NON-FICTION: The books are arranged in numerical order according to the Dewey Decimal Classification System, which separates them into ten main classes. English non-fiction and Afrikaans non-fiction are filed together and the numbers used are as follows:

000-099 GENERAL WORKS: Books that deal with no particular subject or encyclopaedia, bibliographies, catalogues.

100-199 PHILOSOPHY: Christian Science.

200-299 RELIGION: Christianity, Islam, Judaism, etc.

300-399 SOCIOLOGY: General, Education, etc.

400-499 LANGUAGE: Afrikaans, English, etc.

500-599 SCIENCE: Mathematics, Engineering, Physics, Chemistry, etc.

600-699 USEFUL ARTS: Mechanical engineering, agriculture, home economics, manufacturing, building construction, etc. Example: 641.1 is the number for cooking books.

700-799 FINE ARTS: Architecture, Music, Painting, Photography, etc.

800-899 LITERATURE: Afrikaans, English, etc. in all languages.
