Lidwala Consulting Engineers (SA) (Pty) Ltd (Lidwala SA) has been appointed by CEF (SOC) Ltd to conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) in terms of Government Notices GNR 543, 544 and 545 of the National Environmental Management Act, Act No. 107 of 1998, (NEMA). The proposed 1 GW Upington Solar Park is registered with the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) under reference number DEA 14/12/16/3/3/2/588.

The proposed project includes the development of a Solar Park in the //Khara Hais municipal area (Upington) in the Northern Cape Province. The Solar Park will need to be big enough to generate 1 GW of solar electricity. The larger site under investigation for the proposed Solar Park covers an approximate area of over 5011 ha, however, the final shape and design of the footprint is still to be determined during conceptual engineering and design. The appended Background Information Document (BID) contains more information on the proposed Solar Park project – see attached.

CEF (SOC) Ltd must obtain an environmental authorisation and all applicable and required licences before commencing with the construction of the proposed project as required in terms of the provisions of the NEMA and applicable legislation. In order to obtain the relevant authorisation and licences for the proposed Solar Park, an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) needs to be undertaken.

In terms of Section 21 (b), (c), (e), (f), (g) and (i) of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act No. 36 of 1998) (NWA), the proposed Solar Park and associated infrastructure will also require an Integrated Water Use Licence (IWUL).

The project team would like to invite you, as an interested and/or affected party (I&AP), to become part of the EIA and public participation (PP) processes for the proposed project. The aim of this process is to ensure that the environmental impacts associated with the project are taken into consideration and mitigated, to ensure public input and comments are considered in decision making and also to provide authorities with sufficient information to make an informed decision on the proposed activities associated with the project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION DOCUMENT

WHAT DOES THIS DOCUMENT TELL YOU?

The purpose of this Background Information Document (BID) is to provide Interested and/or Affected Parties (I&APs) with background information about the proposed 1GW Upington Solar Park and the EIA process application processes to be undertaken. It also gives guidance to I&APs on how they can participate in the proposed EIA process for the Upington Solar Park, receive information as the EIA process progresses, and raise comments and/or concerns regarding the potential environmental impacts with respect to the proposed project. You are hereby invited to register as an I&AP by completing and submitting the attached "Comments and Registration" sheet.

This BID document will help you to:

- Determine if you have interest in and/or affected by the proposed project;
- Better understand the project in order to be able to add value to the project by fully participating and provide comments on the proposed project; and
- Understand the EIA process and ensure that you are able to participate effectively

WHAT DOES THE 1 GW UPINGTON SOLAR PARK PROJECT ENTAIL?

CEF (SOC) Ltd on behalf of the Department of Energy proposes the establishment of a 1GW Solar Park in the //Khara hais Municipality (Upington) in the Northern Cape Province. The proposed Solar Park is about 10 km west of Upington on the remaining extent of Farm Klipkraal 451, within the jurisdiction of the //Khara Hais Local Municipality.

The proposed Solar Park Initiative is envisaged to make use of different Solar Technologies which among others could include photovoltaic (PV), Concentrating Solar Power (CSP) and Parabolic trough solar thermal power generation technologies with a total generating capacity of 1 GW. The feasibility study currently being conducted (Arup (Pty) Ltd) on this site will inform the selection and recommendations on technologies to be used.

The following figure shows the location of the proposed site for the 1GW Solar Park //Khara Hais Local Municipality (Upington).




Figure 1: Locality of the proposed 1 GW Upington Solar Park.

The nature and extent of a Solar Park


A Solar park is a concentrated zone that includes multiple mega-watts of solar electricity generation capacity. In a Solar park, one of more blocks of land are designated and prepermitted as a concentrated zone for the application of solar electricity generation technologies. Individual solar plants are constructed on the land in a clustered formation and on a predictable timeline, sharing common transmission and infrastructure facilities. The Prefeasibility Study conducted in 2010 by Clinton Climate Initiative on behalf of the Department of Energy identified six potential sites in Northern Cape Province to develop the proposed project due to its high Direct Normal Irradiation (DNI).

