LAND CLAIMS ENQUIRY – <u>PORTION 5 OF THE FARM KLOPPERSBOS 128, REG DIV JR, GAUT-ENG</u>

We refer to your land claim enquiry dated 30th July 2020.

We confirm that there are land claims against the properties as per attached list. It should be noted that the claims were received during two lodgement periods and as a result different requirements will be applicable. The first lodgement period closed on the 31st of December 1998 and the 2nd lodgement period was from the 1st of July 2014 to the 27th of July 2016.

Claims lodged during the first lodgement period were lodged in terms of the Restitution of Land Rights Act, 1994 (Act No. 22 of 1994) and claims lodged during the 2nd lodgement period were lodged in terms of the Restitution of Land Rights Amendment Act, 2014 (Act No. 15 of 2014) ("the Amendment Act") which, amongst others, reopened the lodgement of claims for a period of five years.

The claim/s lodged during the first lodgement period were lodged **as per attached list indicated by old claims** before <u>31 December 1998</u> and the claim/s lodged during the second lodgement period were lodged <u>as per attached list indicated by new claims</u> from the 1st July 2014 to 27th July 2016.

With regard to the claims lodged before the 31st of December 1998, we confirm that the claims have been accepted by the Regional Land Claims Commissioner as compliant with the requirements of the Restitution of Land Rights Act, 1994. As a result, you need to comply with section 11 (7) of the Restitution of Land Rights Act, 1994 by informing (giving one month's notice) to the Commission on Restitution of Land Rights before you sell, exchange, donate, lease, subdivide, rezone or develop the property.

With regard to the claim lodged during the 2nd lodgement period, the validity of the Amendment Act was challenged in the Constitutional Court. The Constitutional Court found the Amendment Act to be invalid because of the failure of Parliament to facilitate public involvement as required by the Constitution. The Amendment Act ceased to be law on 28 July 2016.

The Constitutional Court ordered that the claims that were lodged between 1 July 2014 and 27 July 2016 are validly lodged, but it interdicted the Commission from processing those claims until the Commission has finalised the claims lodged by 31 December 1998 or until Parliament passes a new law providing for the re-opening of lodgement of land claims. Parliament was given until 27 July 2018 to pass such a law.

Parliament has so far not been able to pass new legislation and has instead approached the Constitutional Court for an extension until 29 March 2019 and the application was rejected. As a result the Commission will, unless directed otherwise until by the Constitutional Court, not be processing claims lodged between 1 July 2014 until 27 July 2016 2016 until all the claims lodged on or before 31st December 1998 are finalised and or a new Act is passed by Parliament and signed into law by the President. In the meantime, the Commission through the Chief Land Claims Commissioner has been ordered to report the progress of all the outstanding land claims on six months basis for monitoring by the court. The Commission will communicate widely once we have been granted permission to begin dealing with these claims lodged during the 2nd lodgement period.

It is important to note that the provisions of section 11 (7) of the Restitution of Land Rights Act, 1994 do not apply to claims lodged during the 2nd lodgement period until after the Commission has accepted the claim for investigation and published its details in the Government Gazette. That will only be done on the happening of the event in the previous paragraph.

1. Section 11(7) of the Restitution of Land Rights Act provides as follows:

11 (7) Once a notice has been published in respect of any land -(a) no person may in an improper manner obstruct the passage of the claim

aA) no person may sell, exchange, donate, lease, subdivide, rezone or develop the land in question without having given the regional land claims commissioner one month's written notice of his or her intention to do so, and, where such notice was not given in respect of

- (i) any sale, exchange, donation, lease, subdivision or rezoning of land and the Court is satisfied that such sale, exchange, donation, lease, subdivision or rezoning was not done in good faith, the Court may set aside such sale, exchange, donation, lease, subdivision or rezoning or grant any other order it deems fit;
- (ii) any development of land and the Court is satisfied that such development was not done in good faith, the court may grant any order it deems fit;

The above section has been misinterpreted to mean that once a claim has been lodged the land owner cannot sell, donate, develop, lease, exchange or donate. While in actual fact it means the land owner cannot do those things listed in (i) above after a notice of claim has been published in a government gazette notice without giving one month notice of your intention to do so to the Regional Land Claims Commissioner having a jurisdiction over such land and/or property.

