


Figure 2: Site notice put up on the notice board at the main entrance of the local municipality building in the town of Prieska




Figure 3: Site notice put up on the notice board at the entrance of the local public library in the town of Prieska






Figure 9: Hardcopy of draft Scoping Report made available at the local public library in the town of Prieska GPS coordinates: 29°40'9.16"S 22°44'52.08"E











Figure 10 Notification email sent to all identified stakeholders



















































Figure 11: Proof of delivery of notification email sent to all identified stakeholders

1. DEPARTMENTAL MANDATE

The Directorate: Forestry Management (Other Regions) in the Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF) is responsible for implementation of the National Forests Act, Act 84 of 1998 (NFA) and the National Veld and Forest Fires Act, Act 101 of 1998 as amended. The developer must take note of the following sections of the NFA:

- 1.1 Section 12(1): "The Minister may declare-
 - (a) a particular tree,
 - (b) a particular group of trees.
 - (c) a particular woodland; or
 - (d) trees belonging to a particular species, to be a protected tree, group of trees, woodland or species.
- 1.2 Section 15(1): "No person may-
 - (a) Cut, disturb, damage or destroy any protected tree; or
 - (b) Possess, collect, remove, transport, export, purchase, sell, donate or in any other manner acquire or dispose of any protected tree, or any forest product derived from a protected tree, except-
 - (i) under a license granted by the Minister; or
 - (ii) in terms of an exemption from the provision of this subsection published by the Minister in the Gazette on the advice of the Council."

- 1.3 "Any person who contravenes the prohibition on-
 - The cutting, disturbance, damage or destruction of temporarily protected trees or groups of trees referred to in section 14(2) or protected trees referred to in section 15(1)(a); or
 - (ii) The possession, collection, removal, transport, export, purchase or sale of temporarily protected trees or groups of trees referred to in section 14(2) or protected trees referred to in section 15(1)(b), or any forest product derived from a temporarily protected tree, group of trees or protected tree, is guilty of a first category offence.
- 1.4 Section 58 (1): "Any person who is guilty of a first category offence referred to in sections 62 and 63 may be sentenced to a fine or imprisonment for a period of up to three years, or to both a fine and such imprisonment."
- 1.5 The list of protected tree species under section 12(1) (d) of the National Forests Act, 1998 (Act No. 84 of 1998) was published in GN1161 of 20 November 2015.

2. COMMENTS ON DRAFT SCOPING REPORT AND ECOLOGICAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT


- **2.1** The reports refer to the site location falling in a Critical Biodiversity Area, thus it is recommended that written comments be obtained from Nature Conservation.
- 2.2 Two pipeline alternatives were assessed, but little information was provided about the intactness of the vulnerable riparian vegetation at the proposed water abstraction points next to the Orange River. Please give an indication of the condition of the riparian vegetation at the proposed water abstraction points and provide a list of plant species encountered at these two sites. What impacts will installation of a pump station and pipeline have on the riparian vegetation? It should be noted that nationally protected trees such Euclea pseudebenus (Ebony tree) and provincially protected tree species such as Olea europaea subsp. africana and Combretum erythrophyllum are often associated with the (Lower) Gariep Alluvial vegetation and although unlikely, may also be encountered in the vicinity of Prieska. If present on site and affected by the proposed development, it should be included in the license and permit applications.
- 2.3 The reports confirmed the presence of ± 20 Boscia albitrunca trees in the area earmarked for the vineyard, as well as other provincially protected plant species. The Department supports the recommendation that these species be left intact as far as possible, but where it cannot be avoided, a NFA License and Flora Permit must be applied for and obtained prior to any disturbance.
