


Figure 10: Site notice put up on the notice board at the entrance of the local public library in the town of Postmasburg





Figure 12: Hardcopy of Draft Scoping Report made available at the local public library in the town of Postmasburg











Figure 13: Notification email sent to all identified stakeholders




















Figure 14: Proof of delivery of notification email sent to all identified stakeholders

BirdLife South Africa would like to thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above report. We apologise for missing the deadline for comment.

We have attached the latest version of our draft Guidelines for Birds and Solar Energy and we would be grateful if our recommendations were included in the impact assessment process, as far as possible. From what we can determine from the draft Scoping Report, many of our recommendations have already been taken into consideration. Thank you. We are pleased to note that a bird specialist has been appointed to undertake an avifaunal impact assessment, and that two site visits have been completed so far. We trust that further surveys will inform the final avifaunal impact assessment so that as much seasonal variation as possible is sampled. We are also pleased that the avifaunal assessment has included vantage point surveys, and that consideration will be given to how to manage evaporation ponds to minimise risk to birds.

At this stage it appears that the greatest risk would not be the CSP facility itself, but the associated powerlines. Powelines may present a risk of collisions and electrocution for species including Critically Endangered White-backed Vulture, Greater Flamingo (Near Threatened), Kori Bustard and Black Korhaan. These impacts will need to be carefully assessed and mitigated.

This letter is in response to your email request, dated 30th July 2012, to provide an assessment on the potential development of a photo –voltaic (PV) electricity generation facility, and a concentrated solar power (CSP) electricity generation facility, on the farm Groenwater in the Northern Cape Province, and the risk it may pose on the Square Kilometre Array Project.

A high level risk assessment has been conducted at the South African SKA Project Office to determine the potential impact of such facilities on the Square Kilometre Array. This letter serves to confirm the outcomes of the risk assessment, and proposals for any future investigations associated with this facility.

- i. The location of the proposed facilities, co-located on the same farm, has been by Enviroworks at the following approximate coordinates: 28deg 17' 50"S, 23deg 17' 25.50" E. The nearest SKA station is identified as Rem-Opt-8, at an approximate distance of 80km;
- Based on distance to the nearest SKA station, and the information currently available on the detailed design of the PV installation, this facility poses a very low risk of detrimental impact on the SKA;
- Based on distance to the nearest SKA station, and the information currently available on the detailed design of the CSP installation, this facility poses a very low risk of detrimental impact on the SKA;
- iv. Any transmitters that are to be established, or have been established, at the site for the purposes of voice and data communication will be required to comply with the relevant AGA regulations concerning the restriction of use of the radio frequency spectrum that applies in the area concerned;

v. As a result of the very low risk associated with both the PV and CSP facility on the farm Groenwater, no mitigation measures would be required at this stage. However, the South African SKA Project Office would like to be kept informed of progress with this project, and reserves the right to further risk assessments at a later stage.