After the claim has been found to be valid the office must publish a gazette notice of claim first in a government gazette notice, and if anyone wants to do anything listed in (i) above must give a written notice to the RLCC.

LEGAL COMPLAINCE

An application for a prospecting right in terms of Section 16 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (Act No. 28 of 2002) [MPRDA] will be submitted to the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE).

The proposed project triggers the following listed activities in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No.107 of 1998) [NEMA] and the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (as amended by GNR 326 effective 7 April 2017), and therefore requires a basic assessment process to obtain environmental authorisation:

GNR 327 Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations Listing Notice 1 of 2017 Activity 20:

Any activity including the operation of that activity which requires a prospecting right in terms of Section 16 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (Act No. 28 of 2002), including —

- (a) associated infrastructure, structures and earthworks, directly related to the prospecting of a mineral resource
- (b) the primary processing of a mineral resource including winning, extraction, classifying, concentrating, crushing, screening or washing;

but excluding the secondary processing of a mineral resource, including the smelting, beneficiation, reduction, refining, calcining or gasification of the mineral resource in which case activity 6 in Listing Notice 2 applies.

GNR 327 Listing Notice 1 of 2017 Activity 22:

The decommissioning of any activity requiring -

i) a closure certificate in terms of section 43 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (act No. 28 of 2002); or

ii) a prospecting right, mining right, mining permit, production right or exploration right, where the throughput of the activity has reduced by 90% or more over a period of 5 years excluding where the competent authority has in writing agreed that such reduction in throughput does not constitute closure.

An application for a Prospecting Right in terms of Section 16 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (Act No. 28 of 2002) has been submitted to the Department of Mineral Resource.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed prospecting area is a natural area. The planned activities for the proposed site's is detailed below. All activities will be contained within the boundaries of the site.

DESCRIPTION OF PLANNED NON-INVASIVE ACTIVITIES:

(These activities do not disturb the land where prospecting will take place, e.g. aerial photography, desktop studies, aeromagnetic surveys, etc)

Phase 1 (months 1 to 2), phase 3 (months 6 to 9) and phase 4 (months 10 to 12)

Desktop studies form a very important preparatory step in a new coal exploration project, and as the name suggests, this task is executed mainly from an office environment. Desktop studies will be conducted by the project geologist as part of preliminary investigations into the prospecting area by looking at all relevant published literature, geological maps, mining maps and any available evidence or records of coal findings. The outcome of the desktop studies will be a geological report of the prospecting area with a particular emphasis on the prospectivity of the area. This report will also inform other subsequent prospecting steps.

Field geological studies will follow after the desktop studies, and they typically include walking over the prospecting area making general observations of the geology and topography. Geological mapping activities, if terrain is suitable, may include detailed outcrop mapping, identification of coal hosting strata, coal seam outcrop mapping and sampling of exposed coal seams where available.

The 3D geological modelling and resource estimation step will follow after favourable exploration drilling results. This geological modelling step mainly entails geological interpretation of collected logsheet data and the subsequent geological domaining. The geological model, which shows the physical continuity of the coal seams and the distribution of the coal qualities, is a critical input in coal resource estimation. The coal resource statement, which is an outcome of the resource estimation process, gives an indication of the amount of available coal resources in tonnage and associated qualities.



DESCRIPTION OF PLANNED INVASIVE ACTIVITIES:

(These activities result in land disturbances e.g. sampling, drilling, bulk sampling, etc.)

