## INTRODUCTION

The Public Participation Process (PPP) forms an integral part of the rectification application process. It provides people with the opportunity to raise their issues and concerns about the proposed Nursing college and student accommodation development in Kimberley, Northern Cape Province. A comprehensive public participation process was conducted by EMG Consultants, to ensure that all identified Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) were informed of the proposed project and their input is able to influence decision-making process with regards to the development.

## APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY

The Public Participation Process was conducted as per Regulation 39, 40, 41, 42, 43 & 44 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations 2014 (as amended 07 April 2017) and the Public Participation Guidelines, 2017 were considered. 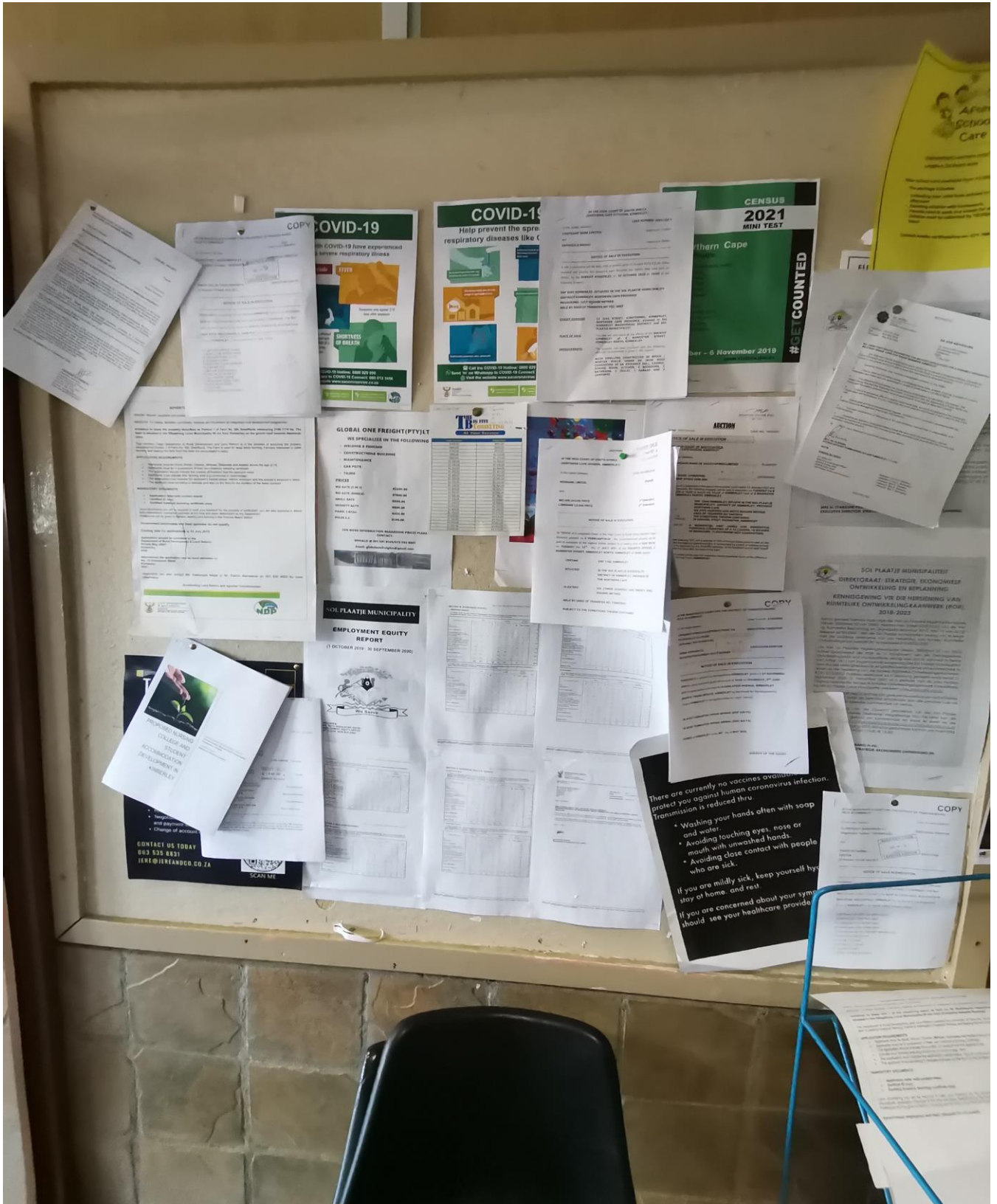

