodiversity risk

The proposed area is bordering on a Marine Protected Area and falls within the Agulhus Current which is a major route for migration of marine mammals and fish. Risks are unnecessarily high for the marine species that our local fishing communities and tourism relies on.

2. Conclusion

South Africa has signed the Paris agreement^[5] which agrees to limit climate change to under 2 degrees C and with **all efforts** to limit it to 1.5 degrees, hence there is no space for using further hydrocarbons beyond the currently discovered reserves. Fossil gas expansion is inconsistent with the Paris Agreement goals, and as a signatory to the Agreement **South Africa should not undertake any further investments in the development of new gas projects.**

Building a local gas industry will take a lot of time. Electricity generated by our massive sun and wind resources within our own borders is the most secure and sustainable way forward. Instead of producing and using more fossil fuels **South Africa should invest all they have in building a renewable energy industry.**

I Hope that WSP will take into account the comments and information provided in this submission.

Thanks for your heads up on the public meetings which form part of the Scoping Report for Total's application to produce gas 120km offshore from Mossel Bay. (And to conduct seismic blasting at a later stage.)

On my way back from Groenkant this morning, I stopped over at the first meeting at KwaNonqaba and was dismayed to discover the following:

- The hall was jam-packed and overflowing with local residents, numbering over 400. They told me WSP, the environmental consultant, had gone around the township yesterday with a loud hailer inviting them to 'register for jobs'. So they all turned up en masse with their ID books this morning.
- There were about 30 questions from the floor – all relating to jobs. Not a single environmental concern was raised.

- A local lawyer, Gama Lunguni, welcomed Total's application 'wholeheartedly'. He then condemned the Bloom Association of the Netherlands who planned to stop the project, 'just as they had stopped Shell's seismic exploration'.
- Clearly, Total is sham-loading the Scoping process with signatures of township residents from Mossel Bay to St Francis Bay to claim that they had 'conducted an extensive public participation process'. Why else would they choose mainly township venues such as KwaNonqaba, Thembaletu and Khayaletu for the public meetings?
- The public meeting in George is scheduled for this **Wednesday, 18 January, from 5pm to 7pm at the Thembaletu Community Hall.**
- Total's application was pushed through over the December holidays. This in itself raises red flags. Deadline for comments is 3 February 2023.

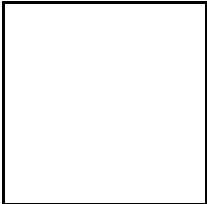



I hereby submit my support for the TotalEnergies Exploration Application. Please consider my motivation below herein.

SIGNIFICANCE AND THE IMPACT OF FUEL TO THE ECONOMY

Fuel is the lifeblood of the economy and a centrepiece for economic development.

If there is an increase in fuel price, the impact of that is felt throughout the entire economy. Such an increase-triggers increases in goods and services in all sectors and their value chains. This leads to, among others, increases in the cost of transportation of goods, transport fares for commuters, food price, medicine price, electricity price etc. Such price hikes then cause employees to demand higher wages or salaries when they negotiate with their employers due to a high cost of living. The seismic surveys led to the discovery of the 'Bullfrog Well' off the shore of Mossel Bay, which is located in the Western Cape. This discovery is one of several highly anticipated exploration prospects of TotalEnergies and this discovery will, *inter alia*, boost the GDP of Western Cape and that of the country at large.

Mossel Bay

Mossel Bay is a pristine town within the Western spectacular seaside lifestyle, and fishing and tourism are local economic development key drivers of that area. There is a variety of marine life and sea mammals around the seashore of Mossel Bay, such as:

- The Cape Fur Seals which are found in large concentration in Seal Island which is in Mossel Bay which are a tourist attraction
- There are White Sharks and Shark Cage Diving activities in Mossel Bay
- There are a lot of Dolphins and also Orcas sightings in Mossel Bay
- There are Whales and Whale Watching Safaris in Mossel Bay which take place from July to October

Sea mammals like Seals, White Sharks, Dolphins, Orcas and Whales are still found in Mossel Bay after the 2020 seismic survey operation which was conducted by TotalEnergies.

Observation

Whereas, there were claims from certain interest groups that the seismic surveys would lead to irreparable harm to marine life such as dolphins, whales, seals etc, these claims turned out not to be true.