The larger site under investigation for the proposed Solar Park covers an approximate area of over 5011 ha, however, the final shape and design of the footprint is still to be determined through conceptual engineering and design. Different solar technologies and the associated infrastructure will be appropriately placed within the boundaries of the broader site to avoid any impact on the identified environmental sensitive areas.

Technologies to be investigated for this site are outlined below:


PV/CPV solar power generation for peak load application

Concentrated photovoltaic (CPV) systems employ sunlight concentrated onto photovoltaic surfaces for the purpose of electrical power production. Solar concentrators of all varieties may be used, and these are often mounted on a solar tracker in order to keep the focal point upon the cell as the Sun moves across the sky. Concentrated photovoltaic (CPV) is generally installed in "solar farms" and uses reflective or transmissive optics-either mirrors or Fresnel lenses-that concentrate light rays (photons) from the sun onto a photovoltaic (PV) module to increase its conversion efficiency. The photons, which are individual quantum units of light energy, are directly converted into electricity by the PV module.



Parabolic trough solar thermal power generation for mid-merit application

A parabolic trough power plant consists basically of a solar field and a conventional power block. Parabolic trough-shaped mirrors in the solar field concentrate the incident solar radiation onto an absorber tube located in the focus line of the collector. A heat transfer fluid inside the absorber tube is heated by the absorbed solar radiation and produces steam in the power block by means of heat exchangers. From there, the steam is fed into a turbine to generate electricity in the same way it is done in conventional power plants. With an integrated thermal energy storage system, the supply of electricity can be stored and made available in a plan able manner.



Central receiver solar thermal power generation for mid-merit application

Concentrating Solar Power (CSP) technologies use mirrors to concentrate (focus) the sun's light energy and convert it into heat to create steam to drive a turbine that generates electrical power. CSP technology utilizes **focused sunlight**. CSP plants generate electric power by using mirrors to concentrate (focus) the sun's energy and convert it into high-temperature heat. That heat is then channelled through a conventional generator. The plants consist of two parts: one that collects solar

energy and converts it to heat, and another that converts the heat energy to electricity



WHAT ARE THE POTENTIAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROPOSED PROJECT?

As part of the Scoping Study, desktop specialist studies will identify potential issues which require further investigation within the EIA phase including potential additional studies that may be required. Input from I&APs through the public participation process also provides valuable input in the identification of issues requiring investigation within this EIA process. More detailed studies on potentially significant impacts will be investigated further in the EIA phase of the project for each identified aspect.

WHY ARE ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES NEEDED?

In terms of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (2010), CEF (SOC) Ltd requires authorisation from the National Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) for the undertaking of the proposed project. The EIA Regulation is published in Government Notice R543 of 2 August 2010 in terms of Section 24 (5) of the National

Environmental Management Act (Act No. 107 of 1998); the listed activities are set out in Government Notices R544 to R546. In order to obtain an environmental authorisation for this project, comprehensive, an independent environmental studies must be undertaken in accordance with the EIA Regulation.

An EIA is a legislative tool that is used to ensure that potential impacts that may occur due to any proposed development are identified before execution, and can therefore either be avoided or mitigated (minimised). In South African legislation the environment includes social, economic and bio-physical aspects (and their interactions) and the EIA must assess these equitably.

Water Use Licence

In terms of Section 21 (b), (c), (e), (f), (g) and (i) of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act No. 36 of 1998) (NWA), the proposed Solar Park and associated infrastructure will also require an Integrated Water Use Licence (IWUL).

CEF (SOC) Ltd has appointed Lidwala Consulting Engineers (SA) (Pty) Ltd, as an Environmental Assessment Practitioners (EAP), to undertake an Environmental impact assessment studies to identify and assess all potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed project. In terms of the EIA regulation, all I&APs are invited to actively participate through the public participation process.

The EIA process is divided into 4 distinct phases:

Application and Initial Notification

During this phase an application for authorisation need to be submitted to the National Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA). Once DEA acknowledges the EIA application (within 14 days of submission of application), an initial notification process takes place whereby the public is informed of the proposed development through *inter alia*, newspaper adverts, notification letters, BIDs and site notices.

