Witberg Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd received an Environmental Authorisation (EA) for the construction of Witberg Wind Energy Facility and associated infrastructure in the Western Cape Province (DEA ref: 12/12/20/1966) on the 13th of October 2011. An appeal decision (Reference: LSA 105-439) dated the 13th of August 2013 was subsequently issued reducing the number of originally authorised wind turbines from 70 to 27 turbines, along with revised turbine specifications. However, a number of amendments to the EA and the authorised turbine specifications according to the appeal decision are now required. Firstly, the project is intended to be bid into future rounds of the Department of Energy's (DoE) Renewable Energy Independent Power Producers Procurement (REIPPP) Programme. There have been advancements to wind turbine technology since the issuing of the EA, and the turbines authorised in the EA are therefore not considered to be the most suitable in terms of production and economic considerations.

In terms of Regulation 43(2) of the EIA Regulations, 2014, as amended, this letter serves to inform you that the Revised Motivation Report is available for the Air Traffic and Navigation Services (ATNS) review and written comments, and a <u>CD</u> containing the <u>Revised</u> Motivation Report is included in this envelope.



With reference to our letter dated 14 November 2018 in which you, as a registered Interested and Affected Party (I&AP), was informed that the Witberg Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd received an Environmental Authorisation (EA) for the construction of Witberg Wind Energy Facility and associated infrastructure on the 13th of October 2011. An appeal decision (Reference: LSA 105-439) dated the 13th of August 2013 was subsequently issued reducing the number of originally authorised wind turbines from 70 to 27 turbines, along with revised turbine specifications.

A number of amendments to the EA and the authorised turbine specifications according to the appeal decision were required, and there have been advancements to wind turbine technology since the issuing of the EA, and the turbines authorised in the EA are therefore not considered to be the most suitable in terms of production and economic considerations. In this regard, Witberg Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd considered an updated turbine model and layout for the project.

Addressing the above changes were included in the Motivation Report that was made available to registered I&APs and Organs of State for a 30-day review period from Wednesday, 14 November 2018 to Friday, 14 December 2018. The Motivation Report was also made available at the Laingsburg Public Library (Van Riebeeck Street, Laingsburg) and on Savannah Environmental's website (https://www.savannahsa.com/public-documents/energy-generation/).

In response to comments received from the first round of public participation, certain changes, which are regarded as significant, were required to be made to the draft motivation report, and significant new information has been added to a revised motivation report, which changes or information was not contained in the draft motivation report consulted on during the initial public participation process. This revised motivation report has therefore been updated with the new information and will be subjected to a second round of public participation of at least 30 days as required by the legislation.



In terms of Condition 5 of the Environmental Authorisation and Chapter 5 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014, as amended, it is possible for an applicant to apply, in writing, to the competent authority for a change or deviation from the project description to be approved. Savannah Environmental has prepared a motivation report in support of this amendment application on behalf of Witberg West Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd.

The <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report is made available for a 30-day review and comment period from the <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>20 March 2019</u> to <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>23 April 2019</u>. The <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report is also available at the Laingsburg Public Library (Van Riebeeck Street, Laingsburg) and can be downloaded from Savannah Environmental's website (https://www.savannahsa.com/public-documents/energy-generation/). PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

ST explained that the primary purpose of the meeting was to address the comments that Birdlife South Africa (dated 11 January 2019) raised on the draft motivation report dated November 2018 on the amendment application for the Witberg Wind Energy Facility (WEF), Western Cape Province. ST stated that a brief historical background of the project would be provided and then each comment raised would be addressed by all attendees. This procedure was accepted by all attendees.

BACKGROUND CONTEXT TO THE AMENDMENT APPLICATION

ST explained that the project had a long history dating back from the original Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process undertaken for the project in 2010/2011. It was summarised that the project had obtained environmental authorization (EA) on 13 October 2011, and subsequently had four appeal decisions issued (dated 29 November 2012, 13 August 2013, 20 February 2016 and 7 June 2018) and three EA amendments (dated 26 November 2013, 28 September 2015 and 12 June 2017). Given this background, Birdlife was previously involved in the appeals on the project and had a good understanding of the project specifications leading to the current proposed amendment application.

