Jan Combrink dies

Tributes pour in after the death of a well-known retired judge

Condolences have been pouring in following the death of well-known retired Judge Jan Combrink, who died on Wednesday afternoon.

His son, Laurence Combrink, said a number of people have referred to his father as a legend of his time because of the work he had done and his passion for law.

He said many judges, advocates and other people held him in high regard.

“His absolute love for people is one of the things that people will remember him for. He listened and respected everyone regardless of their race or anything else,” said Laurence.

Combrink, who grew up in South Africa’s Kalahari Desert, retired seven years ago when he was 78 years old.

He stayed in the province for the case of the cash heist gang, well-known as “KZN 26”, who were part of two robberies involving Fidelity Guards near Kwambonambi on the

N2 in 2006.

Laurence said after his father finished the trial, the gang asked to speak to him.

“They actually thanked him for a fair trial. That’s the kind of person my father was, that even a notorious gang was able to thank him for being fair,” said Laurence.

He said Combrink finished his LLB degree in Potchefstroom and became a state advocate.

He was later moved to KZN from Pretoria to learn English since he couldn’t speak the language as an Afrikaans man.

“He continued to stay in the province because he loved it and became one of the best advocates. He became a judge in 1989,” said Laurence.

Retired senior advocate, Dorian Paver, said Combrink was endowed with gifts which set him apart from normal folk. He added he was privileged to appear before him during his tenure as a judge.

“He had the resource of endless

patience and possibly the most prodigious memory of any person I have encountered. He had no need for a law library, it was all stored in his outstanding mind.

“As a judge he treated all who appeared before him with respect and dignity. He tolerated in the most amiable way the foibles of those who were wont to bumble. He went out of

this way to promote collegiality particularly when we were doing duty in a circuit court,” said Paver.

He added that Combrink never held himself out to be so important that one could not approach him.

He said he truly believes that justice was done without fail in his court and that his judgments were always the product of intense deliberation and were models of judicial craftsmanship.

Lorna Skead, who worked with Combrink for 23 years, said he was one of the smartest men she knew and he was truly one of the best judges of all time.

“He was loved by all and any legal practitioner who knew him would say that he taught them so much and commanded their respect with his knowledge of the law, among other things,” said Skead.

She said he was a humble man and his passion was law, fishing and hunting. She said he was her mentor, best friend and was like a father to her.

Dube-Ncube says 72 people are still missing after April floods in KZN

Seventy-two people are still missing since the KwaZulu-Natal flood disasters of April and May this year.

This was revealed by KZN premier Nomusa Dube-Ncube during a media briefing in Durban yesterday where she gave a detailed update on the progress made on the interventions to assist communities and families that were affected by the floods.

Dube-Ncube said there are still 72 missing people.

She said DNA services are being rendered with the support of the SAPS, and recently eight DNA results came back with positive results.

“We are aware that some families are seeking closure, taking into consideration all the sensitivities and emotional issues around this matter,” she said.

According to news reports, by June, the death toll from the devastating floods in KZN was sitting at 461.

The floods caused extensive damage to infrastructure and disrupted a number of services in many areas.

The premier said in the past seven months, several teams have been hard at work to restore services.

“We wish to report that all areas where power was disconnected have since been restored and are 100%

back to normal.”

She said most of the water services have been restored since the flood disasters.

“Teams continue to work tirelessly to rebuild the water schemes that were completely washed away.”

She said the restoration of the uThongathi Water Treatment Works was completed on October 27, and water has been restored in most parts of Tongaat and surrounding affected areas.

In some areas, Dube-Ncube said

that impacted the northern beaches. She said work is also under way at the Northern Wastewater Treatment Works, which is the facility that was impacting the central beaches.

She reassured all those planning to visit Durban during the festive season that all the beaches will be open by the end of November.

Human settlement interventions
Dube-Ncube said there has been progress in moving flood victims out of mass-care centres into “dignified accommodation”.

Following the devastating floods, she said the national Department of Human Settlements granted R325 764 million from the provincial emergency housing grant for the provision of temporary and emergency housing.

To-date, Dube-Ncube said more than R98 million has been spent in the first tranche of the allocated R325 million, and 206 families have since been relocated to decent temporary emergency accommodation facilities as of the beginning of this week.

