As such, it is essential that all mitigation measures proposed by the various specialists relating to the proposed wind energy facility ("WEF") and its associated infrastructure, are carried through to the Environmental Management Programme ("EMPr") and implemented accordingly. 2.3 Further to the above, with respect to roads specifically, existing roads should be utilised as far as possible, and new roads that require construction, should be kept to a minimum. Please note that consideration should be given to re-routing the preferred access road route to avoid impacting on heritage and freshwater features. (In this regard, also refer to paragraph 4.1 below.)