ST explained that from the original project, a number of revisions of the wind turbine specifications and layouts have been proposed, of which have taken into consideration environmental sensitivities, with specific focus on Red Data avifaunal species. The avoidance of environmental sensitivities is one of the primary reasons for the amendments proposed in the current amendment application submitted to the Department of Environmental Affairs on 14 November 2018. In particular, the reorganisation of the layout is being proposed so as to be outside of the Verreaux's Eagle proposed 1.5km buffer area. MM added that the intent was to submit a project that is far more environmentally conscious than that which is currently authorized (i.e. 27 wind turbine layout).

Lastly, ST stated that the amendment application would be released into the public domain for an additional 30-day public review and comment period due to a revision of the draft motivation report being released for the project.

BIRDLIFE SA COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT MOTIVATION REPORT (DATED NOVEMBER 2018)

ST stated that there were a number of comments that were submitted which were to be addressed at the meeting individually. The comments submitted and the notes of the responses received during the meeting include the following:

1. Procedural Issues

ST stated that the comment related mainly to communications in terms of the amendment application being sent to Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs), and that some were suspected of not being received by the relevant IAPs, including Birdlife SA.

It was responded that whilst no other concerns have been reported to Savannah from other IAPs, test emails would be distributed specifically to SRP and her colleague Mr. Dale Wright to ensure that Birdlife will receive upcoming notification and communications on the revised amendment application to be distributed to all IAPs in a second round 30-day additional public review and comment period.

Post-Meeting Note – Test emails were distributed prior to release of the revised motivation report to Birdlife SA (Including SRP and Mr. Dale Wright). Confirmations were received from Mr.

Dale Wright on 19 March 2019 prior to release of the revised amendment motivation report which took place on the 20 March 2019.

2. Change in Turbine Specifications

ST stated that the main concern that was highlighted in this comment related to whether higher wind turbine will result in higher fatality rates.

SRP added that there was concern with the original assessment of band heights that were observed at vantage points (VPs) during the earlier assessments compared with current standards.

It was responded by RS that there is data from 53 studies on exactly this topic in the USA in which they found a strong and positive relationship between turbine height and fatalities, and in which higher turbines kill significantly more birds than smaller turbines. Nevertheless, the Collision-Risk Model (CRM) using flight data from the previous work indicated that at the Witberg fewer fatalities of Verreaux's Eagles are expected. In addition, RS stated that a recent site visit was undertaken in February 2019 to determine current environmental conditions and to add to the observations already undertaken. It was confirmed by RS that the area is currently experiencing a very bad drought, and that Martial Eagle was observed on the existing transmission lines near the project site. RS also stated that no Booted Eagle were observed, and that in general there was not much change in activity of the Red Data species of concern.

SRP stated that there was a technical limitation with the CRM in terms of the Blade Swept Area. It was replied by ST that the CRM study had been updated recently to include for the 25-wind turbine layout, as opposed to the 27-wind turbine layout previously assessed, and that this report would be available for review in the additional 30-day public review and comment period.

3. Extension of the validity of the Environmental Authorisation (EA)

ST stated that there were several sub-comments related to Birdlife's objection to extending the validity of the EA. These are included individually below:

a. Extension of EA – Receiving Environment

SRP stated that given that a recent site visit was undertaken, it was enquired where the CRM would be updated. ST stated that the CRM study had been updated recently to include for the 25-wind turbine layout, as opposed to the 27-wind turbine layout previously assessed, and that this report would be available for review in the additional 30-day public review and comment period. RS added that reduced activity occurred on the ridge, presumably due to drought conditions and lack of prey. RS stated that there may be a new possible Verreaux's Eagle nest off the project site approximately 3.5km in the nearby nature reserve, but that this was not confirmed from the site visit, although the activity suggested this.

SRP enquired about the condition of the site in consideration of a fire that took place some years ago (February 2016). RS replied that the fire area stretched from the south east of the project site to the north west of the project site in a V-shaped area, and that this area had recovered somewhat but was also experiencing drought so was severely negatively affected in general.