Instead, the following observations can be made:

- There was no irreparable harm caused to fishing and eco-tourism after the TotalEnergies 2020 seismic survey operations
- The seismic surveys led to the discovery of large oil reserves
- The discovery will, amongst others, contribute immensely to the Western Cape's GDP
- The seismic survey operation did not impact on the whale migration because whales descended from Antarctic to the warmer waters of South African Coast near Mossel Bay in 2020, 2021 and in 2023
- The Seal Island in Mossel Bay still has a large concentration of Cape Fur Seals, Shark Cage Diving activities, Dolphins and Orcas are still sighted after the seismic operations
- There was no court Interdict lodged to stop the TotalEnergies seismic surveys

The above observations demonstrate that the seismic survey operation did not cause any irreversible damage to sea mammals.

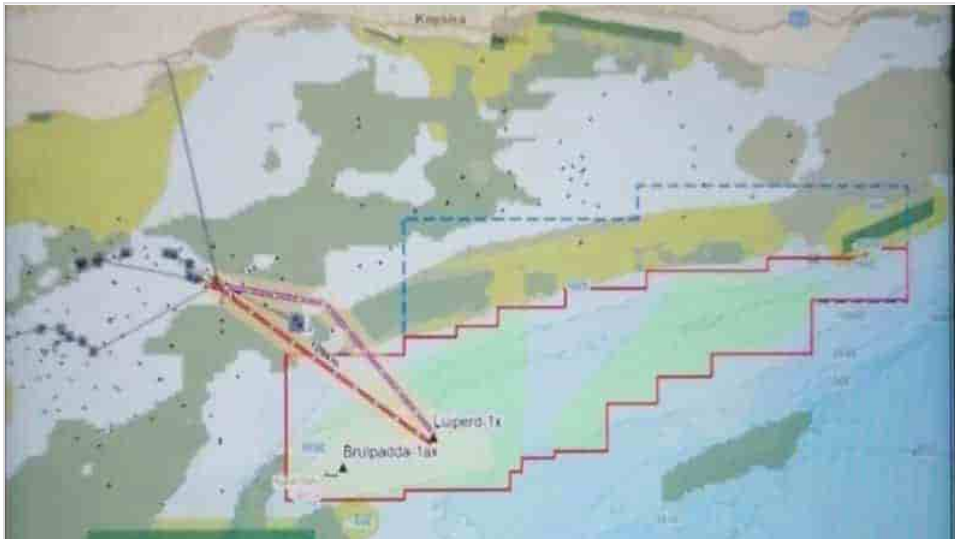

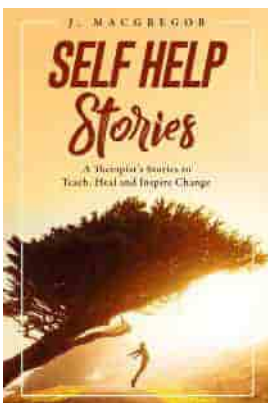

I am writing to be included in future correspondence regarding the Teepsa ESIA and to raise my concerns.

I specifically would like further information on how cultural heritage of coastal communities along the coast would experience impacts through the exploration activities planned for Block 11b/12b. I managed to see the Cultural Impact Assessment for the other TEESPA 5/6/7 of Cape Point, and it only covers some concerns of Khoisan communities, but does not expand on the potential impact on other cultural groups, especially small scale and artisanal fishers, who over the past four years of collaborative research with customary rights holders and other knowledge holders have expressed clear concerns, will these small scale fisher communities and other coastal users be consulted and included in this assessment, these activities and livelihood strategies are not just economic practices but deeply connected to cultural heritage.

Please can you explain how these communities are going to be included in this Block 11/12b assessment?

In your public presentations it was discussed that you would consider the socio-economic impacts of these activities in relation to fisheries, especially to loss of fishing grounds. Colleagues of ours in Ghana have published and shown the many ways in which artisanal and small-scale fishers have lost fishing grounds and areas due to Oil and Gas activities, and how will this proposed oil and gas exploration affect directly with their fishing activities.

