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1. INTRODUCTION

Public Participation is one of the most important aspects of the environmental authorisation process. This stems from the requirement that people have the right to be informed about potential decisions that may affect them and that they must be afforded an opportunity to influence those decisions. Effective public participation also improves the ability of the competent authority to make informed decisions and result in improved decision-making as the views of all parties are considered.

The Public Participation Process:

- Provides an opportunity for interested and affected parties (I&AP) to obtain clear, accurate and comprehensive information about the proposed activity, its alternatives or the decisions and the environmental impacts thereof;
- Provides I&AP with an opportunity to indicate their viewpoints, issues and concerns regarding the activity, alternatives and/or the decisions;
- Provides I&AP with the opportunity of suggesting ways of avoiding, reducing or mitigating negative impacts of an activity and for enhancing positive impacts;
- Enables an applicant to incorporate the needs, preferences and values of the affected parties into the activity;
- Provides opportunities to avoid and resolve disputes and reconcile conflicting interests;
- Enhance transparency and accountability in decision making

Public Participation therefore allows interested and affected parties the opportunity to give their viewpoints and influence the process and the decisions of the competent authority.

2. PROCESS FOLLOWED

The following process was undertaken to facilitate the public participation for the proposed project:

2.1 Newspaper Advertisement

Advertisements, notifying the public of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) application and process and requesting I&AP's to register their comments with AGES, was placed in both English and Sepedi in the Daily Sun on the 17th of October 2012 in accordance with regulation 54(2)(c) of the EIA Regulations of 2010.

In addition the availability of the Draft Scoping Report for public review was advertised in the Daily Sun on the 4th of January 2013. The availability of the Draft EIA Report and the Public Meetings to be held on the 20th and 21st of August (refer to Section 3.3 of the EIR) were likewise advertised in the Daily Sun on the 6th of August 2013.

2.2 Site notices

In order to inform surrounding communities and adjacent landowners of the proposed development, notice boards (in accordance with regulation 54(2)(a) and 54(3) of the EIA Regulations were erected at the Mphahlele, Tau-Mankotsana and Barok-Ba-Nkwana Tribal Authorities, as well as the public library in Apel, Gwara-Gwara School in Nkotokwane and the Bopedi Shopping Centre in Apel on the 17th of October 2012

Please note that Public Participation process was started during the Scoping phase of the project, and will extend to the EIA Phase. A final Comments and Response Report, detailing

2.4 Focus Group Meetings

An introductory focus group meeting was held on 24 October 2012 at Nkwe Platinum with representatives from the Mining Committee of the Mphahlele Tribal Authority. Refer to Appendix A9 of the EIR for key notes of the meeting.

2.5 Draft Scoping Report

The EIA Regulations specify that I&AP's must have an opportunity to verify that their issues have been captured. A period of 30 days (4 January 2013 till 4 February 2013) was made available for public comment on the Draft Scoping Report as part of the environmental impact assessment process. The availability of the Draft Scoping Report was announced via personal notification letters to all the registered I&AP's on the distribution list on the 4th of January 2013. The availability of the Draft Scoping Report for review was additionally advertised in the Daily Sun on the 4th of January 2013.

In addition, the Scoping Report was distributed for comment as follows:

- Electronic copies on request; and

2.6 Final Scoping Report

The Comments and Response Report and Scoping Report was updated after the draft review to incorporate the comments received and issues raised by I&APs. The final Scoping Report was made available to I&APs (for 30 days from the 8th of March 2013 till the 9th of April 2013) and the LEDET. Please note that the following statement was included in the review notification:

"Please note that the applicant has recently been granted the prospecting right for the farm Government Ground 503 KS, and subsequently the farm portion was added to the final Scoping Report. No infrastructure is planned for the farm Government Ground 503 KS."

The availability of the Final Scoping Report was announced via personal notification letters to all the registered I&AP's on the distribution list on the 13th of March 2013. In addition, the Scoping Report was distributed for comment as follows:

The availability of the draft EIA Report was announced via personal notification letters to all the registered I&AP's on the distribution list (Refer to Appendix A3 of the Draft EIR). The availability of the Draft EIA Report for review was additionally advertised in the Daily Sun on the 6th of August 2013.

In addition, the EIA Report was distributed for comment as follows:

- Electronic copies on request; and

2.8 Draft EIA Feedback Public Meetings

Public meetings were held on the 20th and 21st of August 2013 at Mr T J Mphahlele's house in Nkotokwane and at the Tau-Mankotsana Community Hall in Apel respectively; to provide I&APs with the opportunity to raise issues and comments and ask specific questions in the presence of the relevant consultants on the project. The public meetings were advertised in the Daily Sun on the 6th of August 2013.

In addition, a focus group meeting was held with the Baroka Ba Nkwana Community on the 12th of October 2013. All the issues raised by I&APs during the public meetings and focus

group meeting were captured in this Comments and Response Report and will be submitted as part of the Final EIR as contemplated in regulation 57(1) of the EIA Regulations (GNR 543 of 18 June 2010). Refer to Appendix A9 of the EIR for the minutes of the meetings.

A period of 30 days will be made available for public comment on the final EIA Report as part of the environmental impact assessment process (from the 1st of November till the 2nd of December 2013). This implies that further research into oral traditions and living heritage attached to sites to be impacted upon by the proposed mining development will undoubtedly be done as the development progresses.

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5. CONCLUSIONS

- Community liaison forum
- Communication with communities
- Traffic Impact
 - Impact on roads and improved access