SRP added that according to Birdlife's latest findings, there is a correlation between increase in activity and fatalities for Red Data species. RS confirmed that disturbance is an issue at the project site which should be limited as far as possible with the revised 25 turbine layout.

b. Extension of EA – Advances in Understanding of Impacts

SRP stated that the passage rates are high in the area. RS accepted that, for the farm, overall the passage rate was high, but that most of the hunting was done out over the plains to the north of nest 1 and 2. Within the areas close to the nests – with the precautionary buffers around the eagle nests – these areas however have exceptionally low Passage Rates for Verreaux's Eagles (and zero for Martial Eagles) as reported in our Amendment report. RS added that there were 7 flights in 333 hours within the 3.0 -1.5 km buffer around the VE 1 Bantam nest (a very low Passage Rate of 0.021 eagles/h) for example. The current area is also in a bad condition due to the fire event in 2016 and reduced presence of prey. RS continued that passage rates and fatality rates are linked theoretically. SRP reiterated that fatalities of Red Data species are of concern and wished to state that the project is in what is considered a high-risk area regionally.

c. Extension of EA – Advances in Understanding of Technology Changes

SH stated that with operation monitoring however, should there be a fatality of Red Data species, mitigation would be implemented. RS added that shut-down on demand systems have been proposed as mitigation strategies with up-front planning.

SH enquired what should be done with regards to other measures proposed including black blade painting given that there may be issues with Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) from a visual perspective for the wind turbine blades. RS stated that another method can be employed such as red stripe or tip painting to make the blades more visible to avifauna. RS explained that this would be experimental, and if this method fails, then there is still the next mitigation option of shut-down on demand with cameras. RS admitted that there was some success and failure reported with shut-down on demand systems with cameras however. SH stated that Building Energy South Africa would have to consider the timing of the project when determining the financial possibility of these mitigation options. SRP stated that blade painting would be cheaper than deterrent systems as well. SRP added that there are also other research options that could be implemented with advances of academic research.

MM added that one of the amendments would also be to consolidate the EA and all conditions, as well as to make the EA relevant to current legislative requirements.

d. Extension of EA – Need and Desirability

SRP stated that whilst the current proposed amendment is a much better proposal from an environmental perspective when considering the original project, Birdlife SA still have concerns about the proposed amendments. SH stated that from a developer perspective, the project site has the highest wind resource than any other of BESA's projects and it was easy to connect to the national grid, and for these reasons, BESA intend to pursue the project.

e. Extension of EA – Lessons Learned

SRP stated that the EMPr for the draft motivation report dated November 2018 was drafted poorly, and that several changes were requested. ST replied that the requested changes by Birdlife SA would be integrated into the revised EMPr which would be released for an additional 30-day public comment and review period.

SRP stated that it is also important that the EMPr holds the developer accountable. MM replied that the Department of Environmental Affairs required an update to the EMPr and that these were also being taken into consideration, and would be reflected in the revised EMPr as well.

SRP stated that the objectives need to be clear. MM replied that the CRM and avifaunal updated reports were explicit on requirements, and that the relevant conditions that needed to be updated in the EA would be made more clear.

RS enquired about the powerline component. ST stated that the powerlines were updated and would be provided to RS for his final report update. SRP enquired whether the powerlines would be made bird friendly? SH replied that these would be. ST stated that bird friendly designs were included in the EMPr. In addition, SH stated that BESA would build the powerline, and then Eskom would operate and manage the power lines once operational.

SRP stated that Condition 40 of the EA needs to be put into context. SRP stated that there should be requirement for budget provisions to make sure that the developer can implement the mitigation measures for post-construction monitoring, and that consultation between the specialist and the developer is needed in this regard. In addition, SRP stated that she would like to see the word "unanticipated" removed as this is ambiguous. SRP also wanted to ensure that post-construction monitoring is transparent. MM replied that the word unanticipated could be removed in the updated EA conditions, and that the recommended mitigation measures proposed by the avifaunal specialist could be implemented.

4. General

ST enquired about the adaptive management plan proposed by RS in the avifaunal amendment report. RS responded that the plan would have to be done responsibly and timeously. SRP stated that there should be a few options to be considered in the management plan. ST responded that this could be proposed as a pre-construction requirement in the EA from the EAP. SH enquired whether it would be possible for the EAP to compile a draft adaptive management plan in the EMPr. ST responded that it could be possible but that this would be very high level since final details are not available for the project.

Post-Meeting Note – It was decided that the adaptive avifaunal monitoring and management plan would be compiled should the project receive preferred bidder status, which will detail the specific mitigation measures (including shutting down of problem turbines etc.) as it is uncertain at this stage, when the project may actually proceed. Therefore, it was deemed premature to have a detailed plan at this point.