Public comment on draft scoping report for Block 11B/12B by Total Energies EP SA: ref 12/4/013

Climate change is fast approaching a point where large tracts of the planet will be uninhabitable by humans. We are living through a “great extinction”, this one of our own making. It has been caused in major part by the extraction and burning of fossil fuels such as oil and gas.

If there is any hope of mitigating the damage we have caused through our actions, it must be predicated on a halt to these practices – at the very least, a halt to the search for new sources of oil and gas. To consider exploring for such new sources is a cynical flogging of a very nearly dead horse in the service of human greed.

Antonio Guterres, the Secretary General of the United Nations, describes proposals such this one succinctly when he says **“investing in new fossil fuel infrastructure is moral and economic madness”**.

It is disingenuous at best to describe the proposal as mere exploration, which will not necessarily lead to extraction but will provide a picture of what reserves of oil and gas exist. No corporation or conglomerate will undertake exploration unless they are reasonably certain that their investment will bear fruit at some time.

This certainty is afforded by the political decision-making landscape of energy supply in South Africa. The authoritative minister is an unabashed fossil fuel supporter. This is in large part due to support given to the ruling party by the fossil fuel industry; he is an influential senior member of that party.

“Spin” around the continued use of fossil fuels, such as being an essential part of the “just transition” to cleaner energy sources, does not stand up to the lightest of scrutiny.

South Africa's energy situation at the time of writing staggers from bad to worse with dire consequences for the economy. The country is almost wholly dependent on coal and incapable of operating its fleet of power stations at anything approaching acceptable levels of efficiency. The sector is beset with countless entrenched problems, ranging from corruption to skills shortages and an anachronistic approach to implementing new technologies, and is on the verge of total collapse.

The country is in urgent need of an immediate boost to provision coupled with an expansion of the transmission network. No amount of spin can alter the fact the most effective way to accomplish this will be through solar, wind and other green and sustainable technologies. Progress in renewables has been fast and continues apace, with associated cost reductions. Events are sure to overtake this proposal.

However, the bureaucratic processes under which the proposal is housed means that approval of the ESIA will in all likelihood be given. If so, it will certainly be appealed and is highly likely to end up in court. Commenting in detail on the legislated aspects of the Scoping Report is akin to assessing the rearrangement of the deckchairs on the Titanic.

Suffice it to say that if it does go ahead it will cause massive disruption to an extremely sensitive marine environment. This marine environment is one on which a large community of subsistence fishers depend.

The proposed project is neither needed nor desirable. It should be shelved until such time as a proper investigation into the ability of renewable technologies to supply South Africa's energy needs is undertaken – and then sent to the glue factory along with the dead horse.

Environmental authorisation for TotalEnergies EP South Africa (TEEPSA)'s proposed offshore Block 11B/12B production should be refused because it will seriously harm the environment and communities.

The Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) for the proposed project is deeply flawed because it does not take into account its full climate change impacts, or its harmful effects on marine life and ecosystems, as well as its social costs and external liabilities.

Oil and gas exploitation

Oil and gas usage from TEEPSA's proposed production operations will result in significant greenhouse gases (GHG) emissions, which will adversely affect human health and well-being as well as the environment.

It is likely to adversely affect food availability and affordability and result in loss of property due to sea-level rise, along with the direct impacts of catastrophic weather events and the associated deterioration in physical and mental health and well-being.

Environmental impacts are likely to include increased temperatures, worsening and prolonged droughts, longer and more intense heatwaves, increases in extreme weather events, increased ocean acidity, decline in ecosystems and habitat, and increased rates of species extinction.

Given all this, the exploitation of oil and gas resources, and specifically as proposed in this application, is not needed or desirable.

Globally, the proven reserves of oil and gas far exceed what can be used without causing catastrophic climate change. There is already sufficient proven oil to supply over double the GHG emissions consistent with 1.5°C, whilst already proven gas resources are nearly three times more than the 1.5°C budget.

As a party to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Paris Agreement, South Africa has committed to limiting the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2°C and to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C. South Africa is not, however, on track to meet these commitments.

According to the Climate Action Tracker, "South Africa's climate policies and commitments need substantial improvements to be consistent with the Paris Agreement's 1.5°C temperature limit." If all countries followed South Africa's "insufficient" approach to climate mitigation, "warming would reach over 2°C and up to 3°C." Approving more oil and gas projects, including offshore exploration and production, would push South Africa further away from achieving its international climate commitments.

