Dear Regina Isaacs

Thank you for sending me the forms relating to the sale of a Heritage Object.

My query related to the potential application for the export of a 1901 Albion motorcar. I am sure you would like to learn about its history and be aware of the reasons why it should remain here in South Africa.

This car was the first Albion to be sent to South Africa and was a special order from the factory in Scotland by a GP in Pietermaritzburg, Dr George Spicer. It was dispatched from the factory on 21 November 1901 and transported to South Africa by Stuttafords Shipping. The Cape Town agents were Spicer, Langley and Co of Long Street (obviously the Spicers were related) and the car appeared in a photo taken in Greenmarket Square a month later, on Saturday 21 December 1901. The background to the occasion was the following. In October 1901 the first motor club in the southern hemisphere, the Automobile Club of South Africa, was founded here in Cape Town, and on 21 December the club organised its first reliability run, from Greenmarket Square down the Main Road to a member's home in Kalk Bay. The twelve cars that participated in the run were about half of all the motor vehicles in the Cape Colony at the time. Although the press coverage of the event did not list the Albion as one of the participants in the run, the vehicle in the photo is clearly this car. We believe the sequence of events leading up to the photo were as follows. The minutes of the Automobile Club indicate that both Messrs Spicer and Langley joined the club at its first meeting in October 1901, and we think they must have removed the Albion from the ship on its arrival in Cape Town and, not being the owners, demonstrated it at Greenmarket Square without participating in the run to Kalk Bay. Undoubtedly the car would then have been shipped to Natal on the next coaster.

The late owner of the car, Mr Rob Blackwood-Murray, was a descendant of the original manufacturer of the Albion. He found the car many years ago in Natal and restored it to its current excellent condition. It is definitely one of the oldest Albions in existence. The Crankhandle Club of Cape Town organises an annual event for pre-1919 cars to celebrate the original run to Kalk Bay and it is incredible to have a car on the run that actually participated in the 1901 event. The club would very much like to keep the Albion here in Cape Town and one of its members has made a serious offer to purchase the car as two of the three trustees of the trust which owns the car have requested that the car be sent to England to be sold. The Crankhandle Club is strongly against this as the Albion is clearly an important heritage object in the history of transport in South Africa.

Should you receive an application to export this car, we request that this be declined.