DISCUSSION SESSION AND CLOSURE

ST stated that the revised amendment application would be released in March 2019, and that Birdlife's comments would be addressed therein for their further consideration.

ST closed the meeting at 15:00pm.

PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

ST explained that the application meeting was primarily being held as per the request of the DEA in their acknowledgement of receipt for the amendment application letter dated 14 August 2018 (Reference number: 12/12/20/1966/AM6). ST further stated that the purpose of the meeting was to present the proposed amendments, which were being applied for to the DEA within the Part 2

Amendment Application, address any potential historical concerns related to previous amendment appeals and applications and address any concerns related to the current proposed amendments requested.

PROJECT HISTORIAL BACKGROUND

ST presented the historical background to the project providing background information on the environmental authorization, amendments and appeal decisions issued by the DEA to date.

ME noted that the approval of Layout Revision 7 and turbine specifications in the appeal decision (LSA 105-439) dated 13 August 2013 was approved by the Minister of Environmental Affairs (the "Minister"). Current practice is for the Minister to refer the decision to the Strategic Infrastructure for approval. ME noted that there may be an issue as a result, as the Minister typically does not approve layouts and the Strategic Infrastructure Department has technically not approved Layout Revision 7. ME to revert back on outcome of internal discussions thereto with the Appeals Directorate in a day or so (Action Item 1)1. ME's concern was that as the Minister approved the Layout Revision 7 and turbine specifications the Strategic Infrastructure Department would not be able to, legally, approve any amendment to the layout and turbine specifications for this project, unless instructed to do so by the Minister. ME however advised that the meeting continue on the preface that, after internal consultation, the Strategic Infrastructure Department would be the decision maker on the amendment application. ME also confirmed that in the event that the Minister would be the competent authority, that she may consider all change requests as she has wide powers.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

ST presented the proposed amendments requested in the application for amendment to the environmental authorisation (EA) submitted to the Department on the 23 July 2018. These included the following:

1. Amendment 1 – Wind Turbine Specifications

ST stated that the request was to amend the approved wind turbine specifications to increase the hub height, rotor diameter and wind turbine generation capacity to increase the efficiency and economic competitiveness of the project. ST also explained that a range of hub height and rotor diameter was being applied for and not a fixed hub height and rotor diameter. ME was happy with this approach and provided some guidance on the wording of the requested amendments to the hub height and rotor diameter requesting that the range be specified as a hub height ranging between 92m and 120m and a rotor diameter ranging between 116m and 136m. ME was also supportive of this approach which would lead to less chance of a further amendment to these turbine specifications being required.

¹ Post meeting note – ME reverted via telephone and email (31 August 2018) that the course of action to follow is to withdraw the current application and resubmit to the Appeals Directorate for their consideration. Details pertaining to this correspondence are in Appendix 1.

ME stated that a concern with amending the wind turbine specifications (particularly hub heights and rotor diameter) is the lowest rotor swept limit, as this has implications for potential impacts on bats. This would need to be considered. ST confirmed that this was considered by the bat specialist.

2. Amendment 2 – Wind Farm Layout

ST stated that the request was to change the wind farm layout in terms of wind turbine placement and reduction in number of wind turbines. The applicant also optimized the layout of the construction camp, substation, linking station and associated 132kV power line.

ME enquired as to why the wind turbines were being requested to be reduced and repositioned in areas?

KDB responded stating the approved Layout Revision 7 as per the decision issued by the Minister in August 2013 did not take the avifaunal sensitivities fully into account in terms of the Verreaux's Eagle Nest buffers of 1.5km. Bird pre-construction monitoring assessments undertaken in 2015 subsequent to the Minister's decision, recommended a 1.5km buffer to be implemented. In addition, the latest BirdLife guideline on preconstruction monitoring for Verreaux's Eagles recommend a 3km buffer around all Verreaux's Eagle nests. However, the avifauna specialists confirmed that a 1.5km buffer is acceptable where no wind turbines should be placed within 1,5km of the known Verreaux's eagle nests, in line with the latest bird guidelines for avifaunal assessments for wind farms.

Bat sensitivities also did not form part of the information considered in the appeal decision dated August 2013. As a result, wind turbines were removed where required and re-positioned as appropriate to avoid the high sensitive areas and buffers. Re-positioning also considered wind turbulence factors which can impact on generation potential. Some wind turbines were therefore moved to the southern most ridge (which was part of the initial development area) and some turbines were removed on the western ridge. It was stated that as a result, the collision risk in the original avifaunal collision risk model report had been reduced from 0.86 to approx. 0.84 for the current proposed wind farm layout.