Scoping phase

The purpose of the scoping phase is:

• To undertake an environmental screening of the surrounding area in order to identify whether suitable alternative sites exist;

- To investigate and gather information on the proposed alternative sites, technologies and the study area in order to establish an understanding of the area;
- To establish how the proposed development activities will potentially impact on the surrounding environment;
- To identify I&APs and relevant authorities by conducting a Public Participation Process (PPP);
- To identify potential environmental impacts that require detailed assessment at EIA phase, through investigation and PPP; and
- To describe and investigate the alternatives that may be considered.


EIA phase

During this phase all issues and proposed alternatives identified in the scoping phase are assessed and rated in terms of their significance. Where necessary, mitigation measures are recommended to reduce the significance of potential impacts. An Environmental Management Programme will then be compiled that will prescribe environmental specifications to be adhered to during the construction, operational and decommissioning phases of the project, should the environmental authorisation be granted. As with the scoping phase, the PPP is an integral and important part of the assessment phase. Once the Final Environmental Impact Report has been submitted to DEA, the decision making process will commence.

Environmental Authorisation

Due to the fact that the proposed project encompasses listed activities in NEMA, an Environmental Authorisation (EA) in terms of NEMA is required. It is intended that CEF (SOC) Ltd. will receive an environmental authorisation for the development of this proposed project. The EIA process to be undertaken is represented diagrammatically in Figure 2.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS

It is important that relevant I&APs are identified and involved in the public participation process from the outset of the proposed project. The inputs received from I&APs form an integral part of the EIA process and will also assist the decision-making authority, DEA, with their decision-making. To ensure effective public participation, the process includes the following steps:

STEP 1: Advertise the EIA Process (local/community newspapers)

STEP 2: Register I&APs and key stakeholders on the database (on-going)

STEP 3: Consultation with, and transfer of information to, I&APs through consultation, public meetings, focus group meetings and key stakeholder

workshops

STEP 4: Record and respond to all comments, issues and concerns raised by I&APs

within an issues trail, which will form an integral part of EIA Reports

STEP 5: Invite I&AP comment and input on the draft Scoping and EIA reports (40-

day comment period)

HOW CAN YOU GET INVOLVED?

- 1. By responding (by phone, fax or e-mail) to our invitation for your involvement which has been advertised in local newspapers.
- 2. By mailing, faxing or e-mail the attached comment form to Lidwala SA.
- 3. By attending the meetings to be held during the course of the project. Should you register as an I&AP you will be invited to attend these meetings. The meeting dates will also be advertised in local newspapers.
- 4. By telephonically contacting Lidwala if you have a query, comment or require further project information.
- 5. By reviewing the draft Scoping and EIA reports within the 40-day review periods and sending your comments to Lidwala (*It should be noted that one can still review the documentation outside this 40-day window*).

If you consider yourself an I&AP for this proposed project, we urge you to make use of the opportunities created by the public participation process to become involved in the process. Your input into this process forms a key part of the environmental studies and we would like to hear from you to obtain your views on the proposed project.

By completing and submitting the accompanying response form, you automatically register yourself as an I&AP for this project, and ensure that your comments, concerns or queries raised regarding the project will be addressed.

Die voorgestelde Sonkragaanleg inisiatief beplan om gebruik te maak van verskillende sonkrag-tegnologieë wat onder andere kan insluit Fotovoltaïese (FV), Gekonsentreerde Sonkrag (GSK) en Paraboliese Trôe Sonkrag termiese kragopwekking tegnologieë met 'n totale opwekkingsvermoë van 1 GW. Die lewensvatbaarheidstudie wat tans op die terrein deur Arup (Edms) Beperk gedoen word sal die seleksie en aanbevelings inlig oor die tegnologieë wat gebruik kan word. Die studie area is geleë binne die jurisduksie van die //Khara Hais plaaslike Munisipaliteit.


DIE AARD EN OMVANG VAN 'N SONKRAGAANLEG

'n Sonkragaanleg is 'n gekonsentreerde sone wat veelvuldige mega-watt sonkrag elektrisiteit opwekkingskapasiteit insluit. In 'n Sonkragaanleg is een of meer gedeeltes van die land aangewys en toegelaat as 'n gekonsentreerde sone vir die toepassing van sonkrag elektrisiteitsopwekking tegnologieë. Individuele sonkrag aanlegte word gebou op die land in 'n saamgegroepeerde formasie en op 'n voorspelbare tydlyn, dit deel ook gemeenskaplike transmissie en infrastruktuur fasiliteite.