Phase 2 (months 3 to 5)

The objective of the exploration drilling is to confirm the presence of coal measures, delineate the vertical and lateral extents of the coal measures, and, through suitable tests, the quality of the coal. Percussion and diamond coring are the preferred drilling methods. The resultant drill holes will be cased and capped to make it safe for people and animals, and also allow for future access by the exploration team.

DESCRIPTION OF PRE-/FEASIBILITY STUDIES:

(Activities in this section include but are not limited to: initial geological modelling, resource determination, possible future funding models, etc.)

The pre-/feasibility studies team will comprise of a diverse team of technical expertise in the field of mineral projects, including, geologists, mining engineers, metallurgical engineers, civil engineers, mechanical engineers, environmental scientists, marketing professionals and mineral project finance professionals. The list of activities under pre-/feasibility studies includes the following:

- > Geological modelling and coal resource estimation;
- Coal reserve estimation;
- Mine design and scheduling;
- Metallurgical processing;
- Market development;
- Infrastructure design
- Engineering development
- Human resourcing
- > Project development and operational costing

The prospecting site will contain the following:

- Surveying Equipment;
- Drilling equipment;
- Geophysical logging equipment;
- Field Vehicles;
- Sample Analysis equipment; and
- Other relevant field equipment.



MAIN PROSPECTING ACTIVITIES:

Drill site establishment:

A drill site of approximately 200 m² will be established that will require:

- Clearing of vegetation for sumps and the drill entrance point a maximum of three sumps, with each sump not measuring more than 1 m² will be operation at a time, a total of 3 m² will be cleared per site.
- Laydown area for drill rods,
- Fuel and chemical will be stored in a field vehicle;
- Chemical toilets will be placed in the vicinity of the site.
- Drilling and removal of geological cores:

Drilling a hole of approximately 67 mm in diameter and removing of rock core. Number of boreholes will be finalised once non-invasive prospecting is completed.

BIOPHYSICAL DESCRIPTION

GEOLOGY & SOILS:

The large southern and eastern parts of this area are underlain by granite of the Lebowa Granite Suite and some granophyre of the Rashoop Granophyre Suite (both Bushveld Complex, Vaalian). In the north, the sedimentary rocks of the Waterberg Group (Mokolian Erathem) are most important. Specifically, sandstone, conglomerate and siltstone of the Alma Formation and sandstone, siltstone and shale of the Vaalwater Formation. Well-drained, deep Hutton or Clovelly soils often with a catenary sequence from Hutton at the top to Clovelly on the lower slopes; shallow, skeletal Glenrosa soils also occur. Land types mainly Bb, Fa, Ba, Bd and Ac

Soils vary from planted grassland previously improved grassland, to cultivated, temporary/permanent, commercial/subsistence irrigated/dryland. Soil fall within the following patterns:

LP1 – soils with minimal development, usually shallow or hard or weathered rock, with or without intermitted diverse soils. Lime rate to absent in in the landscape

- Activity should be limited to area of disturbance. Where required the compacted soils should be disked to an adequate depth and re-vegetated with indigenous plants.
- All vehicles will be regularly serviced to ensure they are in proper working condition and to reduce risk of leaks. All leaks will be cleaned up immediately using an absorbent material.
- Ensure activities occur only within the designated areas and stockpile and revegetated soil as soon as possible.



SURFACE AND GROUND WATER:

The proposed site falls within the Crocodile (West) and Marico Water Management Area, in the A23B quaternary catchment area. There are various streams and small farm dams in the area. The Pienaars River is located approximately 3 km south west of the site and the Boekenhoutspruit located approximately 3 km to the east of the site area.

