1.	The Ecological Scoping Report included in the Draft Scoping Report for review was for the proposed Gihon Solar Energy Facility. The vegetation type applicable to the Kison facility is Polokwane Plateau Bushveld and it is not considered applicable that an ecological study near Bela-Bela is applicable for the site.	Noted. This copy of the report provided for review incorrectly included a copy for the Gihon Solar Energy facility near Bela-Bela. The findings of the Kison ecological report are however included in the draft Scoping Report which was provided for review. A copy of the ecological Scoping Report will be forwarded to the Department.
2.	The visual impact of a photovoltaic solar energy facility at a site between two busy roads would be preferred compared to site alternatives in aesthetically more scenic areas. The possibility of reflections off the panels and where these could in any way result in hazard to road users would however have to be confirmed.	Noted. The potential for reflection thereby impacting on road users is not considered to be a significant potential impact due to the height of the panels and the absorptive capacity of the panels (i.e. the panels do not reflect light). The potential for this impact to occur will however be addressed in the EIA phase.