Die 2010 Clinton Klimaat Inisiatief het 'n voorlewensvatbaarheidstudie gedoen namens die Departement van Energie, en het ses potensiële terreine in die Noord Kaap geïdentifiseer om die voorgestelde projek te ontwikkel, te danke aan hoë Direkte Normale Uitstraling.

Die terrein wat ondersoek word vir die voorgestelde sonkragaanleg beslaan 'n benaderde oppervlakte van meer as 5011 ha, alhoewel die eintlike ontwikkelingsvoetspoor van die voorgestelde sonkragaanleg nog bepaal moet word deur middel van konseptuele ingenieurswese en ontwerp. Verskillende sonkrag tegnologieë en die gepaardgaande infrastruktuur sal toepaslik geplaas word binne die grense van die breër terrein, om enige impakte op die geïdentifiseerde sensitiewe gebiede te vermy in die omgewing.

Die Sonkragaanleg word voorgestel 10 km Wes van Upington, op die Restant van die plaas Klipkraal 451. Die volgende figuur hieronder illustreer die ligging van die voorgestelde terrein vir die 1 GW Sonkragaanleg //Khara Hais Plaaslike Munisipaliteit (Upington).




Figuur 1 Illustreer die ligging van die voorgestelde 1 GW Upington Sonkragaanleg.

FV/KFV sonkrag generasie vir piek-lading aanvraag

Konsentrerende Fotovoltaïese (KFV) stelsels konsentreer sonlig op fotovoltaïese oppervlaktes vir die doel van elektriese krag produksie. Gekonsentreerde Fotovoltaïese (KFV) stelsels word in die algemeen geïnstalleer in "sonkrag plase" en maak gebruik van reflektiewe of bren optika- hetsy spieëls of Fresnel lens wat ligstrale (fotone) van die son konsentreer op 'n fotovoltaïese (FV) module om sy omskakeling effektief te verhoog. Die fotone, wat individuele quantum eenhede van lig-energie is, word direk omskep in elektrisiteit deurdie FV module.

'n Paraboliese Trôe kragaanleg bestaan basies uit 'n sonkrag-veld en 'n konvensionele kragblok. Paraboliese trog-vormige spieëls in die sonkrag-veld konsentreer die bestraling van son op 'n ontvangerbuis wat geleë is binnekant die fokuslyn van die ontvanger. 'n Werkingsvloeistof binne die ontvangerbuis word verhit deur die geabsorbeerde sonstraling en produseer dan stoom in die kragblok deurmiddel van hitte-uitruilers. Van daar af word die stoom gevoer in 'n turbine om elektrisiteit op te wek in dieselfde manier waarop dit gedoen word by konvensionele kragaanlegte. Met 'n geïntegreerde termiese energie stoorstelsel, kan die voorsiening van elektrisiteit gestoor en beskikbaar gestel word in 'n beplanbare wyse.



This identifies the issue that the BID only mentions the WULA that will be applied for & associated infrastructure. The BID also makes provision for a CSP plant.

Such a plant uses a lot of water & would also need oxidation/retention dams and possibly a canal for water to be fed back into the Orange River.

As there is currently a CSP plant being built here with the entire associated infrastructure – the pipeline from the river and the canal back to the river - the residents & the farmers of the area are aware of these associated activities and water use that is not addressed in the BID and from the above is already commenting & asking information regarding it that I cannot answer. I request them to put their concerns in writing and submit it when they receive the documentation that is being distributed.

Consultation with DWA regarding this aspect should be initiated by the developer as to the water availability from the Orange River or other resources for the requirements of a CSP plant. Farmers experience overuse of their existing canals & due to new developments (agric. & residential) there is not any capacity for further water usage from it. They would also be worried about water allocations from the Orange River as it seems as if there are possibly also over allocations from that resource.

These should be addressed before meetings are scheduled as these WILL be asked.

Would a pipeline be a separate EIA application as currently I am not informing any land owners en route to the river? Only adjacent to the farm.