Management:

- Truck, machinery and equipment will be regularly serviced to reduce risk of leaks. Any leakages should be reported and treated immediately in a reputable manner. For large spills Hazmat will called in.
- All vehicles will be regularly serviced to ensure they are in proper working condition and to reduce risk of leaks. All leaks will be cleaned up immediately using an absorbent material.
- Ensure water management facilities are operating adequately. Clean out silt build up over dry season.
- Monitor area for erosion and pooling and rehabilitate if necessary. Continue with Surface water monitoring.
- Portable toilets will be managed by reputable contractors and inspected daily for potential leaks
- Waste generated on site should be recycled as far as possible and sold/ given to interested contractors. Recycled waste should not be stored on site for excessive periods to reduced risk of environmental contamination. Refuse bins will be placed around site to collect all non-recycle waste for disposal at the municipality.
- Rigs will be regularly serviced to reduce risk of leaks. Pans will be placed under potential leak sites. Any leakages should be reported and treated as per the emergency response plan. For large spills a hazardous materials company will called in.


LAND USE


The current surrounding land uses can be classified as agricultural land, chicken farming, grazing, game farming and tourism. The Kloppersbos Explosion Research facility is located to the west of the property. It was noted that there were plantations on the property.



SENSITIVE LANDSCAPES:

According to the Gauteng C-Plan 3.3 terrestrial Critical Biodiversity Areas (CBAs), sections of the proposed site falls within an Ecological Support Area. This area will be excluded from prospecting activities.





Management:

Protected areas must be cordoned off with at least 100m horizontal distance buffer zones and no activity is too take place within these areas.

AIR QUALITY:

- Speed on the access road will be limited to 30 km/h to prevent the generation of excess dust.
- Roads will be sprayed with water or an environmentally friendly dust-allaying agent that contains no PCB's (e.g. DAS products) if dust is generated above acceptable limits.
- All vehicles will be regularly serviced to ensure they are in proper working condition and to reduce the risk of excessive emissions.



NOISE:

Management:

- Vehicles will be regularly serviced to ensure acceptable noise levels are not exceeded.
- All prospecting vehicles will be equipped with silencers and maintained in a road worthy condition in terms of the Road Transport Act.
- It will be ensured that employees and staff conduct themselves in an acceptable manner while on site.

FLORA:

According to Mucina and Rutherford (2012) the vegetation type of the surrounding natural areas are known as the SVcb 12 Central Sandy Bushveld which is listed as a vulnerable ecosystem. The vegetation type of the surrounding natural areas consists of low undulating areas, sometimes between mountains, and sandy plains and catenas supporting tall, deciduous *Terminalia sericea* and *Burkea africana* woodland on deep sandy soils (with the former often dominant on the lower slopes of sandy catenas) and low, broad-leaved *Combretum* woodland on shallow rocky or gravelly soils. Species of *Acacia, Ziziphus* and Euclea are found on flats and lower slopes on eutrophic sands and some less sandy soils. *A. tortilis* may dominate some areas along valleys. Grass-dominated herbaceous layer with relatively low basal cover on dystrophic sands. The study area consists of leve plains with some relief, irregular plains with high hills or ridges can be noted in the area. The vegetation of the area is classified as Savanah Biome, specifically the Central Sandy Bushveld.

- Ensure permits are obtained to remove protected species if needed. Relocate all protected species with aid of specialists. Only remove species in areas designated for activity and do not disturb surrounding areas.
- Rehabilitate disturbed areas with natural indigenous flora. Monitor for cover abundance.
- Eradicate and control all alien invasive species on site. Rehabilitate and revegetated all areas where alien invasive species were removed.



FAUNA:

Various small mammals and reptiles occur on the property. Larger herbivore species are very scares or absent due to the conflicting land use. Small mammals, reptiles and insects will occur in the area. The fauna at the site will not be impacted by the proposed prospecting activity as they will be able to move away or through the site, without being harmed. Workers should be educated and managed to ensure that no fauna at the site is harmed. At this stage no resident protected or red data faunal species were identified within the earmarked footprint, and the project is expected to have a negligible impact in this regard as prospecting activities will be done by drilling prospecting boreholes comprising and area of less than 400 square meters per site.

Management:

Workers should be educated and managed to ensure that no fauna at the site is harmed.

