Frans Prins CV (short version)

Frans is a trained anthropologist and archaeologist. He received his MA (Archaeology) from the University of Stellenbosch and is presently a PhD candidate at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. His PhD research topic deals with indigenous San perceptions and interactions with the rock art heritage of the Drakensberg. Frans was employed as a junior research associate at the then University of Transkei, Botany Department in 1988-1990. Although attached to a Botany Department he conducted a palaeoecological study on the Iron Age of northern Transkei - this study formed the basis for his MA thesis in Archaeology. Frans left the University of Transkei to accept a junior lecturing position at the University of Stellenbosch in 1990. He taught mostly undergraduate courses on World Archaeology and research methodology during this period. From 1991 - 2001 Frans was appointed as the head of the department of Historical Anthropology at the Natal Museum, His tasks included academic research and publication, display conceptualization, and curating the African ethnology collections of the Museum. During this period he served on the editorial boards of the South African Journal of Field Archaeology and Natalia. Frans left the Natal Museum in 2001 when approached by a Swiss funding agency to assist an international NGO (Working Group for Indigenous Minorities) with the conceptualization of a San or Bushman museum near Cape Town.

Between 2003 and 2007 Frans was employed as the Cultural Resource Specialist for the Maloti Drakensberg Transfrontier Project – a bilateral conservation project funded through the World Bank. This project involved the facilitation with various stakeholders in order to produce a cultural heritage conservation and development strategy for the adjacent parts of Lesotho and South Africa. During April 2008 Frans accepted employment at the environmental agency called Strategic Environmental Focus (SEF). His main task was to set-up and run the cultural heritage unit of this national company. During this period he also became an accredited heritage impact assessor and he is rated by both Amafa and the South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA).

Frans left SEF and started his own heritage consultancy called "Active Heritage" in July 2009. Although mostly active along the eastern seaboard his clients also include international companies such as Royal Dutch Shell through Golder Associates, and UNESCO. He has now completed almost 800 heritage conservation and management reports for various clients since the inception of "Active Heritage". Frans also assist the National Heritage Council (NHC) through Haley Sharpe Southern Africa', with heritage site data capturing and analysis for the proposed National Liberation Route World Heritage Site and the national intangible heritage audit. In addition, he is has done background research and conceptualization of the proposed Dinosaur Interpretative Centre at Golden Gate National Park and the proposed Khoi and San Interpretive Centre at Camdeboo, Eastern Cape Province and the Didima Rock Art Centre, situated within the Maloti Drakensberg World Heritage Site. During 2009 he produced the first draft dossier for the nomination of the Sehlabathebe National Park, Lesotho as a UNESCO inscribed world heritage site. In 2012 Frans was awarded honorary lectureship at the School of Anthropology, Gender and Historical Studies, UKZN.

Frans has produced 30 academic and 40 popular publications on topics relating to San identity, heritage and rock art as well as Iron Age and palaeo-environmental studies. He has produced almost 800 technical reports dealing with heritage issues and cultural resources management. He is also a Thetha accredited cultural tour guide. Frans has conducted more than 50 cultural tours for specialist interest groups to rock art and other heritage sites in southern Africa.