The phase-out of oil and gas is urgently needed to avert the climate crisis, to protect and promote the state's obligations to provide basic necessities such as water, food and shelter. Given this, the exploitation of oil and gas is not needed, is undesirable, is locally and globally irresponsible, is contrary to South Africa's international climate change and biodiversity commitments, and contravenes the state's obligations under section 24 of the Constitution, which states: "Everyone has the right to: an environment which is not harmful to their health or well-being."

Marine impacts

The ESIA must use appropriate methods for modelling the impacts of a well blowout and other operational and unexpected spills or leaks of methane and gas condensate into the environment.

As it stands, its modelling of the consequences of a blowout is inadequate, especially as scientific studies show that methane leakage poses the threat of serious or irreversible harm to individual species and marine ecosystems. Methane also causes depletions in oxygen levels and acidification when dissolved in the marine environment. The ESIA does not yet detail how impacts during Humpback whale and Southern Right Whale migration periods will be mitigated, nor does it detail how operational spills and leaks will be mitigated during spawning periods. These are critical for a full assessment.

While current data is available on species distribution and abundance of cetaceans in Block 11B/12B for two baleen whale species, the humpback whale *Megaptera novaeangliae* and southern right whale *Eubalaena australis*, almost all data is limited to the nearshore continental shelf. Indeed, the majority of information available on the seasonality and distribution of large whales is based on commercial whaling data from the 1960s.

Given this lack of baseline information, a precautionary approach should be taken, such that where the impacts of production cannot be accurately predicted, the activity should not be authorised.

In the Draft Scoping Report, the IUCN status and endemism of the African Penguin is downplayed. The ESIA should include an in depth review of this population given the dramatic decline over the last two decades.

Renewable energy alternatives

The draft scoping report justifies the need for natural gas production "as one element in the mix of technologies that will secure energy generation capacity going forward" - "a bridge on the path from reliance on fossil fuel to carbon-neutrality" and complementary to renewable energy sources.

The report also touts the project's socio-economic benefits in the form of jobs related to operating the FA Platform and associated infrastructure and the PetroSA GTL refinery, which would use the gas and condensates from the project.

Yet, the "general purpose" of the activity can be achieved through renewable energy, such as offshore wind. Investing in a renewable energy project like an offshore wind farm would yield socio-economic benefits without posing the threat of harmful oil spills that are expensive to clean up. Total currently has 10 projects in its offshore wind portfolio. Unlike oil and gas production, which is limited by the location of existing reserves, wind turbines may be able to occupy a greater percentage of Block 11B/12B.

Offshore wind projects also create jobs spanning several occupations and roles, with a concentration in the manufacturing and supply chain. Alternatively, Total could explore opportunities to invest in renewable projects on land. Given the potential of renewable energy to meet the purposes of oil and gas exploration, the ESIA should consider renewable energy projects as alternatives.

The report focuses heavily on detailing the economic and social benefits that South Africa would forego should the project not proceed, without an accounting of the environmental, climate, and social harms that would be avoided. Instead, the ESIA should fairly represent the costs and benefits of choosing not to proceed with the project.

It would be prudent for the ESIA to report on history of the compliance, incidents, spills and failures and any other environmental harm that have occurred across the globe, associated with operations by TOTAL E & P South Africa B.V., Qatar Petroleum International Upstream LLC, CNR International (South Africa) and Main Street 1549 (Pty) Ltd

Negative socio-economic impacts

The ESIA should clearly identify and map out fishing grounds used by small-scale or artisanal fishers to ensure that project activities will not interfere with them and thus the fishers’ livelihoods. Some of the impacts which should be specifically examined include those from spills or changes to the behaviour of resident marine species due to project activities, which may reduce accessibility to or abundance of target species.

Food security and food sovereignty

The ESIA fails to consider impacts on food security and food sovereignty, especially in relation to livelihoods that may be impacted by the proposed production and related activities. A right to food perspective is critical in this assessment.