SITES OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND CULTURAL INTEREST:

The proposed site falls in the surrounding area of the Komjekejeke Heritage site, therefore a Heritage Impact Assessment will be conducted. This report will be made available for public comments during with the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR)

Management:

- Should artefacts archaeological items be observed, then all activity should cease immediately, the area marked off and a specialists consulted prior to any further activity.
- Should graves be observed on site during activity progress then all activity should have ceased and the area demarcated as a no-go zone. A specialist will need to be consulted and responsible action considered, whether grave relocation or ceasing activity completely within the area and 50m buffer zone.

ACCESS ROUTE:

The site can be accessed via the Kloppersbos/Pyramid Gravel Road. The site is located approximately 14.26 km towards N1 North (Polokwane), via the off ramp 163 towards Pyramid/ Wallmannsthal/ R101, right on the Kloppersbos/Pyramid Road (D327) the site is located on the right. Informal roads already exist on site and no new roads will be constructed. Vehicular movement will be restricted to existing access routes to prevent crisscrossing of tracks through undisturbed areas.

- Should any other access roads to the prospecting area be required it will be established in consultation with the landowner however existing roads will be used as far as practicable.
- All intersections with main tarred roads will be clearly signposted. drivers will be enforced to keep to set speed limits. Trucks will be road-worthy condition with reflective strips.



A fund will be set aside to maintain the serviceability of the road verge where the trucks approach or depart from the main road.

VISUAL EXPOSURE:

The project is expected to have a negligible impact in this regard as prospecting activities will be done by drilling prospecting boreholes comprising and area of less than 400 square meters per site. The sites will also be rehabilitated prior to the opening of another site.

Management:

- The Closure Application will be submitted in terms of Regulation 62 of the MPRDA, 2002, and Government Notice 940 of NEMA, 1998.

- 2. I refer to:
 - 2.1. The notice of application in terms of the Mining and Petroleum Resources Development Act 28 of 2002 ("MPRDA") and the National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998 ("NEMA") dated 8 July 2020 ("the notice"); an
 - 2.2. Your email dated 17 July 2020 ("the letter").
- 3. I record that:
 - 3.1. My client, the Branron Familie Trust is the registered owner of Portion 7, of the farm Ekuphumuleni, No. 716; Registration Division JR, Province Gauteng: Measuring 109,3777 hectares in extent, held by it under Deed of Title number T164969/2003 ("the farm");
 - 3.2. My client, the Joubert Trust, is the registered owner of and Portion 1 of the Farm Ekuphumuleni, under Deed of Title number T164968/2003.
 - 3.3. My client, the Jardim Family Trust, is the registered owner of Portion 8 Ekuphumuleni, under Deed of Title number T164977/03.
 - 3.4. Johan Grobler of The Farm Portion 5 Klopperbos 128 Jr.
 - 3.5. My clients' farms are situate within the Dinokeng Nature Reserve which either has been or is in the process of being declared a National Protected area in

terms of the National Environment Management Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003.

- 4. My clients:
 - 4.1. Are "interested and affected parties" for the purposes of Chapter 5 of NEMA as defined in section 1 thereof, who intends to participate in the public information and participation procedures as contemplated in section 24(4)(v) of NEMA.
 - 4.2. Requires to be registered as Interested and Affected parties and requests a copy of the Draft Basic Assessment Report ("DBAR") referred to in the aforesaid notice forthwith.

5.

- 5.1. In the aforesaid notice, you record in the first paragraph thereof, that you, as the applicant, "intends to apply for a prospecting right on *inter alia* my clients' farm".
- 5.2. You thereafter record in the third page of the notice that:

"An application for a prospecting right in terms of section 16 of the MPRDA <u>will be submitted</u> to the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE)."

- 5.3. You then record that an application for a prospecting right has been submitted;
- 5.4. It is accordingly unclear as to what the purpose of your letter is to my clients and what you intend thereby. On the assumption that you have made application in terms of section 16 of the MPRDA, for a prospecting right, your letter serves no purpose at all, other than an extra curial invitation to engage with my clients "to amicably resolve certain issues which were recently raised". I deal with this below.

