1. PURPOSE OF BID

Crysbol Pty Ltd is appointed by Resurrec Investments Pty Ltd to undertake a Prospecting Right application in North West Province. This Background Information Document (BID) has been prepared as part of the notification and consultation process required in terms of the Section 27 (5) of the Mineral and Petroleum Resource Development Act (Act 28 of 2002) (MPRDA), as amended by Section 23 (5) of the Amendment Act. It describes the following;

- Information about the site and the proposal being considered
- An overview of the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE) application
- Suggestions on how you can participate on the process

2. APPOINTED EAP

Crysbol (Pty) Ltd as an independent Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) was appointed by Resurrec Investments Pty Ltd to conduct Basic Assessment process for the Prospecting Right application in terms of section 27 (5) of MPRDA (Act 28 of 2002), as amended by Section 23 (5) of the Amendment Act for the Copper, Pyrophyllite and Rare Earth.

3. PROJECT LOCATION

The proposed project is located on the Portion RE, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14 and 15 of Kareekuil 348 IO farms, located within Ngaka Modiri Molema district Municipality in North West Province.

4. **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The proposed Prospecting Right application is for Copper, Pyrophyllite and Rare Earth. Currently there are no commercial or any activities on the property under application.

During establishment, operation and decommissioning of the prospecting activities, the following tasks are anticipated to be undertaken:

a. Desktop Study

It is more of a literature review and research on all the completed work on the area. It also includes retrieving results from the companies that has already worked on the area.

b. Field mapping

This involves the geologist walking the area and making observations which are then recorded on a map.

c. Geophysical Survey

The gravity method measures the gravitational attraction exerted by the earth at a measurement stations on the surface. The strength of the gravitational field is directly proportional to the mass and therefore, the density of subsurface materials. Anomalies in the earth's gravitational field result from lateral and depth variations in the density of subsurface materials.

d. Preliminary Drilling and Assaying

It consists of reconnaissance drilling. The proposed drilling program consists of 10 holes.

e. Detailed drilling and assaying

It consists of detailed diamond core drilling within the determined target areas, to delineate the ore body accurately, and to determine depth to bedrock and internal stratigraphic composition of the ore body. A proposed drilling programme of boreholes will be used to further define the ore body. The core drilling is generally done in this target. The different rock sample intersecting the deposit will be sent for assay at one of the accredited laboratories.

f. Diamond core drilling

Drilling is done in phases, as outlined elsewhere, over anomalous target areas, using reconnaissance lines or a grid of 100m or 400m holes will be approximately 150m deep depending on the local depth. The samples will be sent to the laboratory for assay.

5. ENVIRO-LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

An application for a Prospecting Right in terms of Section 27 (5) of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (Act No 28 of 2002) was submitted to the Department of Mineral Resources & Energy (NW Regional Office). The proposed project triggers the following listed activities in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act 107 of 1998) and the Environmental Impact amended Assessment Regulations as (December 2014) and therefore requires Environmental Authorisation following a Basic Process. Assessment The authorising/ Competent authority for this Prospecting Right Application is the Department of Mineral Resources.

The environmental assessment will culminate in the compilation of a Basic Assessment Report and Environmental Management Programme which will be submitted to the Department of Mineral Resources & Energy (DMRE), the regulatory authority responsible for issuing environmental authorisation for this Prospecting Right Application.




Figure 1: Reg 2.2 Map