Block 11B/12B is just one of countless hydrocarbon exploration and extraction applications offshore South Africa that will have hugely detrimental implications for people’s constitutional rights – their livelihoods, heritage and health rights – but also for marine life and ecosystem.

If all the pros and cons in terms of the impact to the people, the environment and on climate change are properly considered, the inevitable conclusion is that oil and gas resources must stay in the ground.

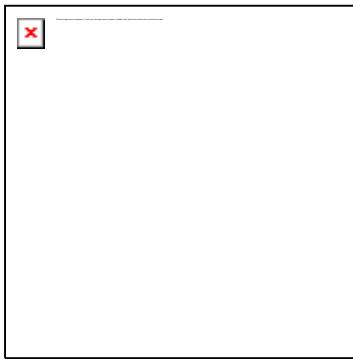

South Africa's policy and legal framework requires conclusive evidence to support an activity with a potential significant impact over a large area. I urge you to withdraw any plan / investment to destroy our coast and nature.

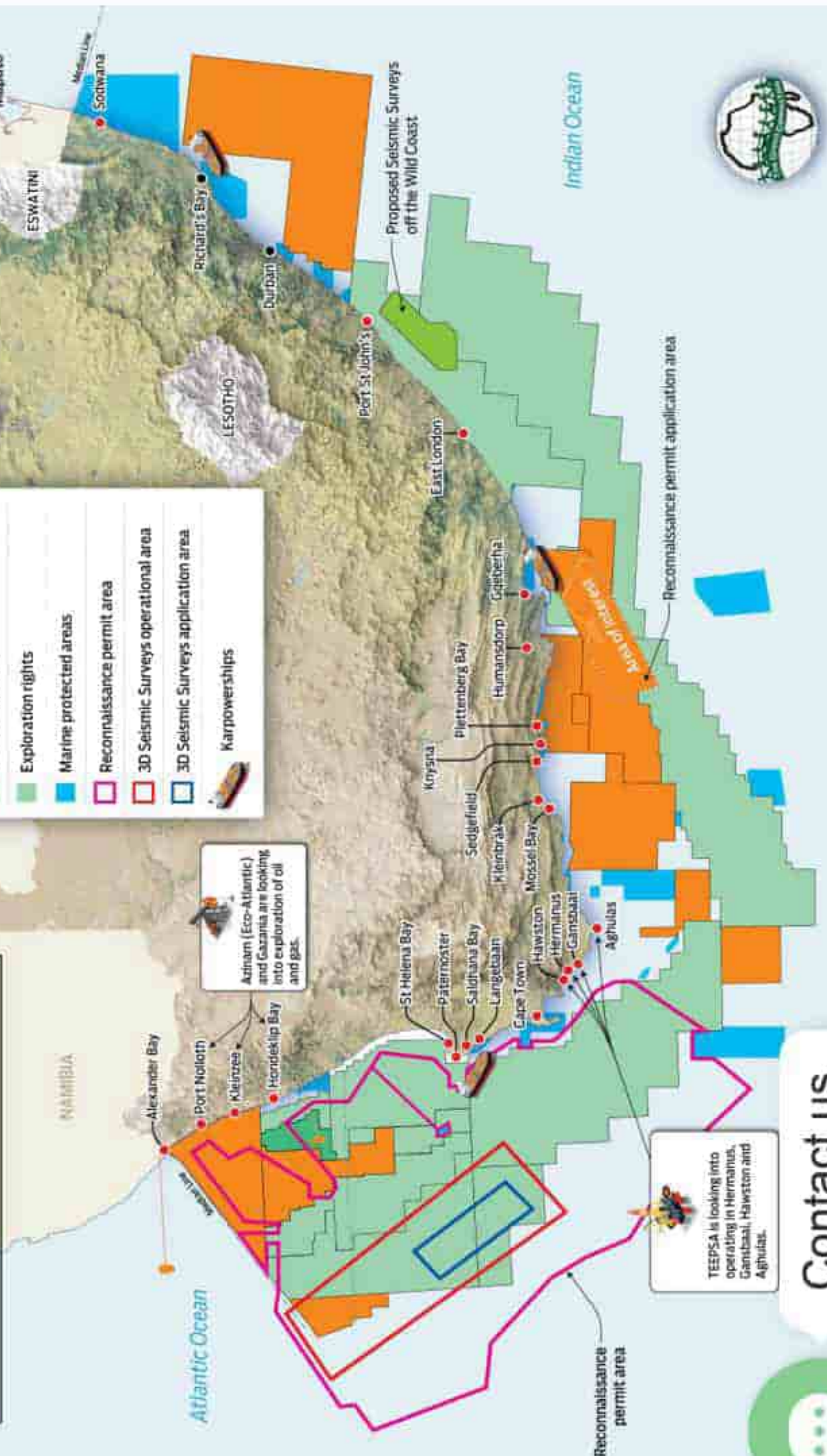

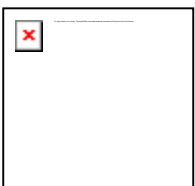

I have absolutely no confidence in the ability of ESIA consultants or their independence in the matter of gas pipelines being built or gas extracted off the coast of Mossel Bay.

The South African government has proved itself to be totally incompetent to govern the country, inter alia, they have run all SOE's into the ground. I attended the public meeting at the Piesang Valley Hall in Plettenberg Bay. My comments are as follows:

- 1) **The public participation period:** commencing the public participation period on the 01 December 2022, given the annual holiday season in December, and closing of schools and businesses, is highly suspect. Why did WSP not wait until the start of the year (e.g.16 January) in 2023 before commencing the 30-day comment period?
- 2) As mentioned by several attendees, **notice of the meeting** was not received until yesterday when posted by the Mayor on social media.
- 3) The Garden Route region is highly dependent on tourism for employment and economic development. Is there going to be an assessment on the negative impacts to **the tourism industry (e.g.,** the ocean whale and dolphin watching businesses, deep sea fishing. The jobs provided in the tourism sector are likely to be far greater than those provided by this project, which are probably going to be taken up by highly skilled, specialist contractors such as the international ship drilling rigs.

The SA Constitution Bill of Rights

Environment

24. Everyone has the right—

- (a) to an environment that is not harmful to their health or wellbeing; and
- (b) to have the environment protected, for the benefit of present and future generations, through reasonable legislative and other measures that—
 - (i) prevent pollution and ecological degradation;
 - (ii) promote conservation; and