Should it be the case, provision should still be made for enquiries from the I&APs.

Could this be cleared & feedback given to me?

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Guidelines to minimise the impact on birds of Solar Facilities and Associated Infrastructure in South Africa

BirdLife South Africa supports the use of solar energy generation in the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions in South Africa, which has been identified as amongst the top 10 developing countries that need to reduce their carbon emissions significantly. It is highly likely that solar holds amongst the highest renewable potential for South Africa.

Two types of solar power generation or Solar Energy Facilities (SEF) are currently available in South Africa:

- 1. Solar photovoltaic (PV) electricity generation, which converts solar radiation directly into electricity through a solar panel.
- Concentrated Solar Power (CSP) farms (plants), which consists of a series of mirrors/heliostats/trough panels that reflect sunlight. The reflected heat is mostly concentrated onto a central receiver tower and standby focal points (although other technology within CSP exists). The heat is used to raise steam to drive turbines and generators.

In its position statement¹, BirdLife South Africa states that its main concern about both types of solar power generation – photovoltaic and concentrated solar power – is that they can potentially cause the displacement or exclusion from important habitats of nationally and/or globally threatened, rare, endemic or range-restricted bird species. Other potential risks include collision with the reflective surfaces. After discussions with authorities, NGOs and the solar industry, BirdLife South Africa has drawn up the following Guidelines to Minimise the Impact on Birds of Solar Facilities and Associated Infrastructure in South Africa.

Is an avifaunal specialist study a necessary part of the EIA?

The displacement or the exclusion of species, particularly threatened, endemic and range-restricted species, are potentially the most significant impacts SEF facilities can have on birds. As the introduction of this technology could result in a rapid alteration of large areas of habitat, this represents a potentially new threat to species. BirdLife South Africa therefore recommends that an avifaunal specialist be consulted for all proposed solar energy facilities.

We suggest that the specialist assessment should follow a two-phased approach:

- 1. A desktop analysis of existing literature and data (e.g. SABAP1, SABAP2, CWAC, CAR, distance to formal protected areas, wetlands and Important Bird Areas).
- 2. The desktop analysis should be followed by a site assessment of approximately 3-5 days².
 - a. The site assessment should be designed to confirm the presence, abundance, habitat preferences and flyways of priority species (Priority species will include nationally and/or globally threatened, rare, endemic, or range-restricted bird species, or large numbers of other bird species).
 - b. The duration of the site visit should be informed by information gaps for the area in question, as well as the sensitivity of the area and the species likely to be present.

The specialist should assess the significance of the likely impacts of the proposed facility and its associated infrastructure on the avifauna of priority and at highest risk, help identify alternative locations or layouts for the facility and recommend other mitigation measures that would help reduce the significance of negative impacts on birds.

Monitoring

In order to for us to better understand and successfully mitigate the possible impacts solar energy facilities on both a regional and project specific scale, BirdLife South Africa recommends that the environmental management programme includes the requirement for annual post-construction monitoring by a avifaunal specialist. This should be based on a minimum of 3-5 days observations. Any avian mortality or injury at the facility should also be duly recorded and reported.

BirdLife South Africa requests that these reports are sent to us where they will be centrally housed. In this way we will be able to facilitate a better understanding of the nature, scale and duration of impacts on birds at a national level.

Annexure 1: High level comparison between a Photovoltaic Solar Facility (PV) and a Concentrated Solar Power (CSP) Facility.

Photovoltaic Solar Facility (PV)

- A PV Solar Farm consist of an area covered by photovoltaic panels
- The size of the PV Solar Farm can vary in size
- PV uses semi-conductor materials to convert sunlight directly into electricity
- PV panels can be fixed or track the sun in one or two axes
- PV panels are less reflective



Figure 1: Photovolatic (PV) solar farm showing typical arrangement of photovoltaic panels.

