INTRODUCTION

Following our telephone conversation earlier today, this letter serves as formal notification for various mining related Environmental Impact Assessments (EIAs) that will take place in the Moses Kotane Local Municipality of the North West Province. Further detail on the proposed projects is included below and the local setting is illustrated in Appendix A.

PILANESBERG PLATINUM MINE - TUSCHENKOMST PIT EXTENSION 1.1.

Introduction to the proposed activities

Pilanesberg Platinum Mine (PPM) holds a mining right and currently operates an existing opencast platinum mine on the farms Tuschenkomst 135 JP and Witkleifontein 136 JP. As part of the proposed project, PPM is planning to extend the Tuschenkomst Pit and stormwater management infrastructure, enlarge the footprint of the existing waste rock dump, and establish a communications tower and construct a bridge over the Wilgespruit River. In addition, it is proposed that the provincial P50-1 be diverted around the pit extension area. At this stage of the EIA, a number of possible routes for the road diversion are being considered.





Following our telephone conversation earlier today, this letter serves as formal notification for various mining related Environmental Impact Assessments (EIAs) that will take place in the Moses Kotane Local Municipality of the North West Province. Further detail on the proposed projects is included below and the local setting is illustrated in Appendix A.

1.2. SEDIBELO PLATINUM MINE - CHANGES TO SURFACE INFRASTRUCTURE AT THE MINE

Introduction to the proposed activities

The Itereleng Bakgatla Mineral Resources (IBMR) hold the mining right and are in the process of developing an opencast and underground platinum mine on the farm Wilgespruit 2 JQ. As part of the proposed project, the IBMR plans to reposition and/or redesign the approved infrastructure and include additional infrastructure to better access the ore reserves, particularly in the ore reserves in the eastern portion of the mining right area.

1.3. MAGAZYNSKRAAL PROJECT - ESTABLISHMENT OF AN UNDERGROUND PLATINUM MINING OPERATION

Introduction to the proposed activities

Richtrau No 123 (Pty) Ltd (Richtrau) holds prospecting rights for the farm Magazynskraal 3 JQ. As part of the proposed project, it is planned to submit a mining right application and develop an underground mining operation on Magazynskraal 3 JQ. A this stage various options are being considered for mineral processing, such as: a) utilise infrastructure on the neighbouring Sedibelo Platinum Mine; and b) establish a processing plant and related infrastructure on Magazynskraal 3 JQ.

2. ENVIRONMENTAL PROCESS

SLR Consulting (Africa) (previously Metago Environmental Engineers (Pty) Ltd), an independent consulting firm, has been appointed to conduct the EIAs for these projects. It is planned that the three above-mentioned projects will operate as a combined mining operation, and therefore Metago is proposing to conduct one environmental process to cover the three projects. However, as each mining/prospecting right is currently held by a different party, a separate set of documents will be produced to support each right. In this regard, a scoping report will be produced for each project; PPM will require an EIA/EMP amendment to cater for the extended pit; Sedibelo will require an EIA/EMP amendment to cater for the changes and additions to surface infrastructure; and Magazynskraal will require an EIA/EMP to cater for the proposed activities.

As the landowner for a number of the properties that will be affected by the proposed developments, the Republic of South Africa (care of the Department of Rural Development and Land Reform) will receive all future information and documentation related to the proposed projects.