6. The first paragraph in the notice under the caption "**Public Involvement**" reads as follows:

"This document is to inform you about the proposed activity and to determine whether there are any concerns or objections from interested and affected parties (I and APs) that need to be considered."

- 7. An application in terms of section 16 of the MPRDA does not require the recordal of such an invitation. My clients' participation as an interested and affected person, arises only when the Regional Manager gives notice of the right which my clients have in terms of section 16(4) of that Act. This is because:
 - 7.1. In terms of section 16(1) of the MPRDA you are required to simultaneously make application to both the Minister of Minerals and Energy; <u>and</u>
 - 7.2. Apply for an Environmental Authorisation as defined in section 1 of NEMA, by lodging such application for Environmental Authorisation at the office of the Regional Manager in this region the land is situated.. (The term "Environmental Authorisation" in section 1 of NEMA is defined as follows:

"When used in chapter 5, means the authorisation by a competent authority of a listed activity or specified activity in terms of this Act, and includes a similar authorisation contemplated in a specific environmental management Act;")

- 7.3. Accordingly, an application for a prospecting right can only be made if the Regional Manager accepts the application and gives notice to you in writing:
 - (a) To submit relevant environmental reports required in terms of chapter 5 of NEMA, within 60 days of the date of notice; and

- (b) To consult in the prescribed manner with *inter alia* the landowner and any interested and affected party and include the result of the consultation in the relevant environmental reports.
- (c) It is not clear from your letter whether the Regional Manager has given you notice in terms of section 16(4) of the MPRDA and whether your letter constitutes an invitation to my client, to participate in your application and to give reasons why it opposes your application for a prospecting right.

This is because:
 - 8.1. The notice dated 8 July 2020 is not addressed to the Minister and the Regional Manager;
 - 8.2. The notice dated 8 July 2020 is headed at the top of the page with the words:

"BACKGROUND INFORMATION DOCUMENT"

- 8.3. Does not include the following:
 - (a) The Environmental Reports;
 - (b) The Environmental Impact Assessments;
 - (c) The Strategic Environmental Assessments;
 - (d) The Environmental Management Programs;

- (e) The Environmental Implementation Plan, contemplated by section 11 of NEMA;
- (f) The Environmental Management Plan, contemplated by section 11 of NEMA;
- (g) Documentary proof of your budget;
- (h) Documentary proof of your financial resources and your technical ability to conduct the proposed prospecting operation optimally, in accordance with the Prospecting Work Program in terms of section 17(1)(8) of the MPRDA.
- (i) Details of your estimated expenditure for the proposed prospecting operation;
- (j) Details of your estimate of the duration of the prospecting work program;
- (k) A report that such prospecting will not result in unacceptable pollution, ecological degradation or damage to the environment, as contemplated by section 17(1)(c) of the MPRDA.
- 9. As such, there are three issues which require clarification:
 - 9.1. Whether the notice of application for a prospecting right dated 8 July 2020 is an application to the Minister for a Prospecting Right in terms of section 16 of the MPRDA; and
 - 9.2. Whether you have applied for an Environmental Authorisation at the office of the Regional Manager in whose region the land is situated and if so, when;
 - 9.3. Whether your invitation to consult arises from a written notice from the Regional Manager, having accepted your application to consult with my clients, for the purpose of including the result of such consultations in the relevant environmental reports.

- 10. In the event that your invitation to consult with my clients is in terms of notification given by the Regional Manager in terms of section 16(4) then I require from you the following:
 - 10.1. The Environmental Impact Assessments;
 - 10.2. The Strategic Environmental Assessments;

 - 10.4. The Environmental Implementation Plan, contemplated by section 11 of NEMA;

 - Full details of the financial provision. Section 24P of NEMA provides for financial provision for remediation of environmental damage. Section 24P reads as follows:
 - "24P(1) An applicant for an Environmental Authorisation relating to prospecting, exploration, mining or production, must, before the Minister responsible for mineral resources issues the Environmental Authorisation, comply with the prescribed financial provision for the rehabilitation, closure and ongoing post decommissioning management of negative environmental impacts."
 - 10.7. In terms of NEMA and the MPRDA, a ministerial decision is required for the rehabilitation, as well as a lodged financial provision and closure certificate. In other words, a Ministerial decision is required for the

rehabilitation and for the lodged financial provision and closure certificate.