 - (iii) secure ecologically sustainable development and use of natural resources while promoting justifiable economic and social development.

In keeping with the Constitution and Bill of Rights Sections 17(1)(c) and 75(1)(b) of the MPRDA state that the national Minister of Mineral Resources and Energy (national Minister) **can issue a prospecting right/reconnaissance permit if the prospecting/reconnaissance will not result in unacceptable pollution, ecological degradation, or damage to the environment.**

Current widespread scientific opinion regarding the actual impact of seismic surveying on the marine environment indicates that the effects on marine ecosystems, living creatures and entire biomes of these activities is significant and irreversible and that alternative methods of reconnaissance survey are more appropriate in the context. Without such assessment and evaluation of alternatives within an environmental assessment process, any decision-making process does not uphold basic principles of just administrative action. Commercial interests and cost cannot be the only or main drivers of decisions. NEMA Section 2 applies in terms of the "precautionary principle". South Africa's policy and legal framework requires conclusive evidence to support an activity with a potential significant impact over a large area. Furthermore, combined and cumulative impacts of reconnaissance, exploration, mining and drilling activities have not been assessed and evaluated in the context of impacts on other marine and coastal based economic activities.

The substantive aspects of widespread and established scientific opinion relating to the impact of seismic surveying on marine life raise a justifiable apprehension of the certainty of irreversible, irreparable and imminent harm should this activity be allowed, as was considered in the judgement handed down by the Eastern Cape High Court in *Sustaining the Wild Coast NPC & 6 others v Minister of Mineral Resources and Energy & 4 others* (Case no. 349112021) ("Shell case") where the precautionary principle was considered justified given the ever increasing body of more recently dated scientific evidence showing the negative and lasting impacts of seismic surveys.

Continued exploration for hydrocarbons does not accord with SA's undertaking at COP27 to reduce dependency on, and use of, carbon emitting fuels. SA's potential in terms of both job creation and energy security is better pursued by directing investment into renewable energy projects and the wider renewable energy training rather than in fossil fuel exploration and development.