Roads rehabilitation
The premier said KZN suffered road infrastructure damages as a result of

the floods amounting to R5,7 billion. This translates to 1 372 flood damaged projects. The damage experienced ranged from pipe culvert damage, washaways and even damages to bridge structures.

She said an amount totalling R2,9 billion was made available to attend to flood damage in all affected districts in the province.

“To date more than 80% of the roads allocated for rehabilitation by Operation Siyazenzela have been completed,” she said.

Update on flood-damaged schools
Of the total of 356 schools that were damaged by the floods, the premier said 46 have been completed, 123 are at construction stage, and 187 are undergoing procurement. She said a total of 76 mobile classrooms have been installed in 29 schools in the province.

“Those under construction will be completed before the end of February 2023. Sites for 157 of the 187 schools are anticipated to be handed over before the end of November 2022. The balance of the 187 schools will be under construction in the first quarter of the 2023/24 financial year.”

Order granted to forfeit Mercedes of man accused of looting at Woolies

The Asset Forfeiture Unit (AFU) in KwaZulu-Natal on Wednesday obtained a forfeiture order in respect of a Mercedes Benz C300 coupé belonging to Mboso Moloi.

He is currently facing charges of theft and public violence, relating to the looting of a Woolworths store in

the Glenwood area in July 2021 during the acts of public violence and looting that took place in various parts of KwaZulu-Natal.

Natasha Ramkisson-Kara, spokesperson for the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), said the car which was forfeited on the basis that it is

an instrumentality of the offences, was valued at about R500 000 at the time of the offence. Since the vehicle is still under purchase agreement from a bank, the vehicle will be handed over to the bank in due course.

Ramkisson-Kara said the criminal matter against Moloi is set down for

trial from March 27 to 31, 2023.

He is currently out on bail of R5 000 with reporting conditions.

The AFU said it welcomes this development as it reinforces the NPA’s strategy to focus not only on prosecutions, but also on taking away assets where they are proven to be

instrumental to the commission of crime.

“In terms of Chapter 6 of Poca, such recoveries are not reliant on convictions at the end of a trial and can be an effective deterrent against crime,” said the AFU.

NO ACTION TAKEN AGAINST JUDGE WHO FAILED TO DELIVER JUDGMENT AFTER 10 YEARS

On December 12, 2012, judge Anton Van Zyl reserved judgment in a matter at the Pietermaritzburg high court, KwaZulu-Natal division. Ten years later, the judgment has still not been delivered.

The matter concerns an application brought by financial company Allan Gray about its interest in a gambling license. In its last annual report, for 2020-21, the KwaZulu-Natal Gambling and Betting Board said:

“The board is opposing the matter, the parties are awaiting an interlocutory ruling.
“However, the matter is now moot and we are seeking a settlement on the matter. The anticipated costs for counsel is R50 000.”

According to the last available reserved judgment report for the chief justice, this matter is the longest outstanding judgment in the country.

GroundUp previously reported that the Supreme Court of Appeal sharply rebuked judge Van Zyl over a delayed judgment. He took four years to rule in favour of a company for damages after a strike.

We also previously reported that judges Anton Van Zyl, Siraj Desai, and Jacqueline Henriques had been reported to the Judicial Service Commission because of the high numbers of outstanding reserved judgments.

The Office of the Chief Justice (OCJ) told GroundUp that the judgment is still outstanding. Judge Van Zyl retired in August 2021.

“The office of the acting judge president has referred the matter of all late judgments by the judge to the Judicial Conduct Committee for their intervention,” the OCJ said.

The JSC oversees both the judicial conduct committee and the judicial

complaints committee.”

However, advocate Sesi Baloyi SC, spokesperson for the Judicial Service Commission (JSC) told GroundUp that no complaint had been lodged.

“No complaint has been lodged against retired judge Van Zyl relating to outstanding judgments.

“As a result, there is no complaint being considered by the judicial complaints committee (JCC) at this stage. Any information to you from the OCJ that any complaint has been referred to the JCC is mistaken.

“To date, the JSC has not been successful in obtaining information from retired judge Van Zyl,” Baloyi told GroundUp.