Concentrated Solar Power Facility (CSP)

- CSP farms consist of a series of heliostats/trough panels with mirrors which
 concentrate sunlight on a receiver tower (although some CSP farms are
 developed without receiver towers).
- CSP farms potentially have greater impacts on birds than PV farms because of the associated central receiver tower, standby focal points and heliostats.
- CSP operates by concentrating the suns energy to produce heat which either
 drives a steam turbine or an external heat engine to produce electricity. A liquid
 [known as heat transfer fluid (HTF) which usually consists of a mix of oils] or a
 gas medium is heated and this is used to convert water to steam, which is used
 to generate electricity through a steam turbine generator. The heated liquid
 (HTF) or gas medium is then cooled, condensed and reused
- The need exists for waste water evaporation ponds to separate out sludge or solids containing hazardous chemicals from the chemical waste water, cycle

water blow down and cleaning liquids. Such materials are removed from the ponds by a licensed waste company. Hazardous waste should be disposed at a hazardous waste and if not hazardous, it should be disposed at a landfill site.




Figure 2: (a) Concentrated Solar Power (CSP) Facility - Parabolic troughs concentrating sunlight on the central receiver tower. (b) Schematic presentation of CSP technology and the layout of a CSP Facility. CSP operates by concentrating the sun's energy to produce heat which either drives a steam turbine or an external heat engine to produce electricity. The heated liquid (HTF) or gas medium is then cooled, condensed and reused.

Annexure 2: Minimising the Impacts on Birds (including Mitigation Measures)

- Species lists can only be used to guide the intensity of monitoring but should not replace comprehensive monitoring. Monitoring should take into account seasonal variation, fly paths and the behaviour of associated birds.
- Recommended use of existing degraded urban/industrial areas and transformed/sterile agricultural areas with no natural habitat remaining for the facility wherever possible; strictly avoid Important Bird Areas (IBAs), Critical Biodiversity Areas or protected areas.
- In arid areas (Nama-Karoo habitat for example): Avoid drainage lines as many bird species are associated with the drainage lines (due to presence of trees within the drainage lines).
- Larger species e.g. raptors nesting should be noted as trees are a limited resource in arid areas.
- Ensure that artificial evaporation ponds are **covered** (with wire mesh or netting to ensure that birds cannot enter or drink the water) and/or **free of pollutants.**
- Ensure that the solid concrete **tower (receiver tower)** is **visible** to birds. See e.g. http://www.reelwings.com/ and other similar web sources.
- Avoid constructing solar arrays in areas along known waterbird flight paths between pans/wetlands/dams.
- Avoid constructing solar arrays in areas close to roosting and breeding sites of significant populations of threatened, endemic, rare or range-restricted bird species their flight paths might be across the solar farm.
- **Limit the** amount of **vegetation that is** cleared to limit habitat loss.
- Use **grazing**, and **not chemicals**, to retard re-growth of vegetation.
- Recommend that the Solar Facility be designed from the start to feed into existing power lines or is used locally and therefore independent of the grid.
- Recommend that power lines follow existing roads.
- Be sure to check the technology used.
 - Reflective surfaces which are parabolic (curved) in shape reduce likelihood of sky reflection, relative to flat heliostats.

- Ensure that trough receivers use evacuated glass tubes (or similar technology) to reduce heat loss allowing lower surface temperatures which will not burn birds.
- Propose that plant be upgraded after a (normal) 20 year lifespan.

Light Pollution and Reflective Surface Risks

- Reflective surfaces such as heliostats and parabolic trough panels represent a form of **light pollution** also brought by roadways, wet runways, windows, artificial light and cars.
- Windows and artificial light are ranked highly as contributing factors to bird mortalities.
- Reflective surfaces **disorientate** birds, are mistaken for large water bodies and are responsible for the 'Mirror Effect'.
- Lights at solar facilities will **attract insects** which in turn will attract foraging birds.