3. Amendment 3 – Change to Contact Details of the Holder of the EA

ST stated that a change to the contact details of the Holder of the EA was being requested.

4. Amendment 4 – Amendment to Minor Spelling Errors in Authorised Listed Activities

ST stated the corrections to the authorised activities Government Notice (GN) Regulation 386 Item 1(m) & Item 7 in the EA dated 13 October 2011 were required.

5. Amendment 5 – Extension of the Validity of the EA

ST stated that the current EA is valid up to 28 September 2020, however the applicant is requesting that extension of the validity for a further two (2) years is requested up to 28 September 2022 for bidding purposes and in an effort to negate the need for a further amendment to the EA to extend the validity period in future.

ME stated that this would only be the second project to request extension of validity of the EA beyond ten (10) years to which DEA generally do not allow.

KDB responded that this amendment would assist to reduce paperwork in having to apply again in the near future for extension following potentially obtaining preferred bidder status. KDB queried whether not extending the EA by the requested amount would force construction to take place sooner, which is not possible in reality as the project is at the mercy of the REIPPPP process.

ME replied that DEA prefer construction to take place as soon as EA is issued as the EA can sterilize sites for alternative developments. KdB explained that the EA does not sterilize the area for future development that could be suitable for these farms i.e. agriculture/tourism. ME further stated that the application would be considered on its merits and that the request for extension beyond the ten (10) year limit could be applied for. The amendment application would be considered as such. However, this amendment request may be targeted for potential grounds for appeal from Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) if the request is not approved by the DEA.

KdB also questioned where the 10-year limit stems from. The 2014 regulations were amended to remove reference to the '10-year limit' – see section 26 (d) for more information. It was in any case the intention under the 2014 regulations that the EA may be extended after the 10-year validity period on application. It is therefore unclear why the Department would impose such a limitation. ME confirmed this will need to be discussed internally.

ST responded that discussion would be required between the EAP and the applicant to decide on the best course of action and length of validity request for the amendment.

SH stated that internal discussions would be undertaken to inform guidance on this way forward (**Action Item 2**).

6. Amendment 6 - Amendment to wind measuring mast heights

ST stated the it was requested to amendment the wind measuring mast heights in line with the proposed hub heights amendments in order to record accurate data at the same heights to have accurate and relevant data to inform planning and operation of wind turbines.

7. Amendment 7 - Amendment to Condition 40 of the EA

ST stated that the final amendment request was to amend Condition 40 of the additional conditions added to the EA as per appeal decision dated August 2013, which instructs G7 to comply with the said condition, and not the holder of the EA, Witberg Wind Power (Pty) Ltd is the holder of the EA. This would need to be amended to refer to Witberg Wind Power (Pty) Ltd as the holder of the EA.

MM stated that this amendment request was not contained in the application submitted to the DEA and an updated application form would need to be submitted with the Draft Motivation Report for consideration.

ST responded that this would be undertaken upon submission of the Motivation Report.

WAY FORWARD AND CLOSURE

The discussion of the way forward was suggested to be dealt with in three components including the amendment process to be undertaken, specialist studies and concerns with the proposed amendments. ST opened the discussion in terms of the amendment process to be followed requesting clarification on the submission timeframes to be applied considering the ambiguity between correspondence on the original application submitted on 23 July 2018 and the receipt of incorrectly completed application for amendment letter dated 25 July 2018. The query related to whether the applicable 90-day submission timeframe in terms of Regulation 31(1)(a) of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (2014), as amended, would commence from the 23 July 2018 or the 3 August 2018?

ME confirmed that the applicable 90-day legislated timeframe will begin from 3 August 2018.

ST initiated discussion of the specialist studies by opening that the specialist's inputs obtained for the amendment application, have considered all amendment requests including amendment 7 which had not been included in the original application submitted on the 23 July 2018. ST stated that confirmation in terms of validity of data used for the specialist amendment assessments had been requested for comment by the relevant specialists. ST proceeded to provide the available findings obtained to date from each specialist to be included in the amendment application.

ME enquired whether specialists have considered the re-positioned power line and other infrastructure / building footprints?

KDB confirmed this.