Mbekezeli Benjamin, researcher at Judges Matter, an organisation that monitors

the appointment of judges and the governance of the judiciary, said that on retirement, resignation or even suspension, “a judge has a duty to finalise

all cases they have already heard, including handing down all outstanding judgments.”

Two KwaZulu-Natal police officers dismissed for taking bribes

Two traffic police officers have been dismissed for allegedly being involved in soliciting bribes from truck drivers.

The two members of the Road Traffic Inspectorate (RTI) based in Newcastle were dismissed by the Department of Transport after a long investigation, which dates back to 2018/19.

In a statement, the department said the two were caught in possession of money believed to have been obtained through the proceeds of crime, where they were taking money from truck drivers and allowing them to continue with their journey, despite violations.

“Their case is going to be enrolled in court after it was temporarily struck off the roll pending more investigation and evidence,” read the statement.

It said the dismissed traffic officers were arrested after the work of a task team including the Public Transport Enforcement Services, SAPS Crime Intelligence and Newcastle SAPS.

“The investigation in Newcastle on the allegations of irregularities in the driver license testing centre (DLTC) has to date, resulted in the six examiners being charged.

“Some of them are charged for issuing learner’s licenses to foreign nationals, which the department has since cancelled,” read the statement.

According to the department, these arrests follow the arrest of three suspects in Hammarsdale a week ago, who are believed to have been writing learner’s licences on behalf of the applicants in exchange for money.

MEC for Transport, Community Safety and Liaison, Siphso Hlomuka, said the department is taking a tough stance against traffic officials involved in taking bribes.

“Those traffic officers who are accepting bribes are undermining provincial efforts of fighting the scourge of fatalities on the road and have no place in our department. The fact that the two of them are now dismissed is an indication that we are very serious about rooting out rotten apples within our ranks.

“We [are focusing on] truck drivers, considering the alarming levels of accidents. As we are approaching the festive season, we are firmly focused on dealing with drivers who are violating the law. Our plan is to reduce the levels of crashes and fatalities. To achieve this, we need ethical, dedicated traffic officials with high moral values,” said Hlomuka. — Witness Reporter.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU GET ‘SSSPAT’ ON NOSIPHO GUMEDE

It’s the season for Mozambique spitting cobras’ and snake catcher Nick Evans shared tips and on what to do if one of these slithering spitters gets venom into your eyes.

In the past few days, the snake catcher has caught quite a few in Durban and surrounding areas.

Evans said he caught one under a couch in Reservoir Hills on Monday. “Last night, I removed an 80 cm one from a property in Westville. A few reports of dogs being spat at, after approaching the snake, have also come in. Yesterday, a man in Zwellobomvu, west of Durban, called to ask for advice after he got a spray of venom in his eyes,” said Evans.

He said the man was moving some sand in the garden, uncovering and surprising the snake, and that’s when it spat at him.

According to Evans, Mozambique Spitting Cobras do not look for trouble. They look for toads mostly, and shelter, however, should one get spat at, this is what you must do:

- Rinse your eyes out for a few minutes with water.
- You can also use some eye drops.
- Go see a doctor for a check-up.

Evans said owners must follow the same procedure for their pets and take them to the vet.

He added that people should move slowly away from the snake should they encounter one and phone a professional immediately for help, while keeping an eye on it from a safe distance of five metres or more. He also urged members of the public not to attack snakes.

DURBAN PUPIL (14) RUSHED TO HOSPITAL AFTER STABBING

A 14-year-old boy was rushed to hospital yesterday morning after he was stabbed by a fellow pupil at a Durban school.

Emer-G-Med spokesperson Kyle van Reenen said at around 9 am yesterday, paramedics responded to reports of a stabbing at a high school in the Greyville area.

“Reports from the scene are that a 14-year-old [pupil] sustained a stab wound to his right hand during an altercation with a group of fellow [pupils].”

He said the boy was rushed to a nearby hospital. The KZN Education Department is yet to comment on the matter. KwaZulu-Natal police spokesperson Constable Thenjiswa Ngcobo said no case has been reported to the Berea SAPS and Durban Central Police.