10.8. Documentary proof of a budget, as well as documentary proof of your financial ability in respect thereof:

- (a) Details of your access to financial resources and your technical ability to conduct the proposed prospecting operation optimally, in accordance with the Prospecting Work Program in terms of section 17(1)(8) of the MPRDA.
- (b) Full details of your estimated expenditure for the proposed prospecting operation and duration of the prospecting work program.
- (c) The report that such prospecting will not result in unacceptable pollution, ecological degradation or damage to the environment, as contemplated by section 17(1)(c) of the in MPRDA.
- 11. If no application has been made by you for a prospecting right, in terms of section 16 of the MPRDA then please advise what the purpose is of your letter dated 17 July 2020 and what you intend to achieve thereby. I am instructed that my clients will oppose your application for a prospecting right, as an interested and affected party, once it is invited to participate, consequent upon a lawful application being made by to the Minister and the Regional Manager. My clients' concerns at this juncture (which are by no means exhaustive) is the following:
 - 11.1. You intend the drill site to be approximately 200 m². You do not state on whose land such drill site will be.
 - 11.2. There is no evidence at all that there are coal deposits in the area and my client requires probative evidence as to the possible existence of coal deposits on his farm.
 - 11.3. There exists no evidence of all that you have made application for a

Water Use License in terms of section 40 of the National Water Act 36 of 1998.

- 11.4. There is no evidence at all that members of the community and other persons who may become interested and affected persons, other than my clients' farm and Portions 1 + 7 and 8 of the Farm Ekuphumulemi 716 JR have been invited to participate in your application and Johan Grobler Portion 5 Kloppersbos 128 JR
- 12. Please may I have a response to this letter as soon as possible so that the interests of my client can be protected.
- 13. If an initial meeting is to be held between yourself and my clients and should such meeting be held with a meaningful purpose, my clients agree to such meeting being held by virtual technology.






Figure 1. Plan of the land to which the application relates.

4.2 Description why the Geological formation substantiates the minerals to be prospected for:




Figure 2. Location of Witbank Coalfield

The area of interest is situated just north of the Witbank Coalfield (figure 2), which extends about 190 km west-east between the towns of Springs and Belfast and about 60 km in a north-south direction between the towns of Middelburg and Ermelo. The area of interest is mainly covered by Ecca Group rocks, shale, shaly sandstone, grit, sandstone, conglomerate, coal in places near base and top. For over a century the Witbank Coalfield has been the major coal producing area in South Africa and continues to

be so; it is estimated that since the first commercial exploitation of coal in 1870, over 50% of the coal produced in South Africa has come from the Witbank Coalfield.

Five coal seams are contained in a 70 m thick succession of sandstone with subordinate siltstone and mudstone and are distinguished numerically in ascending order from the bottom upwards.




Figure 3. Typical stratigraphic column in the Witbank Coalfield.

The distribution and attitudes of the No. 1 and 2 seams are largely determined by the pre-Karoo topography, whilst the present distribution of the No. 4 and No. 5 seams is controlled by the present day land surface; in areas the No. 5 seam is either completely eroded or is patchily distributed, while the top part of the No. 4 seam is eroded or affected by weathering in places. The No. 3 seam is generally uneconomic, usually having a thickness of less than 0.5 m. At the Glisa colliery, on the most eastern edge of the Witbank Coalfield, 5 km south west of the town of Belfast, the No. 3 seam has an average thickness of 1.5 m and is exploited. Five typical stratigraphic columns from five different areas in the Witbank Coalfield are shown on figure 3.




