NOTIFICATION OF REVISED BASIC ASSESSMENT REPORT AVAILABLE FOR REVIEW AND COMMENT

Gunstfontein Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd would like to provide for the installation of a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) at the authorised Gunstfontein Wind Energy Facility (WEF) (DEA Ref 14/12/16/3/3/2/826) in the Northern Cape Province. The BESS is proposed to be located near to the WEF substation and will be up to 4ha in total extent. MV cabling (33kV or less) will connect the BESS to the substation.

An access road to the BESS of up 8m in width will be developed. The BESS is envisaged to become an integral component of the authorised Gunstfontein WEF which is located on the remainder of Farm Gunstfontein 131, near Sutherland.

The proposed BESS project will consist of:

- A Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) inside containers or similar housing structures with a footprint of up to 4ha in extent.
- ~8m wide access road to the BESS (which will branch off the WEF roads to the BESS).
- Medium Voltage cabling (below ground or overhead) between the BESS and substation.
- Fencing around the BESS.
- Possible firebreak (i.e. vegetation trimmed low) or 4m wide road around the BESS, inside the fencing.
- 4ha laydown area within the BESS footprint.

An area of ~500m around the boundary of the facility substation (assessment area) was assessed, to allow for the optimization of the placement of the BESS anywhere within this assessment area. This assessment area allows for the assessment of several location alternatives for the BESS and owing to the continuously advancing and emerging BESS technologies, there are several alternatives that can be considered for the BESS technology.

BASIC ASSESSMENT PROCESS

The proposed developments are subject to the requirements of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations of 2014 published in terms of Section 24(5) of NEMA. In terms of the EIA Regulations of 2014, as amended, and promulgated under Sections 24 and 24D of the NEMA, various aspects of the project are listed as activities that may have an impact on the environment. Due to the triggering of GNR 327, Listing Notice 1, Activities 27, 28 and GNR 327, Listing Notice 3, Activities 4(g)(ii)(ee) and 12(g)(ii) amongst others, of the EIA Regulations 2014 (as amended), a Basic Assessment process must be undertaken in order to obtain Environmental Authorisation for the construction and operation of the Gunstfontein BESS for the Gunstfontein Wind Farm.

Savannah Environmental was appointed as the independent environmental consultant to undertake the Basic Assessment and public participation process for the project to identify and assess all potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed upgrades and recommend appropriate mitigation measures in the Environmental Management Programme (EMPr).

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PROCESS

The public participation (PP) process will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of Regulations 39 to 44 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2014, as amended, (GNR 326). The aim of the public participation process is primarily to ensure that:

- » information containing all relevant facts in respect of the proposed project is made available to potential stakeholders and I&APs
- » participation by I&APs is facilitated in such a manner that all potential stakeholders and I&APs are provided with a reasonable opportunity to comment on the proposed project; and
- » comments received from potential stakeholders and I&APs are recorded and incorporated into the EIA process.

The restrictions enforced in terms of Government Gazette 43096 which placed the country in a national state of disaster limiting the movement and gathering of people to curb the spread of the COVID-19 virus has placed some limitations on how public consultation can be conducted as part of a BA process. The consultation process for these projects has been designed considering these limitations, and the implementation is in line with our public participation plan (PP Plan), as approved by the Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF). Our PP Plan is in compliance with the DEFF Directions issued on the 5th of June 2020. One of our approved consultation methods is for you to visit our online stakeholder engagement platform, register your interest in the project/s, and view project documentation: visit https://www.savannahsa.com/public-documents/energy-generation/gunstfontein-wind-energy-facility/.

Alternative means of undertaking consultation have been designed to ensure that I&APs are afforded sufficient opportunity to raise comments on the project, predominately through an interactive web-based platform readily available and accessible to any person with interest in the project, enabling the public participation process to be undertaken in line with Regulations 41 to 44 of the EIA Regulations, 2014, as amended. This online stakeholder engagement platform allows the EAP to visually present details regarding the project and our consultation documentation, including project maps and plans, presentations and posters regarding the project, and reports available for review. The use of online tools enables stakeholders and I&APs to explore the project-specific content in their own time, and allows participation in the consultation process in a meaningful way. The online platform allows for instant feedback and comments to be submitted, in so doing saving

time for the stakeholder and also giving the assurance that their comments have been submitted for inclusion in the project reporting.

Your Department, which you represents as a commenting Official, has been identified as an Organ of State in terms of the EIA Regulations, 2014, as amended, Regulation 41.(2)(b)(iii) to (v) for the proposed project as described above.

AVAILABILITY OF REVISED BASIC ASSESSMENT REPORTS FOR REVIEW AND COMMENT

A Basic Assessment Report (BAR) for the project has been compiled and was made available for public review and comment from Friday, 14 October 2020 to Monday, 16 November 2020. Following further layout refinements by the applicant, a <u>revised BAR</u> in which these refinements of the layout has been included is available for a 30-day review and comment period from **Friday**, **11 December 2020** until **Monday**, **01 February 2020**. The <u>revised BAR</u> is available for download from our website / stakeholder engagement platform on the above-mentioned link and the release code is: **q9'wHP**.

All comments received during the previous BAR review and comments period have been included in the updated comments and responses report which is included as **Appendix C6** of the <u>revised</u> BAR. All written comments received during this review period will be recorded and included in the Final BAR for submission to the DEFF in line with Regulation 44 of the EIA Regulations, 2014, as amended (GN R326).

The restrictions enforced in terms of Government Gazette 43096 which placed the country in a national state of disaster limiting the movement and gathering of people to curb the spread of the COVID-19 virus has placed some limitations on making hard copies of the BARs available at public places such as libraries and municipal offices. Gunstfontein Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd would like to provide for the installation of a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) at the authorised Gunstfontein Wind Energy Facility (WEF) (DEA Ref 14/12/16/3/3/2/826) in the Northern Cape Province. The BESS is proposed to be located near to the WEF substation and will be up to 4ha in total extent. MV cabling (33kV or less) will connect the BESS to the substation. An access road to the BESS of up 8m in width will be developed. The BESS is envisaged to become an integral component of the authorised Gunstfontein WEF which is located on the remainder of Farm Gunstfontein 131, near Sutherland.

The proposed BESS project will consist of:

- A Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) inside containers or similar housing structures with a footprint of up to 4ha in extent.