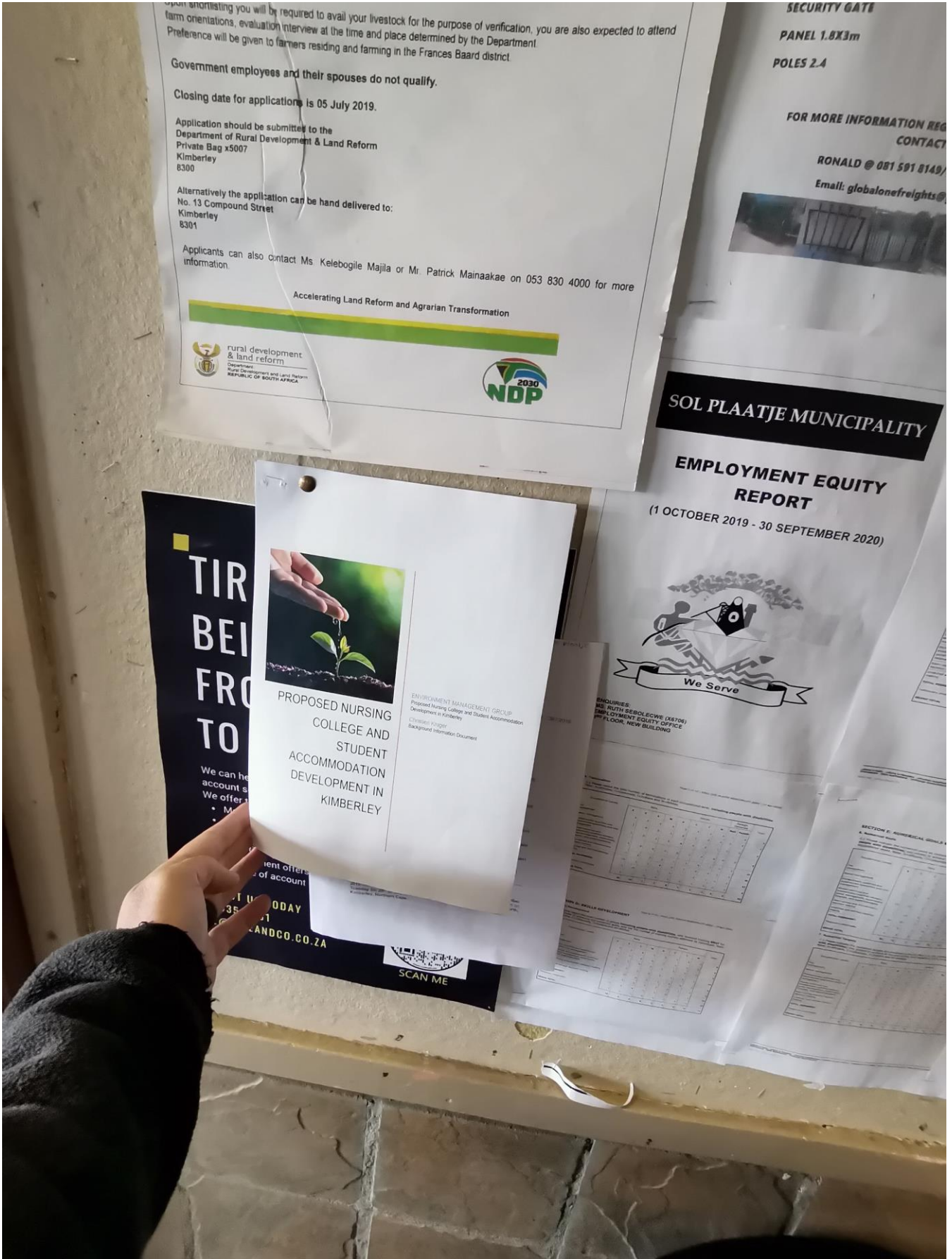

### INTRODUCTION

Environmental Management Group is applying for Environmental Authorisation on behalf of the Department of Roads and Public Works Northern Cape for the proposed Nursing College phase two (2) and the Student Accommodation Development.

