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## Introduction

Tip Trans Holdings (Pty) Ltd. intends to establish their regional headquarters (including an operational control centre and repair facility) on a portion of Portion 33 of the farm Vaalbank 289 JS, Middelburg. The said site is located between the N4 national road and Middelburg, east of the R35 provincial road (Fontein Street) and opposite the Vaalbank Water Treatment Works.

The Minister of Environmental and Water Affairs listed in terms of Sections 24(2) and 24D of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998), a number of activities that require an environmental impact assessment (either a Basic Assessment or a full Environmental Impact Assessment) before undertaking these activities.

The proposed activity could involve the following listed activities as identified in terms of Section 24(2) and 24D of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Government Notice R544 & R546 of 18 June 2010):

GN R544-Listing Notice 1, Listed **Activity 23:** The transformation of undeveloped, vacant or derelict land to - (i) retail, commercial, residential. recreational, industrial or institutional use, inside an urban area, and where the total area to be transformed is 5 hectares or more, but less than 20 **hectares, or** (ii) residential, retail, commercial, recreational, industrial or institutional use, outside an urban area and where the total area to be transformed is bigger than 1 hectare but less than 20 except where transformation takes place for (i) linear activities; or (ii) for purposes of agriculture or afforestation, in which case Activity 16 of Notice No. R545 applies.

**GN R546-Listing Notice 3, Listed Activity 10:** The construction of facilities or infrastructure for the storage, or storage and handling of a dangerous good, where such storage occurs in containers with a combined capacity of 30 but not exceeding 80 cubic metres.

**GN R546-Listing Notice 3, Listed Activity 13:** The clearance of an area of 1 hectare or more of vegetation where **75%** or more of the vegetative cover constitutes indigenous vegetation, except where such removal of vegetation is required for: (1) the undertaking of a process or activity included in the list of waste management activities published in terms of section 19 of the National Environmental: Waste Act, 2008, in which case the activity is regarded to be excluded from this list. (2) the undertaking of a linear activity falling below the thresholds mentioned in Listing Notice 1 in terms of GN No. 544 of 2010.

In order to obtain approval (authorization) for this activity, a **Basic Assessment (BA)** in terms of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2010, must be conducted.

The environmental decision making authority is the Mpumalanga Department of Economic Development, Environment and Tourism (DEDET).

Clean Stream Environmental Services was appointed as independent environmental consultant to conduct the required basic assessment and compile the necessary documentation. Part of the process is to inform interested and affected parties (I&APs) of the proposed project and to obtain any issues of concern.

You are hereby invited to register as an I&AP and provide input with regards to the proposed activity.

An interested and affected party (I&AP) can be defined as any person, group of persons or organisation interested in or affected by a proposed activity or any organ of state that may have jurisdiction over any aspect of the activity.

- Obtain clear and accurate information about the proposed activity;
- Indicate their viewpoints, issues and concerns regarding the activity;
- Suggest alternatives or ways of mitigating negative impacts and enhancing positive impacts.

# What are the responsibilities of an interested and affected party?

- Become involved in the process as early as possible;
- Register as I&APs;
- Advise the consultant of other I&APs who should be consulted:

- Give timeous responses to correspondence;
- Be respectful and courteous towards other I&APs and the environmental consultant;
- Refrain from making subjective, unfounded or ill-informed statements;
- Recognize that the process is confined to issues that are directly relevant to the application.

### **Project Description**

#### **Proposed activity**

The applicant, Tip Trans Holdings (Pty) Ltd., intends to establish their regional headquarters (including an operational control centre and repair facility) on a portion of Portion 33 of the farm Vaalbank 289 JS, Middelburg. The said site is located between the N4 national road and Middelburg, east of the R35 provincial road (Fontein Street) and opposite the Vaalbank Water Treatment Works (see Figure 1).

The property (Portion 33) is 26.0437 ha in extent, of which approximately 14 ha will be utilized for the transport facility.

The transport facility will comprise of the following buildings/areas:

- Main office building;
- Workshop area comprising of the main building, stores/warehouse and secondary workshop;
- National operations control room and server room;
- Recreational area with a lapa;
- Yard with parking area for ± 200 trucks and trailers;
- Diesel refueling bay with 3 x 23 000 liter above ground tanks;
- Wash bay with water recycling plant and water storage tanks;

- Canteen and driver's quarters;
- Security office and private vehicle parking area and a double gated entrance/exit.

Figure 2 provides an indication of the proposed layout plan.

The development will be connected to existing municipal services (water, sewage). Bulk pipelines will be installed to connect to the nearest municipal point.


The site will be rezoned from Agriculture to Industrial 2 (i.e. light industrial).

Co-ordinates for the centre of the site are: 25°49′24.32″S 29°28′56.87″E

#### Reason for development

Tip Trans Holdings (Pty) Ltd. specialises in the supply and delivery of aggregates such as coal, ore, sand, stone, etc. and have operations across southern Africa. Imperial Logistics has a 60% shareholding in the company.

In order to coordinate their activities, Tip Trans Holdings (Pty) Ltd. needs to establish a regional headquarters and operational control centre in Mpumalanga. The proposed development will be the 'face' of Tip Trans in both industry and in Imperial.