Figure 4. Geological map of the area concerned

The area concerned is covered by rocks of the Vryheid Formation, which are well known for their coal measures. A geological map of the area is shown in figure 4 below.

6 REGULATION 7 (1) (g): A DESCRIPTION OF THE PROSPECTING METHOD OR METHODS TO BE IMPLEMENTED

(i) DESCRIPTION OF PLANNED NON-INVASIVE ACTIVITIES:

(These activities do not disturb the land where prospecting will take place, e.g. aerial photography, desktop studies, aeromagnetic surveys, etc)

Phase 1 (months 1 to 2), phase 3 (months 6 to 9) and phase 4 (months 10 to 12)

Desktop studies form a very important preparatory step in a new coal exploration project, and as the name suggests, this task is executed mainly from an office environment. Desktop studies will be conducted by the project geologist as part of preliminary investigations into the prospecting area by looking at all relevant published literature, geological maps, mining maps and any available evidence or records of coal findings. The outcome of the desktop studies will be a geological report of the prospecting area with a particular emphasis on the prospectivity of the area. This report will also inform other subsequent prospecting steps.

Field geological studies will follow after the desktop studies, and they typically include walking over the prospecting area making general observations of the geology and topography. Geological mapping activities, if terrain is suitable, may include detailed outcrop mapping, identification of coal hosting strata, coal seam outcrop mapping and sampling of exposed coal seams where available.

The 3D geological modelling and resource estimation step will follow after favourable exploration drilling results. This geological modelling step mainly entails geological interpretation of collected logsheet data and the subsequent geological domaining. The geological model, which shows the physical continuity of the coal seams and the distribution of the coal qualities, is a critical input in coal resource estimation. The coal resource statement, which is an outcome of the resource estimation process, gives an indication of the amount of available coal resources in tonnage and associated qualities.

(ii) DESCRIPTION OF PLANNED INVASIVE ACTIVITIES:

(These activities result in land disturbances e.g. sampling, drilling, bulk sampling, etc.)

Phase 2 (months 3 to 5)

The objective of the exploration drilling is to confirm the presence of coal measures, delineate the vertical and lateral extents of the coal measures, and, through suitable tests, the quality of the coal. Percussion and diamond coring are the preferred drilling methods. The resultant boreholes will be cased and capped to make it safe for people and animals, and also allow for future access by the exploration team.

(iii) DESCRIPTION OF PRE-/FEASIBILITY STUDIES:

(Activities in this section include but are not limited to: initial geological modelling, resource determination, possible future funding models, etc.)

The pre-/feasibility studies team will comprise of a diverse team of technical expertise in the field of mineral projects, including, geologists, mining engineers, metallurgical engineers, civil engineers, mechanical engineers, environmental scientists, marketing professionals and mineral project finance professionals. The list of activities under pre-/feasibility studies includes the following:

- Geological modelling and coal resource estimation
- Coal reserve estimation
- Mine design and scheduling
- Metallurgical processing
- Market development
- Infrastructure design
- Engineering development
- Human resourcing
- Project development and operational costing

(iv) DESCRIPTION OF BULK SAMPLING ACTIVITIES:

This activity requires that an application IN TERMS OF Section 20 is specifically included in your application for a prospecting Right and cannot be proceeded with if such permission is not specifically granted. (Bulk sampling is a sampling technique ONLY – it cannot be used to conduct mining operations.)

 27, the Regional Manager must in the prescribed manner [in terms of the Regulations published]-

- (a) make known that an application for a prospecting right, mining right or mining permit has been accepted in respect of the land in question; and
- (b) call upon interested and affected persons to **submit their comments** regarding the application **within 30 days from the date of the notice**.
- (2) If a person objects to the granting of a prospecting right, mining right or mining permit, the Regional Manager must refer the objection to the Regional Mining Development and Environmental Committee to consider the objections and to advise the Minister thereon."



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