### LOCALITY

The development will take place in Kimberley on remaining extent of Erf Number 42654 which falls under the Sol Plaatje Local Municipality, in the Northern Cape Province.

### ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION

Prior to the commencement of the proposed development, Environmental Authorisation in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA), 107 of 1998, as amended 7 April 2017 is required from the competent authority (DENC). The Environmental Assessment Process will be conducted in terms of the 2014 NEMA environmental impact assessment (EIA) Regulations, GNR 326 as amended.

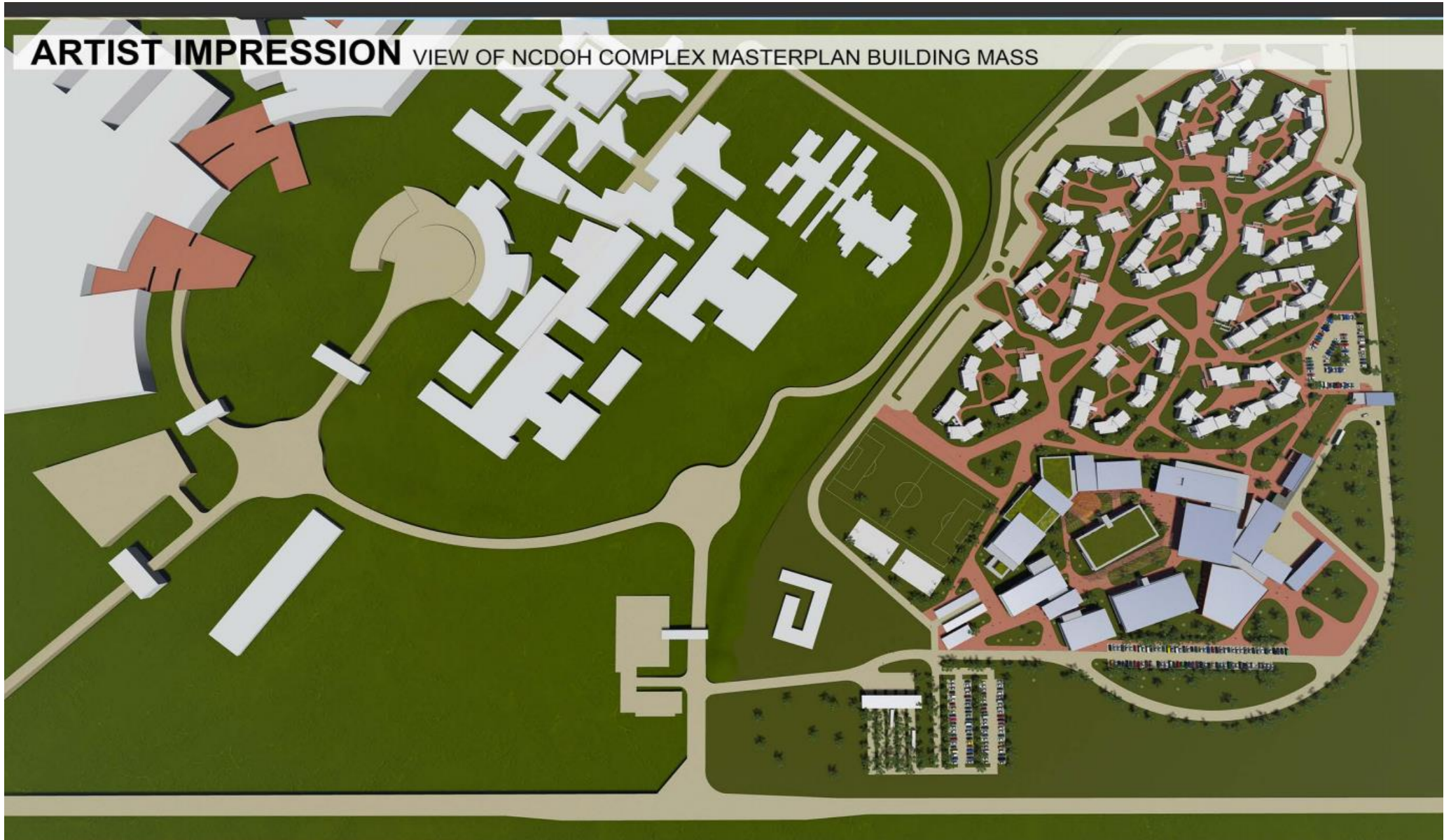

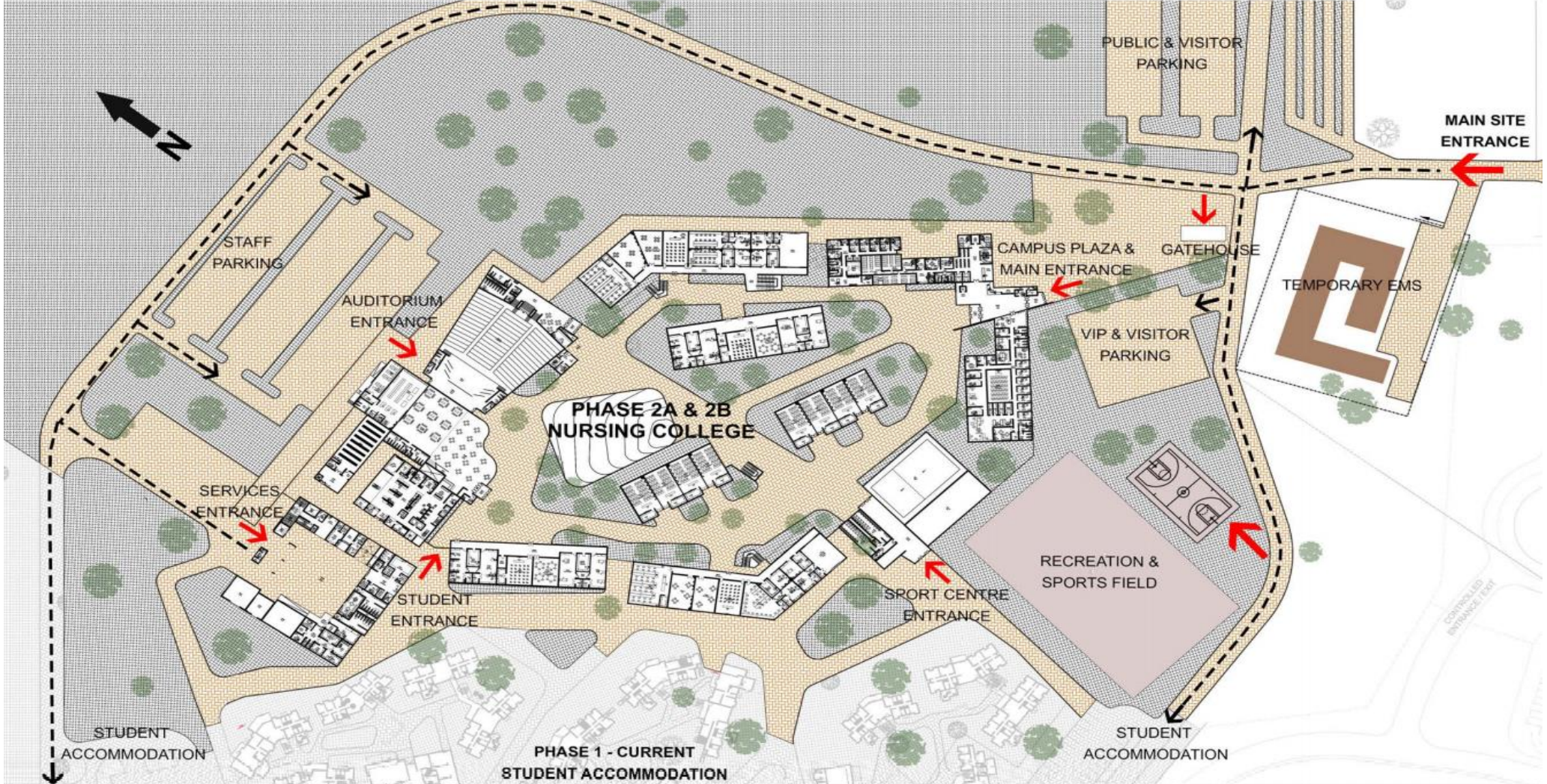

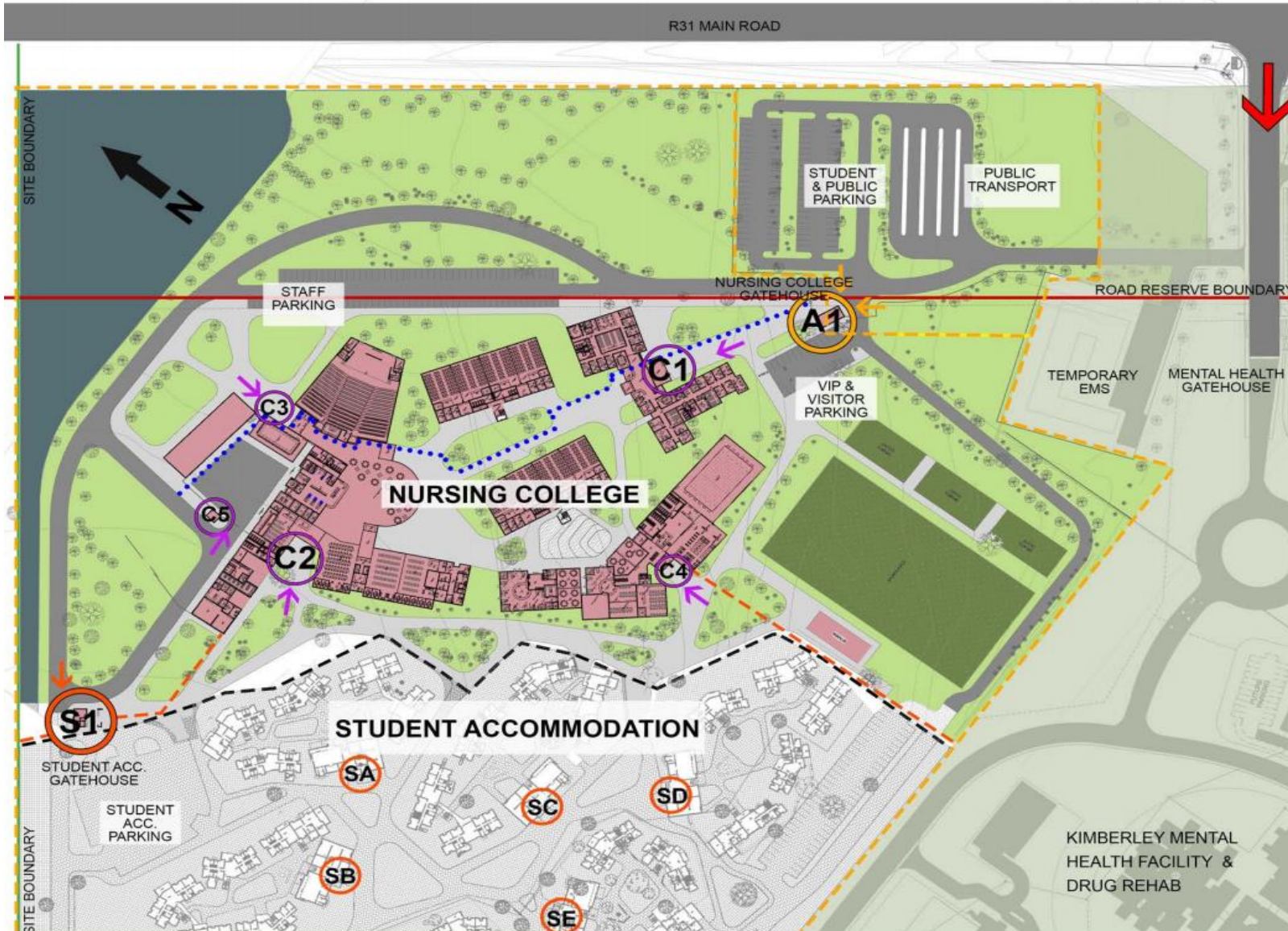
# SITEPLAN PHASE 2A & 2B

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Environmental Management Group is applying for Environmental Authorization on behalf of the Northern Cape Department: Roads and Public Works for the development as mentioned above. The development is situated in the southern parts of Kimberley, which falls within the Sol Plaatje Municipality. Construction of the Kimberley nursing college phase two (2) is underway on the remaining extent of Erf Number 42654. The nursing college is nearest to Kimberley and immediately south of the R31 route from Kimberley to Daniëlskuil and next to the Kimberley Mental Health Hospital. The development will accommodate the educational facility and housing of approximately 600 students. The college will include various simulation, instruction, and academic classrooms to learn in a safe and controlled environment (Figure designs/layout). The college will additionally incorporate spaces for both sport and recreation.

