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PURPOSE OF THE BACKGROUND INFORMATION DOCUMENT

The purpose of this document is to introduce and describe the proposed construction of the warehousing, sales, industrial and truck facilities. This document provides:

- an overview of Basic Assessment (BA) Process and allows potential stakeholders to register as Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) regarding the development.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Commaro Investment cc represented by Mr Moosa Suleman proposes to construct a facility of approximately 19 hectares on Portion 220 of the farm Wagondrift No 798. The proposed development will include the following:

- warehousing for the purpose of commercial and light industrial activities;
- offices for businesses;
- truck facilities (these may include storage, maintenance and sale of these vehicles);
- parking areas for vehicles;
- above ground fuel storage facility (less than 80m³);
- overnight truck resting areas with sleeping facilities for truck drivers,
- associated infrastructure for service provision (i.e. water. sewer, stormwater, electricity and waste); and
- access roads.







Figure 1: Google image showing the location of the proposed site

ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION PROCESS

The proposed project requires environmental authorisation in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (No. 107 of 1998), which will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2010 (Government Notice No. R.543). Listed activities under Government Notice R.544 will be triggered by the proposed development and therefore a Basic Assessment (BA) needs to be performed. The EIA decision-making authority is the Department of Agriculture and Environmental Affairs, Kwa Zulu Natal (DAEA).

Figure 2 below shows the Basic Assessment process. Currently, we are at the public participation and draft Basic Assessment Report (BAR) review which provides Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) with the opportunity to comment on the draft basic assessment report.
