Dear Thandi and James

Can you please advise to which Waste Water Treatment Works the sewage from the proposed Huddle Development will be transported too? The Johannesburg Water letter confirming capacity does not mention this and we need to include it in our reports and confirm with the Municipality that the WWTW's has capacity to treat additional sewage. We need to make sure that both the sewage pipeline and WWTWs has capacity and not only the pipeline – which is what the letter may imply.

The community have raised concerns around the existing infrastructure and we need to make sure we are covered in this aspect – they will ask the question so we need to be pro-active in supplying the information.

So, if you could assist with obtaining a further letter from the CoJMM regarding the capacity at the WWTW, this would be appreciated and would assist the EIA process.
