






Site 1 – Bosveld Farm 24°57'52"S 27°13'37"E






Site 2 – Spitskop Farm 24°58'16"S 27°9'47"E

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Free, accredited online learning helps high schoolers improve grades

RUSTENBURG HERALD - RUSTENBURG - Worried the high school learners you know are being held back by all the teaching interruptions of the pandemic over the past two years? It's not too late for them to catch up and prepare themselves for better exam results. And it doesn't cost a cent.

A joint programme of the Western Cape Education Department (WCED) and Stellenbosch University, called the Telematics Schools Project (TSP), is extending online learning support for learners at Basic Education Department high schools in grades 10 to 12 countrywide, with content presented in English and Afrikaans. It's free

to register and, what's more, requires no data.

To access course work in 18 subjects, from languages (English, Afrikaans and isiXhosa) to Mathematics, Physical Sciences, Accounting, History, Geography and more, all learners need to do is register with the zerorated Telematics Schools Project website. Just a personal email address is required.

Once registered, learners will have instant access to live-streamed online teaching or, if more convenient, to recorded versions of the lessons, which they can work though in their own time and at their own pace. They can return to lessons as often as they need until they feel they are sufficiently familiar with the work.

They have access to all the lesson videos, workbooks, revision programmes and course content summaries, including other materials such as infographics, as well as practice exam papers to help them make up for all the teaching and learning time lost since 2020.

Content is quality assured by WCED senior curriculum planners. The system is open to all grade 10 to 12 high school goers across the country.

Online access is also available via Facebook, but then users need their own data.

Many high schools across the country have already signed up with the project, but in these cases content is viewed by the whole class at once, explains Zainab Suliman of Stellenbosch University's Centre for Learning Technologies. Ms Suliman is the deputy director of the centre's operations, telematics services and projects, and manages the TSP. Dr Glynis Schreuder, chief education specialist: Curriculum FET (Further Education and Training) and project manager of the TSP at the WCED explains; "We are thrilled by the number of schools taking advantage of the facility and we are receiving excellent feedback about how much it is helping learners to master the curriculum and also to recover possible curriculum losses/deficits resulting from the rotational timetabling during the pandemic. In the classroom they can watch live-streamed content and participate interactively, or they can watch recorded sessions timed to suit the school programme. "We encourage all grade 10 to 12 learners to register individually to benefit further. Even if they are participating at school, if they register individually they can return to work covered in their own time and engage with the recorded broadcasts as often as they need to."

She adds that, in addition to the broadcasts of lessons covering specific topics, quarterly revision programmes are also provided. "The revision programme summarises each term's work to help learners further familiarise themselves with the syllabus. We understand the many life pressures learners face. We want them to be able to integrate the use of this condensed content into their daily realities as effectively as possible."

The TSP also gives registered users access to life skills workshops and videos, along with information on presentation skills, work readiness, preparing for job interviews, how to write a curriculum vitae, and even how to enhance personal mental health