MM added that information taken from the EIA in terms of footprint sizes were used to inform and motivate the re-positioning of the relevant components applied for in the amendment application.

ME reiterated that these queries were being discussed to ensure that all bases are covered in anticipation of potential appeals given the history of the project.

MM added that it was for this reason that Rob Simmons was requested to provide inputs from an avifaunal perspective, over and above the Collision Risk Modelling Report, which was undertaken by Dr Steve Percival.

ME requested whether the moderate impact significance rating was considered acceptable by the bat specialist, and whether the applicant could undertake the mitigation measures proposed?

KDB replied that it was considered acceptable, and that the additional mitigation measures (including curtailment mitigation measures) proposed by the bat specialists have already been considered as these were findings provided to the applicant in the pre-construction monitoring report dated 2015. Provision for implementation of the proposed mitigation measures have already been considered and provision has been made for this to be implemented.

ME requested whether the bat and bird pre-construction monitoring reports would be included in the motivation report?

ST confirmed this and advised that these would be appended to the Motivation Report submission.

DISCUSSION SESSION AND CLOSURE

ME stated that updated landowner consents would need to be obtained from the landowners for submission with the amendment application as required by Regulation 39 of the EIA Regulations (2014), as amended.

MM advised that this would be obtained and submitted as requested.

ME queried whether the applicant would like a consolidated EA containing all details as per the EA as well as subsequent amendments and appeal decision conditions or whether the applicant would prefer an additional decision on the EA amendment application?

ST enquired whether this would need to be requested specifically in the amendment application or the motivation report as a recommendation request?

ME responded that this could be requested in both the application and stated as a recommendation in the motivation report, in terms of Regulation 27(2) of the EIA Regulations (2014), as amended.

ME queried whether the Environmental Management Programme would be updated as part of the amendment application?

KDB responded that this could be included as requested.

MM requested that the minutes of the meeting be distributed along with action items.

ST responded that this would be distributed along with the presentation for record keeping purposes.

ME enquired whether the IAP database to be used has been updated?

MM confirmed that the IAP list was re-verified and updated accordingly and the PPP process, which would be followed in compliance with the requirements of the Regulations.

ME stated that the amendment application public participation is to be undertaken in line with Chapter 6 of the EIA Regulations (2014), as amended.

ST noted this requirement and closed the meeting at 12:30pm.

A number of amendments to the EA and the authorised turbine specifications according to the appeal decision were required, and there have been advancements to wind turbine technology since the issuing of the EA, and the turbines authorised in the EA are therefore not considered to be the most suitable in terms of production and economic considerations. In this regard, Witberg Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd considered an updated turbine model and layout for the project.

Addressing the above changes were included in the Motivation Report that was made available to registered I&APs and Organs of State for a 30-day review period from Wednesday, 14 November 2018 to Friday, 14 December 2018. The Motivation Report was also made available at the Laingsburg Public Library (Van Riebeeck Street, Laingsburg) and on Savannah Environmental's website (https://www.savannahsa.com/public-documents/energy-generation/).

In response to comments received from the first round of public participation, certain changes, which are regarded as significant, were required to be made to the draft motivation report, and significant new information has been added to a revised motivation report, which changes or information was not contained in the draft motivation report consulted on during the initial public participation process. This revised motivation report has therefore been updated with the new information and will be subjected to a second round of public participation of at least 30 days as required by the legislation.

In terms of Condition 5 of the Environmental Authorisation and Chapter 5 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014, as amended, it is possible for an applicant to apply, in writing, to the competent authority for a change or deviation from the project description to be approved. Savannah Environmental has prepared a motivation report in support of this amendment application on behalf of Witberg West Wind Farm (Pty) Ltd.

The <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report is made available for a 30-day review and comment period from the <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>20 March 2019</u> to <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>23 April 2019</u>. The <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report is also available at the Laingsburg Public Library (Van Riebeeck Street, Laingsburg) and can be downloaded from Savannah Environmental's website (https://www.savannahsa.com/public-documents/energy-generation/). As a reminder, the due date for written comment is <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>23 April 2019</u>. Comments can be made as a written submission by fax, post or email. The <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report and any relevant information / specialists' reports is available on request, should this be required.

All comments received on the <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report will be included in the <u>Revised</u> Amendment Motivation Report which will be submitted to the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) for review and decision-making.


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