BirdLife South Africa

Position Statement on the effect of solar power facilities on birds

- BirdLife South Africa supports the use of renewable energy resources, including solar energy generation, in reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
- BLSA acknowledges that South Africa has been identified as one of the top 10 developing countries which needs to reduce its carbon emissions significantly.
- BLSA acknowledges the increased rate of energy demand in South Africa of 3% per year and thus the importance of solar energy and other renewable energy resources as sources of alternative energy.
- BLSA acknowledges that South Africa is amongst the top 10 countries in the world most suited for the generation of solar energy due to the percentage of incoming shortwave radiation.
- Two types of solar power generation are currently available:
 - Solar photovoltaic (PV) electricity generation involves turning solar radiation directly into electricity in a solar panel.
 - Concentrated Solar Power (CSP) farms (plants) consist of a series of mirrors/ heliostats/trough panels which reflect sunlight. The reflected heat is concentrated onto a central receiver tower and standby focal points. The heat is used to raise steam to drive turbines and generators.
- BLSA's main concerns with PV and CSP farms are the displacement or the exclusion of nationally and/or globally threatened, rare, endemic, or range-restricted bird species from important habitats.
- CSP farms potentially have greater impact on birds than PV farms because of the associated central receiver tower, standby focal points and heliostats.
- Anticipated avifaunal issues concerned with the CSP farms are:

Issues relating to the CSP itself:

- Collision with heliostats (mirrors) and the central receiver tower. Reflective surfaces act as attractants for approaching birds. These surfaces may be confused for large water bodies (and can have similar effects as windows) and causes disorientation of flying birds, resulting in injury and/or death.
- Mirrors are used to concentrate sunlight to create large amounts of heat and the heat could cause mortalities of close overflying birds.
- Birds could be burnt when in the vicinity of the central receiver or when entering the standby focal points (specifically relevant to swallows, swifts and martins which spend most of their time in flight).
- Pollution caused by leaching of chemical substances into waste water evaporation ponds. This could be lethal to birds using these ponds. Artificial evaporation ponds serve as an additional attractant to waterbirds, which could increase cumulative collision, burning or poisoning impacts.
- Roosting, foraging, and nesting on or around the CSP plant infrastructure (i.e. attracting more birds to the solar facility).
- Loss of habitat and disturbance of resident bird species caused by construction, operation and maintenance activities (of CSP and PV).
- BLSA acknowledges that the above impacts became significant only when a great number of birds occur within the vicinity of the CSP and are thus exposed to these mortality factors.

Issues relating directly to the associated infrastructure (CSP and PV):

- Collision and electrocution caused when perching on or flying into powerline infrastructure.
- Habitat destruction and disturbance/exclusion of avifauna through construction (short-term) and maintenance (long-term) of new powerline infrastructure.
- Habitat destruction and disturbance of birds caused by the construction and maintenance of new roads, pipelines and visitor centres.
- BLSA is also greatly concerned that avifaunal attractants may amplify the above impacts.

These attractants may be:

- Open water evaporation ponds on or in the vicinity of the CSP.
- Heliostats (mirrors) and/or parabolic troughs.
- o Foraging spots under or around the panelling.
- Birds attracted to the above sources may enter one or more focal points when descending and, as a result, they could be burnt to death.
- BLSA recommends mitigation of avifaunal impacts by:

- Not constructing CSP plants in formally or informally protected areas or Important Bird Areas (IBAs), but in areas of low relevance for nature conservation.
- Constructing CSP farms in already degraded areas.
- Avoiding construction near drainage lines with trees where birds will be concentrated (e.g. in Karoo where most CSP farms are likely to be constructed).
- Avoiding construction near large trees (e.g. in the Karoo) which serve as nesting and roosting sites for raptors and vultures.
- Building solar arrays (a linked assembly of heliostats) outside known waterbird flight paths.
- Not using chemicals/pesticides for the maintenance of land/vegetation and rather use mowing or grazing to retard vegetation growth.
- Keeping evaporation ponds clean of pollutants.
- Constructing new powerlines in such a way that they have minimal impact on birds (i.e. bird-friendly designs, appropriate wire marking devices).
- Deconstruction of the plant after the expected life span of 20 years.
- The above mitigation factors should be rigorously applied to ensure minimal disruption of key bird species and their habitats.

In terms of Section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

CEF (SOC) Ltd on behalf of the Department of Energy proposes the establishment of a 1GW Solar Park in the //Khara hais Municipality (Upington) in the Northern Cape Province. The proposed Solar Park is about 10 km west of Upington on the remaining extent of Farm Klipkraal 451, within the jurisdiction of the //Khara Hais Local Municipality.

Thank you for informing SAHRA of the application to develop a 1GW solar facility using a variety of solar technologies including photovoltaic cell power, concentrating solar power and parabolic trough solar thermal power. The area proposed for development covers 5011ha in total.