Environmental Authorization in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA), 107 of 1998, as amended 7 April 2017 is required from the competent authority (DENC). According to the National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998) as amended 7 April 2017, Listing Notice 1 (NO. 327, 07 APRIL 2017) – R 327 the following activity applicable to this project:

**R327: Activity 27** The clearance of an area of 1 hectare or more, but less than 20 hectares of indigenous vegetation, except where such clearance of indigenous vegetation is required for-  
(i) the undertaking of a linear activity; or  
(ii) maintenance purposes undertaken in accordance with a maintenance management plan.

The Nursing College will require the establishment of the following infrastructure:

- ♣ Cafeteria/ Support services – 1000sqm
- ♣ Laundry- 300sqm
- ♣ Kitchen- 600sqm
- ♣ Convenience shop- 340sqm
- ♣ Auditorium- 1400sqm
- ♣ Administration buildings- 1870sqm
- ♣ 4 Simulation buildings- 3740sqm
- ♣ Academic instruction buildings- 1000sqm
- ♣ Sports center- 1200sqm
- ♣ Student parking
- ♣ Sports field
- ♣ Clinic
- ♣ 24hr computer lab

The Kimberley mental health hospital is situated immediately south of the proposed development. The Kimberley mental health hospital has obtained its own environmental authorization. The development of the nursing college phase two (2) and student accommodation requires its own environmental authorization separate of the already obtained EA for the Kimberley mental health hospital.

**Waste:** The proponent is taking necessary steps to ensure that waste generated through the proposed development will be properly disposed of. The fact that no hazardous or medical waste will be produced by the facility is also reassuring from an environmental and public health perspective. It's important to note, however, that even non-hazardous waste can have a negative impact on the environment if it's not properly disposed of. The proponent must outline how waste will be collected, transported, and disposed of in compliance with local regulations and best practices.

The Architect's designs concerning the sewer layout/ sewer reticulation system of the proposed development (Kimberley nursing college phase two) and these infrastructure of the designs are designed in a such a manner that will relatively limit a serious harm to the environment, particularly if it is not handled properly. A sewer reticulation system helps to prevent the release of hazardous waste into the environment, protecting natural resources like waterways, soil, and air. And the implementation of an effective sewer reticulation system can help reduce the costs associated with hazardous waste management, by minimizing the volume of hazardous waste that needs to be transported and disposed of off-site, a facility can save on transportation and disposal costs.

The Sol Plaatje Local Municipality will most likely play a fundamental role in the approval of the steps that will be taken to ensure that waste is disposed of in an environmentally sustainable manner. The proponent needs to work closely with the local municipality to ensure that the waste generated by the proposed development is handled in an environmentally responsible and sustainable way. This will help to minimize the impact of the facility on the environment and promote the health and well-being of the local community

**Water:** The proponent is taking necessary steps to ensure that the water needs for the proposed development will be met sustainably. Drilling additional boreholes and building a backup storage reservoir will give support to ensure a reliable supply of water for the proposed development while using borehole water for non-potable uses like watering gardens and sports fields can help to reduce the demand for potable water. The proponent will be obtaining approval from the local municipality and a relevant water use license authorization for this activity. This indicates that the proponent is taking the necessary steps to comply with local regulations and best practices for water management.

According to the new designs for the Kimberley nursing college phase two (2), Architects have taken comprehensive steps to ensure storm water management is taken into account in the designs of the proposed development. Storm water runoff can be a major source of pollution and environmental damage, so it is important to manage it properly by incorporating the design features from the architects and the designs can significantly minimize the environmental impacts of the proposed development and ensure the long-term sustainability of the water supply.

Environmental features: Several camel thorn trees on the site will have to be removed due to the development. A DAFF permit will be applied for the removal of these trees. There exists a storm water channel on the north western border of the site. A comprehensive storm water plan and a flood delineation will be included in the basic assessment report. Eskom will supply the electricity for the facility.
