# APPLICATION FOR PERMIT: BURIAL GROUNDS AND GRAVES

Please note: Permit Applications expire one year after the date of receipt.

In terms of Section 36 (3) of the National Heritage Resources Act. 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999) no person may, without a permit issued by the relevant heritage resources authority:

- (a) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb the grave of a victim of conflict, or any burial ground or part thereof which contains such graves;
- (b) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb any grave or burial ground older than 60 years which is situated outside a formal cemetery administered by a local authority; or
- (c) bring onto or use at a burial ground or grave referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) any excavation equipment, or any equipment which assists in the detection or recovery of metals.

Other application forms are available for archaeological and palaeontological material and sites (302), for shipwrecks (303), for the export or sale of heritage objects including archaeological and palaeontological material, material from shipwrecks and meteorites (304), for the built environment and landscape (307) or the registration of private collections (402).

Applicants are advised that without full details no permit may be issued.

The cemetery consists of approximately +-200 ( Esstimate) graves in total (close examination during recent site visit); the permit application is, however, for the exhumation, and re-internment

#### 10. Brief description:

Siyathembana trading 293 a Division of Siyathembana Holdings (Pty) Ltd was appointed by Ekurhuleni Municipality (refer to *Appendix E*) to apply for urgent application to relocate and rebury graves which are the landfill because Simmer and Jack currently has limited airspace in which the Waste Management Services Department cannot afford to lose. In order to ensure that the EMM is not left in a situation where waste from the communities cannot be handled, the Waste Management Services Department embarked on a project for feasibility study, design and construction of the landfill site in order to create additional airspace for Simmer and Jack landfill site., (*Figure 6*). The graves (*Figures: I-4*) for which the permit is applied for, form part of a larger cemetery (of approximately 200 graves) (Figure 5).

# 14. Purpose of and reasons for application:

The application is for exhumation and reburial of graves at Simmer and Jack Landfill to make way for new cell development. Ekurhuleni Metropolitan Municipality (EMM) has proposed a new waste disposal cell where the graves currently lie. The disposal cell forms part of EMM disposal plan. In order for the Municipality to continue providing effective waste services to the community, the disposal cell needs to be developed to accommodate the increasing waste demands.

The Principal Investigator (Dr M Murimbika) will be assisted by A qualified archaeologist from Siyathembana Trading 293 (T Mlilo) will manage and supervise the whole exhumation process. The PI will also undertake and complete the reporting process thereof.

18. Please give details of consultation with communities and individuals who by tradition has an interest in the grave(s), and of the agreement reached with such communities and individuals (as required by Act 36 and the relevant Regulations Chps IX and XI) (provide documentation and details):

A detailed social consultation process was conducted in order to identify the affected families (*Appendix* C). However, the graves are in a cemetery that dates back to 1901 since Simmer and Jack Mine opened and people were buried there to 1944. There are no records on the individuals buried. Adverts and Oral History was applied to identify anyone with knowledge of the people who may have been buried there. Unfortunately, the mine was closed 1961 and all people were evacuated from the mine. Most employees then were immigrant or migrant labourers. The historic search and notification process was deemed sufficient for the relocation and reburial of graves - a mitigation measure to rescue them from further destruction from current waste management developments.