In terms of Section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999), any proposed development that requires an application in terms of NEMA or the MPRDA must have an assessment of impacts to heritage resources completed as part of the application process. The relevant heritage authority must determine whether the assessment done in terms of impacts to heritage resources satisfies our requirements and must provide comments or recommendations to the decision-making authority.

The land surrounding the area proposed for development is known to contain significant stone age archaeology as well as rock art. In addition, it is noted that the palaeontological significance of the geology of the area proposed for development ranges from low, to moderate to very high significance. SAHRA therefore requires more information on the likely impact of the proposed development activities on significant heritage resources.

SAHRA therefore requires that a Heritage Impact Assessment be conducted.

This heritage impact assessment must assesses the impact of the proposed development on all heritage resources including, but not limited to, archaeological heritage, palaeontology, rock art, any significant structures and intangible heritage. This assessment must not only assess impacts in terms of the development footprint, but must also assess broader, indirect impacts to heritage that may result from the proposed development.

The quickest process to follow for the archaeological component would be to contract a specialist (see www.asapa.org.za) to provide a Phase 1 Archaeological Impact Assessment Report. The Phase 1 Impact Assessment Report will identify the archaeological sites to be impacted and assess their significance. It should also make recommendations (as indicated in section 38 of the NHRA) about the process to be followed. For example, there may need to be a mitigation phase (Phase 2) where the specialist will collect or excavate material and date the site. understanding of the archaeology of the Northern Cape.

A desktop palaeontological assessment must be completed prior to development in order to determine if any significant palaeontological resources will be impacted by the proposed development activities. This assessment must include a protocol for finds.

Any other heritage resources that may be impacted such as built structures, sites of cultural significance associated with oral histories, burial grounds and graves, graves of victims of conflict, and cultural landscapes or viewscapes must also be assessed.

This assessment must satisfy SAHRA's minimum requirements for impact assessments and must comply with the requirements in Section 38(3) of the NHRA and as such, this assessment must provide recommendations regarding the mitigation of any identified direct and indirect impacts to heritage resources.

SAHRA looks forward to receiving these assessments before commenting further on this proposed development.

This letter is in response to your email request to provide an assessment on the potential development of the Upington Solar Park (DEA REF. NO.: 14/12/16/3/3/2/588), and the risk it may pose on the Square Kilometre Array Project.

A high level risk assessment has been conducted at the South African SKA Project Office to determine the potential impact of such facilities on the Square Kilometre Array. This letter serves to confirm the outcomes of the risk assessment, and proposals for any future investigations associated with this facility.

- i. The location of the proposed facility has been determined from the BID Notification letters and document. The nearest SKA station, identified as Rem-Opt-9, is located at a distance of 43 km;
- ii. Based on distances to the nearest SKA stations, and the information currently available on the detailed design of the PV/CSP installation, this facility poses a low to medium low risk of detrimental impact on the SKA;
- iii. Any transmitters that are to be established, or have been established, at the site for the purposes of voice and data communication will be required to comply with the relevant AGA regulations concerning the restriction of use of the radio frequency spectrum that applies in the area concerned. It should be noted that the establishment of any radio communication equipment is likely to represent a high risk of detrimental impact on the SKA, and that the developers are advised to coordinate with the SKA office on this matter;









iv. As a result of the low to medium low risk associated with the Upington Solar Park, no mitigation measures would be required at this stage. However, the South African SKA Project Office would like to be kept informed of progress with this project, and reserves the right to further risk assessments at a later stage.


2. COMMENTS ON BACKGROUND INFORMATION DOCUMENT (BID)

- 2.1 Kindly ensure that the potential impacts on protected plant species are assessed. Areas with higher density protected trees should be regarded as sensitive and avoided as far as possible.
- 2.2 The DAFF is kindly requesting a copy of the fauna and flora specialist study that will be done as part of the EIA, preferably a hardcopy.
- 2.3 Kindly take note of the Flora Permit requirements in terms of the Northern Cape Nature Conservation Act, Act 9 of 2009 (NCNCA) administered by the provincial Department of Environment and Nature Conservation (DENC).
